





Planting Typology - Existing and Proposed Trees

The plan opposite illustrates the selected tree species proposed and existing trees retained within Braithwaite Park and surrounding roads. All existing trees in and around the park are to be retained.

New trees are proposed around the boundaries of the park to fill in the gaps between the existing trees, to better screen the park from the roads. Several new trees are proposed within the park to offer more shade and seasonal interest to the space. Fruit/ nut trees (and therefore promoting the picking and eating of fruit and nuts) have not been selected as proposed tree species considering previous use/contamination of land.
