About the survey

The Survey of Londoners 2021-22 was a research study commissioned by the Mayor of London to help better understand the lives of Londoners.

This pen portrait is intended to provide a snapshot of a particular group of Londoners, as captured at the time of the Survey of Londoners 2021-22.

It was an online and paper self-completion survey of adults aged 16 and over in London.

The survey, which received responses from 8,630 Londoners, aimed to assess the impact of COVID-19 and associated restrictions on key social outcomes for Londoners, not available from other data sources.

Fieldwork began on the 24th November 2021 and extended into February 2022 to accommodate late responses.

The Survey of Londoners 2021-22 took place just before the full effects of the cost-of-living crisis began to set in. The situations of Londoners will have changed since this report has been published.

Base sizes based on 140 Black disabled Londoners, unless otherwise stated.

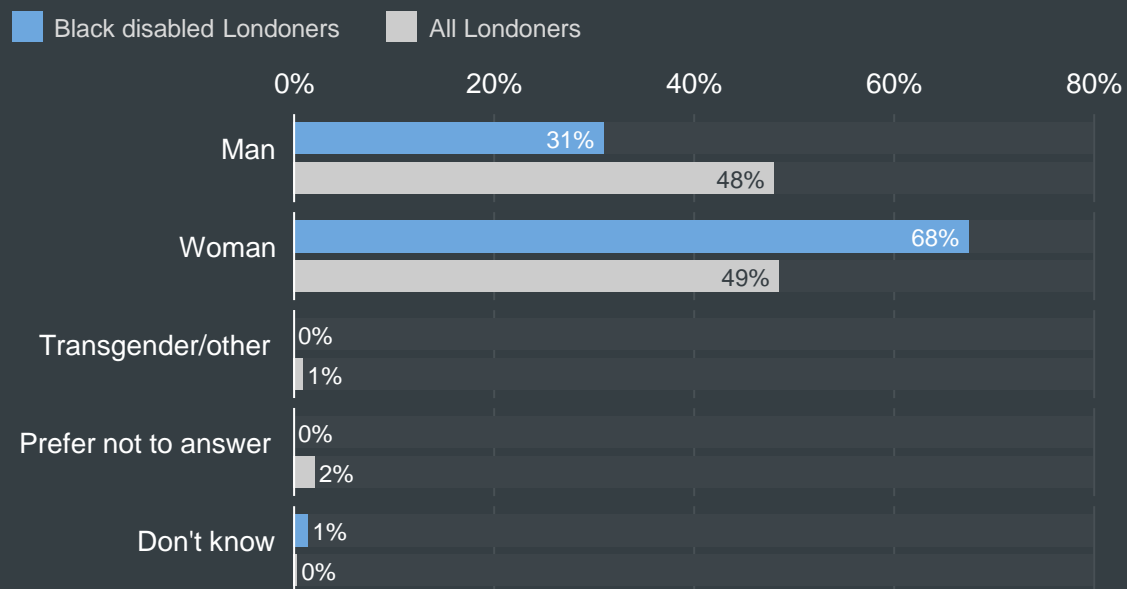

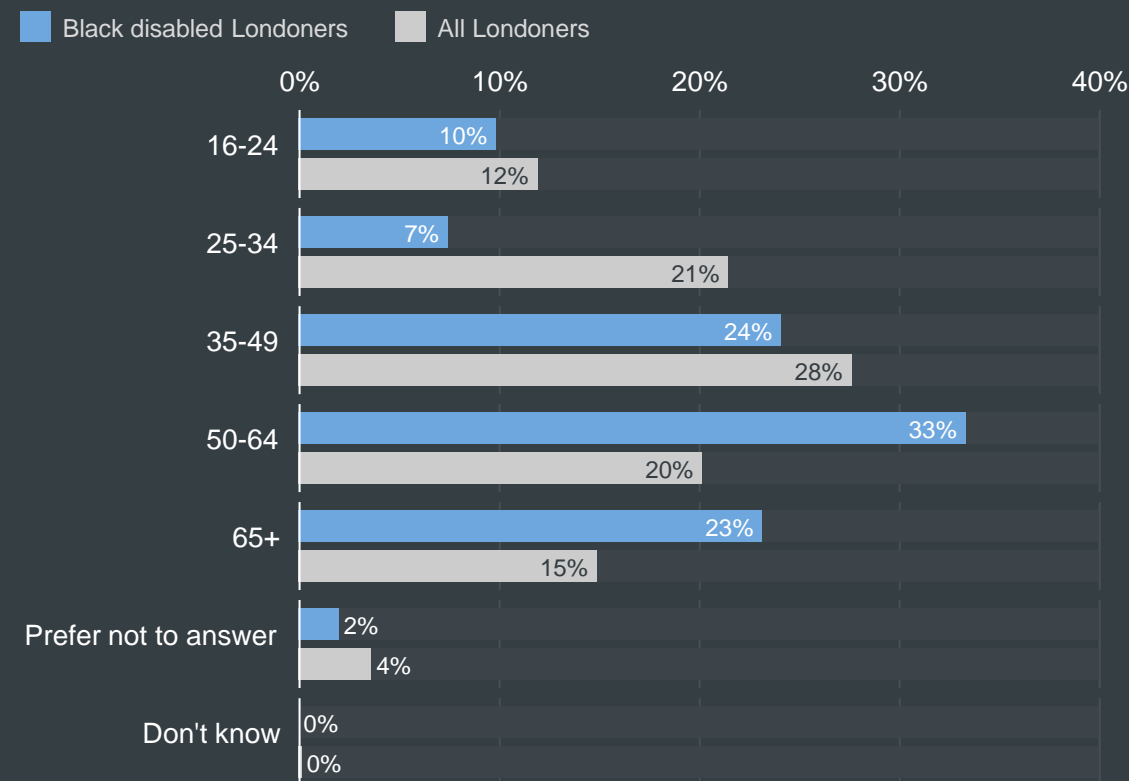
Gender

% of Londoners by age



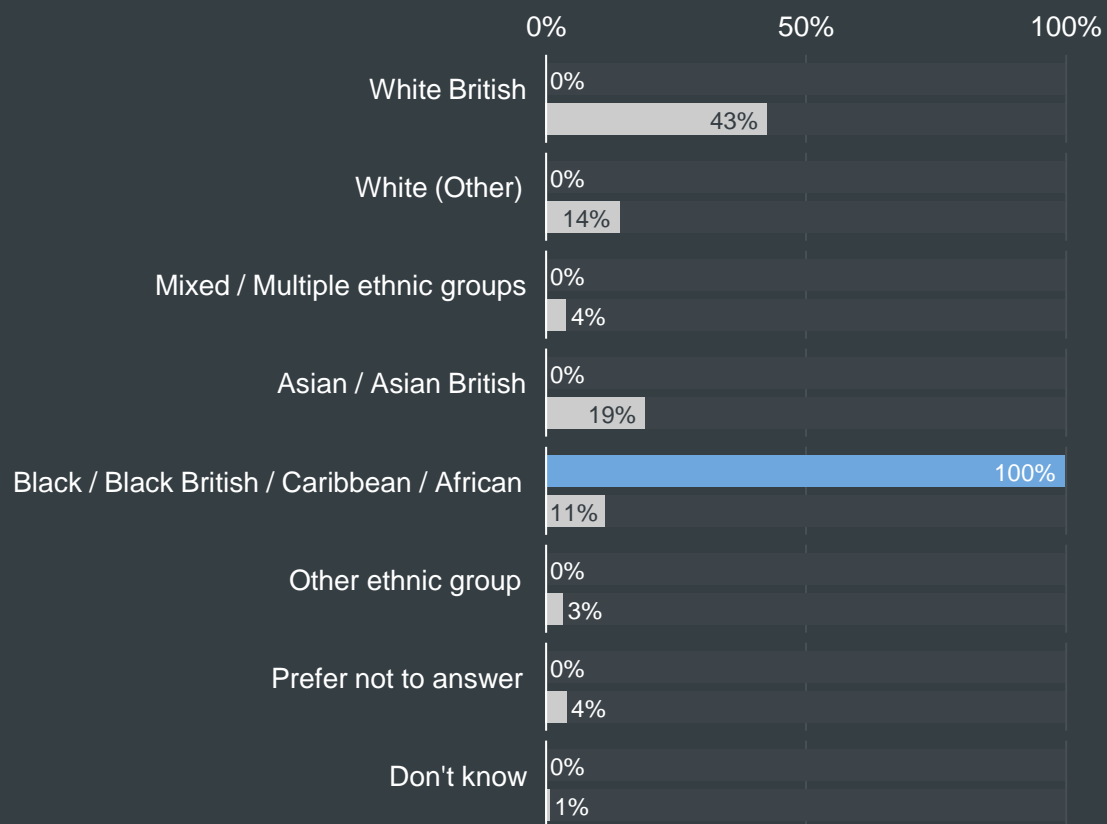

% of Londoners by ethnicity

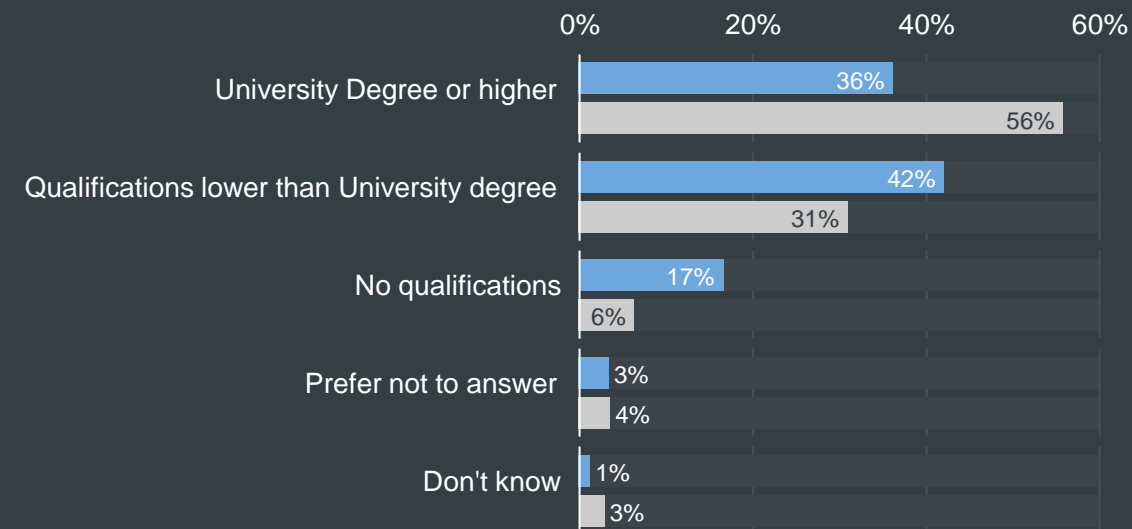

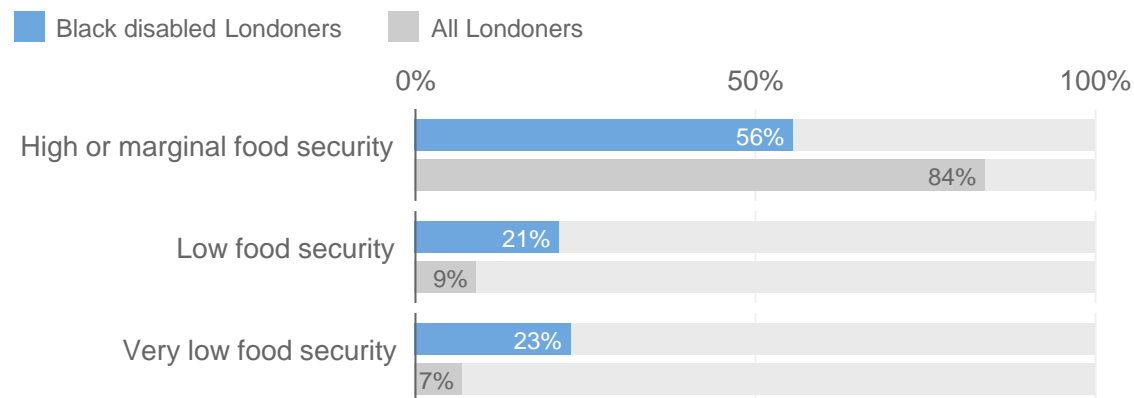

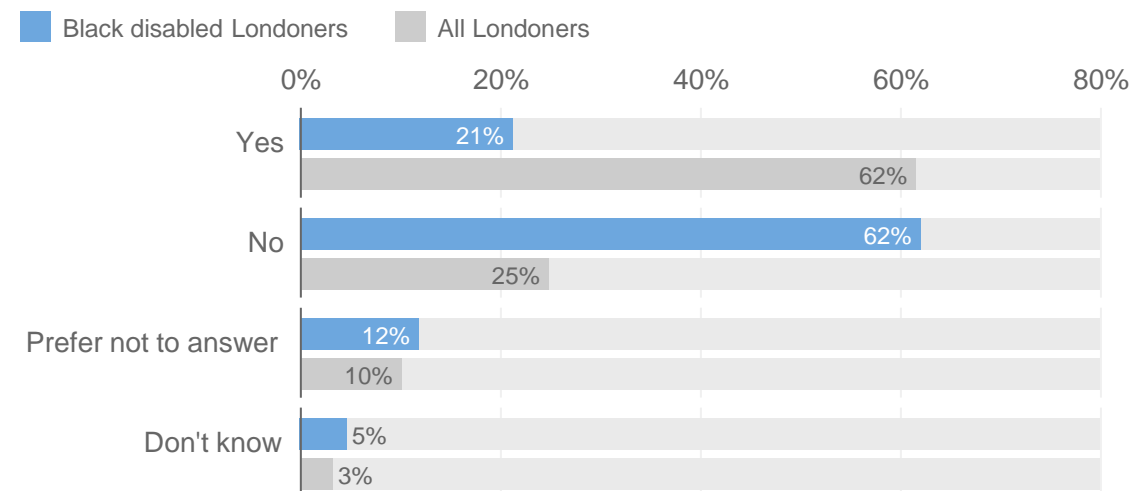
Adults' food security

% of Londoners with financial savings of at least £1,500

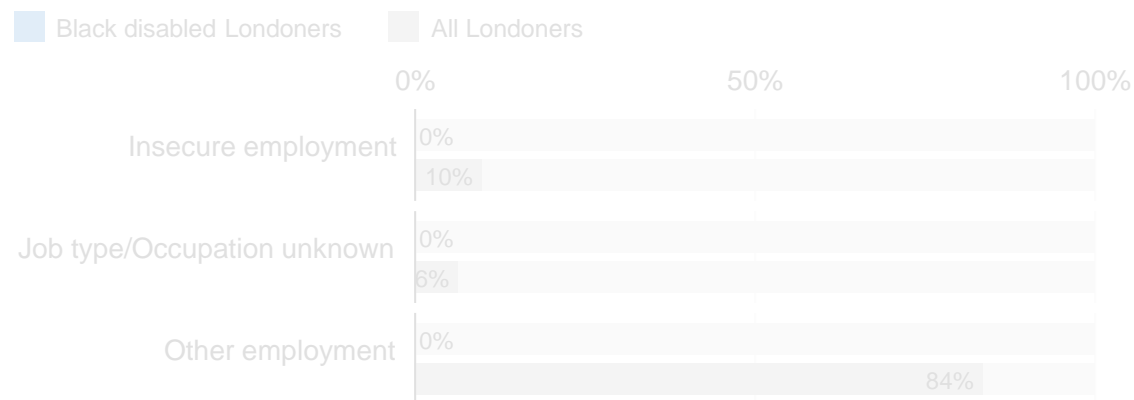

Earning the LLW or more in their current main job

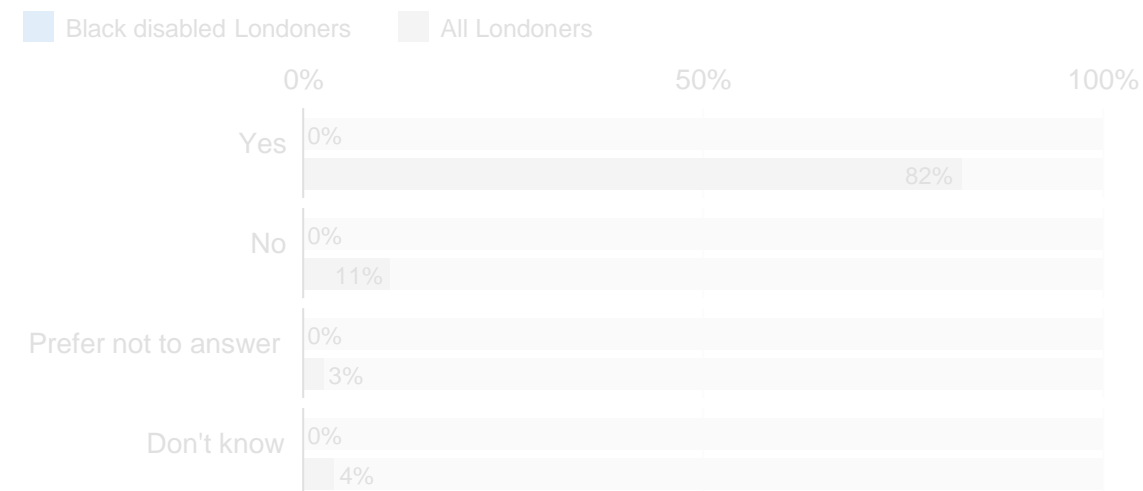

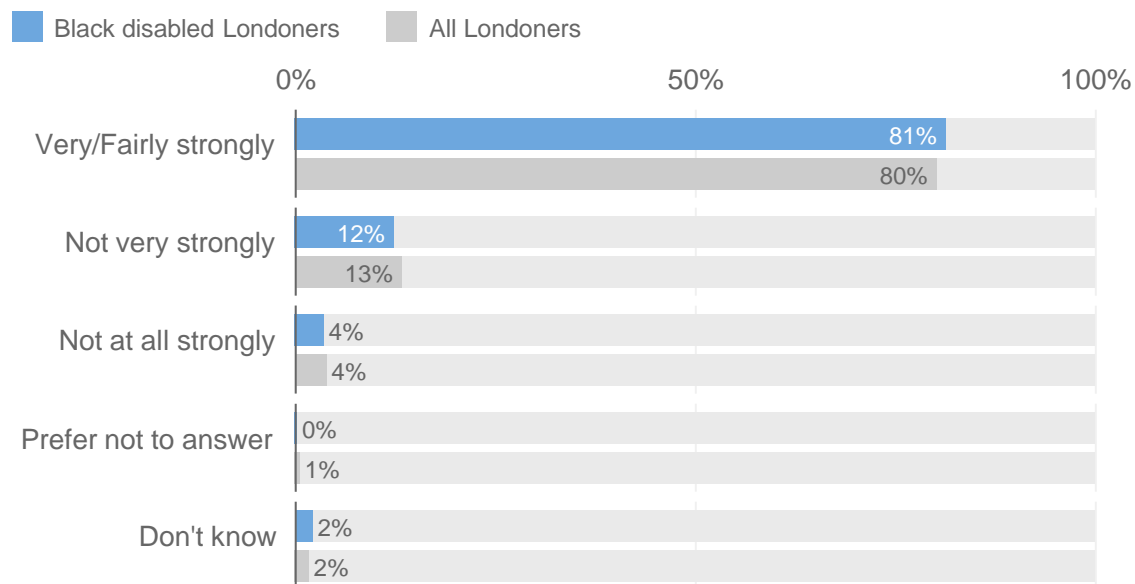

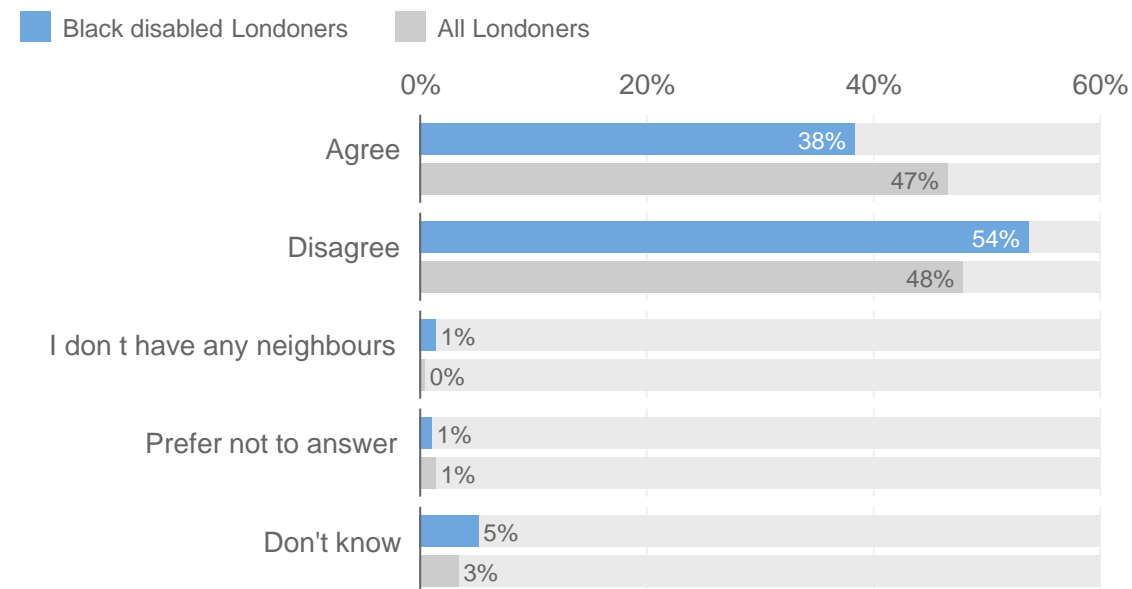
Belonging

% who agreed that, generally, they borrow things and exchange favours with their neighbours

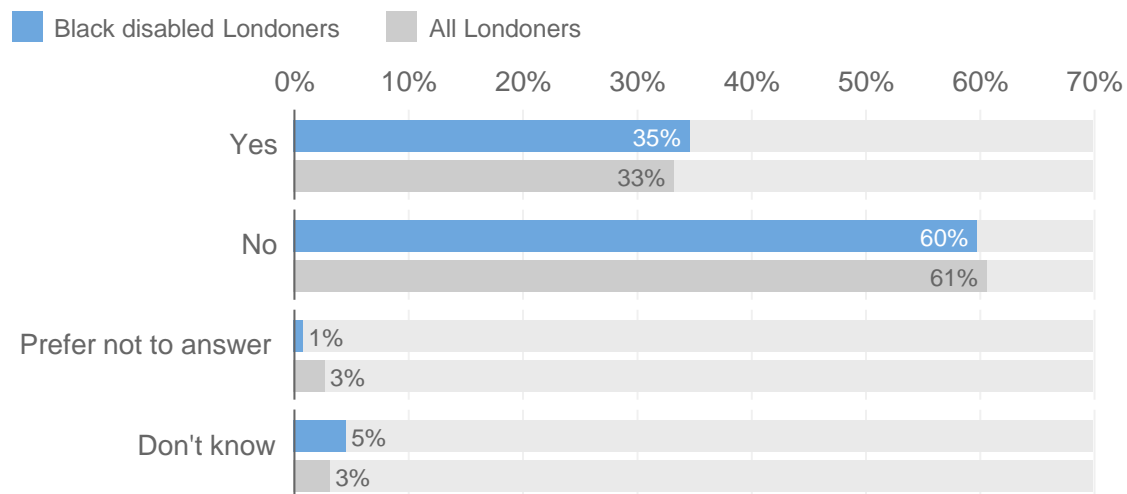

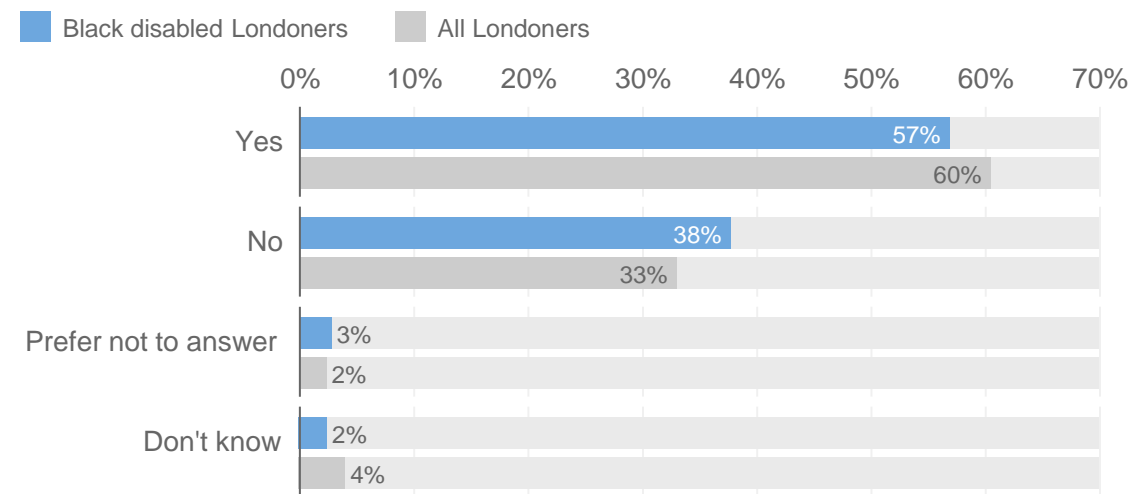
Formal volunteering

% of Londoners who had given unpaid help as an individual to other people, but not to relatives, in the last 12 months

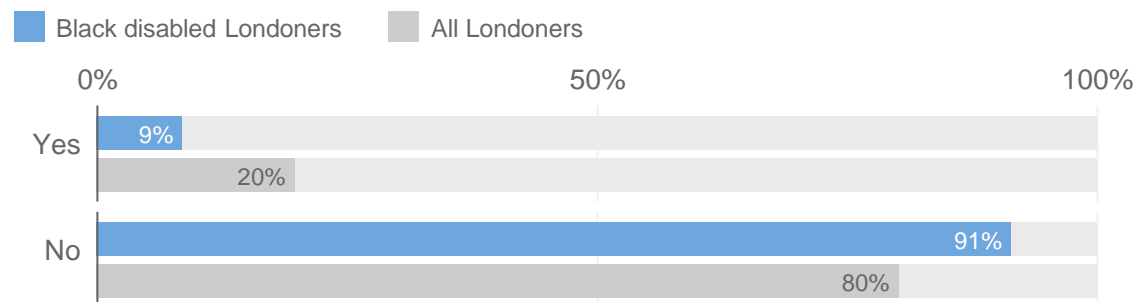

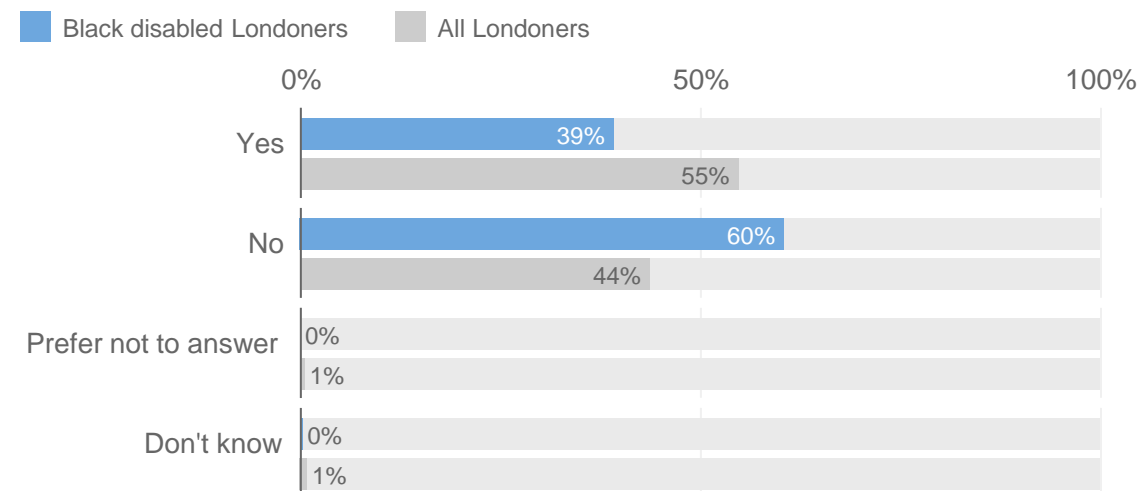
Sport

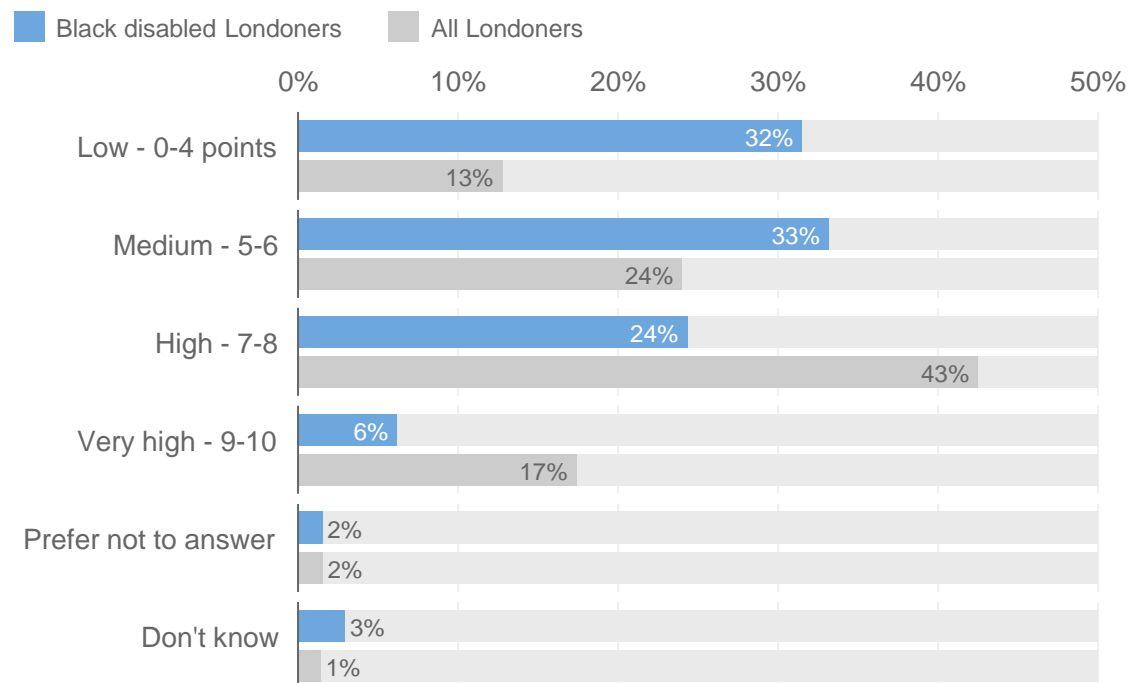

How satisfied or dissatisfied were Londoners with the amount of leisure time they have?

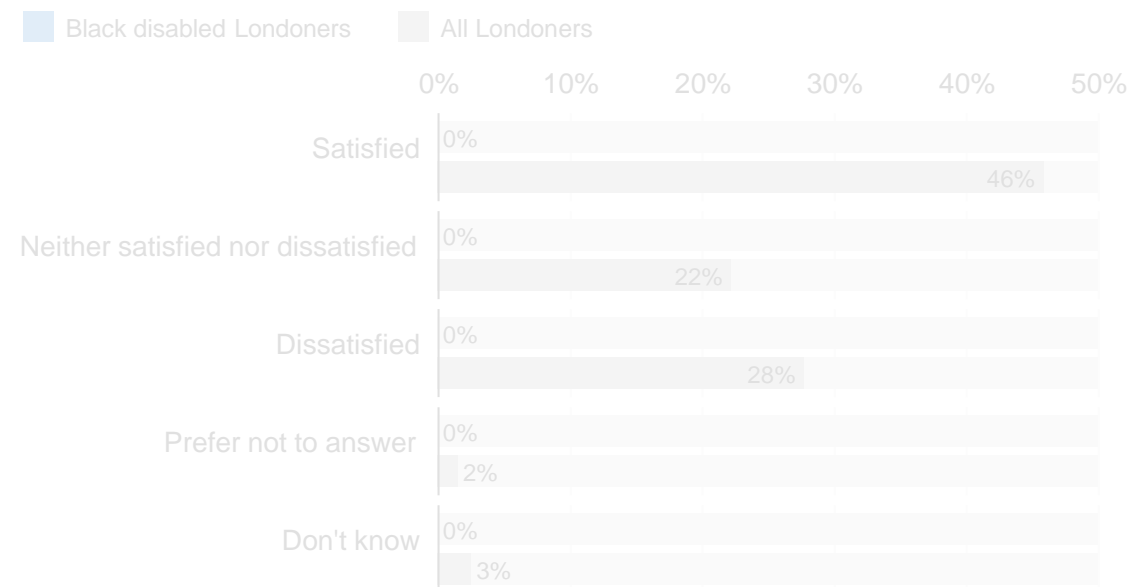


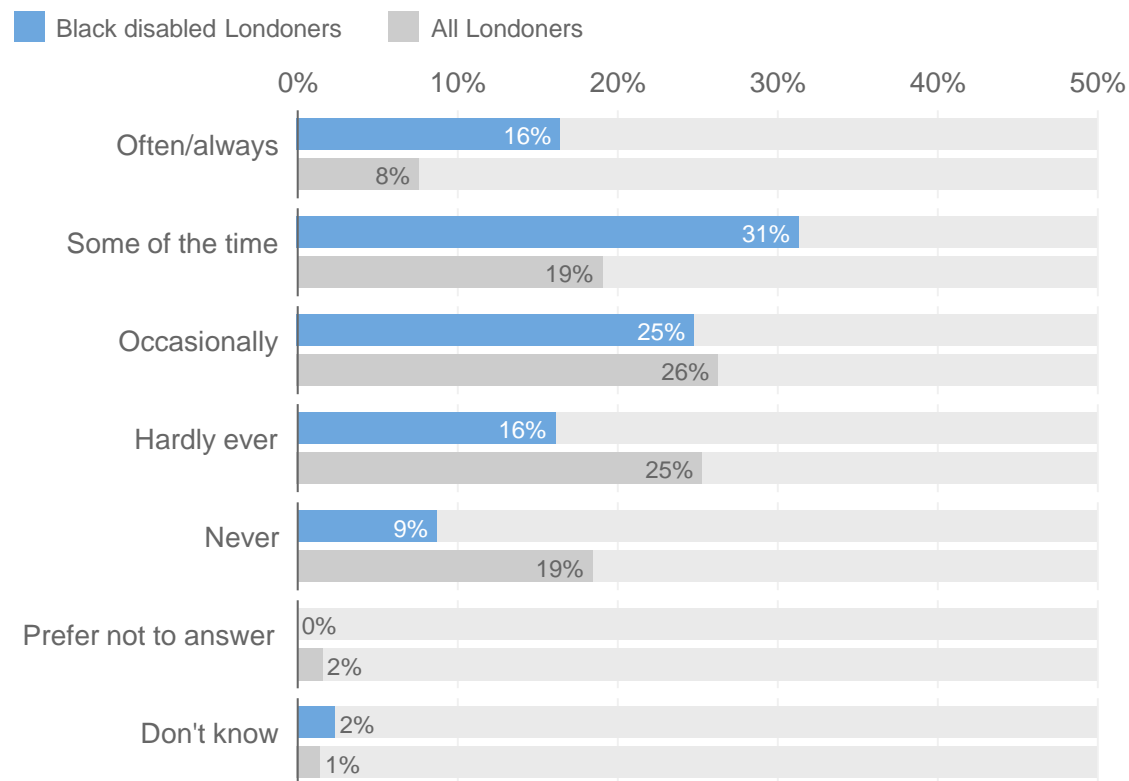

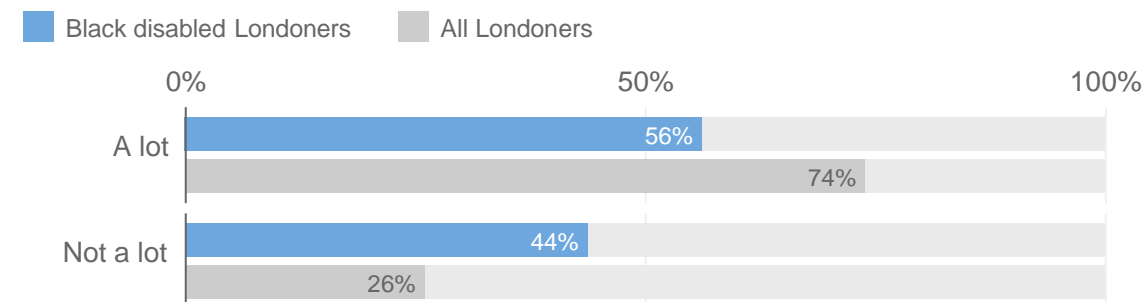
Loneliness

How much could Londoners rely on other people if they had a serious problem?

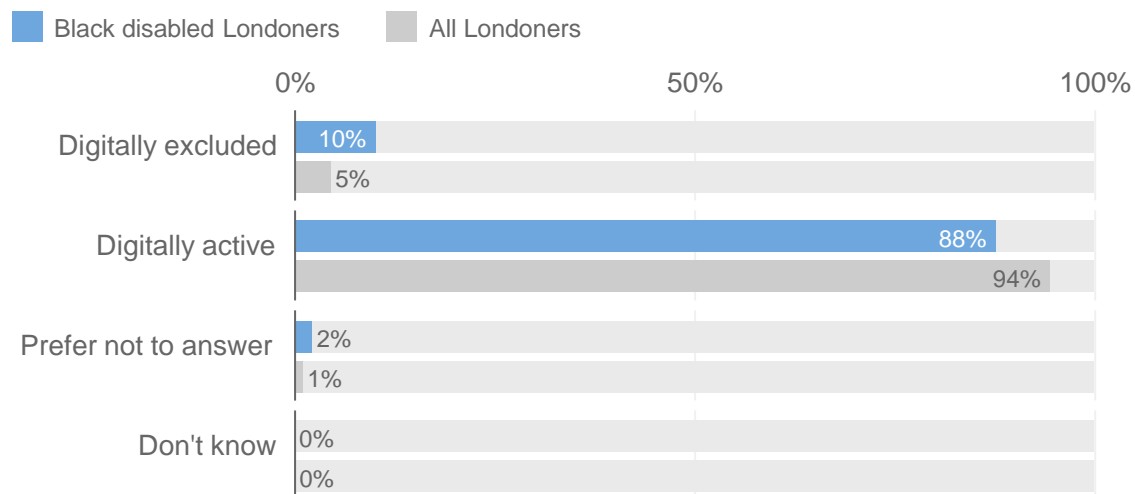

% of Londoners who had been treated unfairly in the past 12 months

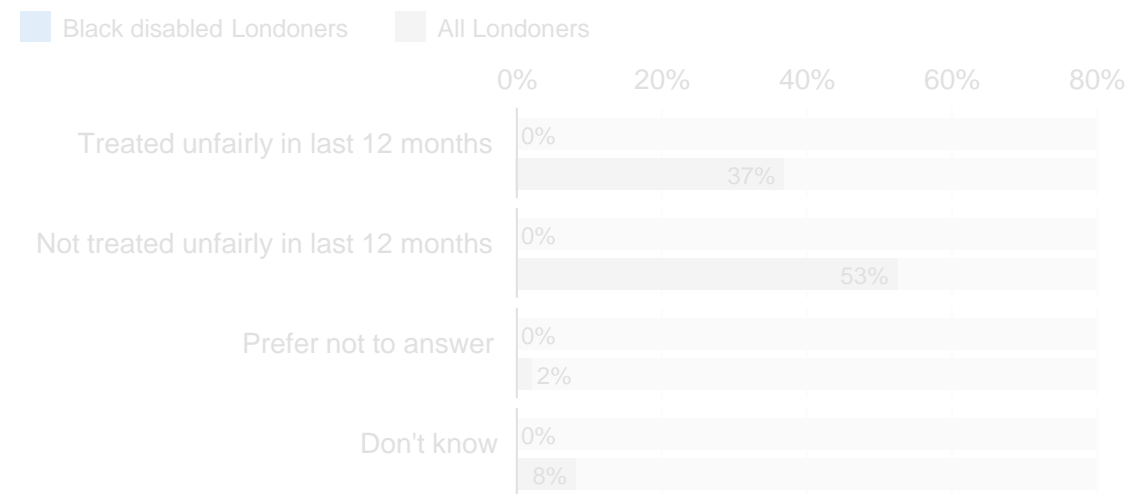
