
Paving and Furniture Typology Plots F and H









Etched concrete (colour: Grey)

The paving has been selected to be a warm grey as a contrast to the building in order to articulate the difference between the buildings and the ground plane. It also provides a neutral background to the highlights of colour in the furniture.

Perfecta neutral paving flags provide continuity along Aberfeldy Street footways and the Tegula paving similarly in the vehicle carriageway.

Granite, in-situ concrete and red bespoke pre-cast paving units provide distinctive highlights in special locations.

The furniture is largely bespoke to these plots of Phase A. The exception is standard elements that are used throughout the masterplan, mainly bicycle racks and bins.

Roof terraces paving would be Dutch clay pavers with raised planters in Corten steel.

Planting Typology Plots F and H

The planting typologies are specific to each space and species reflect the different objectives and growing conditions:

Town Square - colourful shrubs, perennials and bulbs are proposed to reinforce the colour approach proposed with in the public realm which maximise the opportunities of sunlight in this space.

Aberfeldy Street - a woodland understory typology with species of shrubs, perennials and bulbs selected reflecting the shade under the plane trees. Colour palette limited to predominantly whites and greens.

Kirkmichael Road - the play street gets relatively good sunlight so will support a wide range of plants. The aim is to include a higher proportion of sensory planting to engage children.

Roof terraces - will have a more intimate scale of planting and more complex planting combinations because of greater control over maintenance. The planting will embrace seasonality, texture, and colour of a private communal garden space.

To reinforce the concept of colour in the public realm, this illustrative planting mix indicates the type of plants that would be used in the raised beds of Town Square. It would take advantage of the good sunlight to maximise the intensity and duration of flowers utilising shrubs, herbaceous perennials, and bulbs with an exotic emphasis.





Planting is partially located under the canopy of Plane trees and therefore plants need to be selected that will thrive in these conditions of partial shade. This illustrative planting mix references woodland edge inspiration with structure, green texture and a generally white/ pale green flower colour palette that contrasts with Town Square.




