

Health Impact Assessment: Statement of Conformity

- 1.1. The October 2022 Amendments include a change to the overall tenure mix and resultant very minor change to the number of units together with an increase in the provision of open/amenity and play space. There are no other design changes of relevance to the Health Impact Assessment. These changes would result in the following:
- 1.2. A negligible change in the overall population yield from 3,285 to 3,284 (-1 persons) and a minor increase in the overall child yield (+25). Subsequently there are no material changes to the assessment of social and community infrastructure including demand on early years, primary and secondary education, GP services and community facilities, children's play space and open space. Therefore, the impact assessment presented in the submitted HIA remains robust. A Statement of Conformity for Chapter 6 Socio-economics has been submitted which confirms this.
- 1.3. The minor decrease in the number of housing units do not result in any material changes to the assessment of impact on health presented in the submitted HIA.
- 1.4. Hatch have reviewed the impact of the October 2022 Amendments. In summary, the amendments do not result in any material changes of relevance to the HIA and the assessment of impact and the conclusions and recommendations presented in the submitted HIA therefore remain valid.
