

## ONS Mid-year Population Estimates: 2007

### Key features:

- The resident population of Greater London as at 30<sup>th</sup> June 2007 was estimated to be **7.56 million**, an increase of 44.6 thousand from the previous year.
- Whereas last year London had the highest growth rate of all regions, this year the growth rate is 0.6 per cent and ranks 6<sup>th</sup> out of 10 regions in England and Wales.
- This population growth was driven mainly by natural change (excess of births over deaths) which added 73 thousand to London's population.
- The largest percentage borough increases in London were:
  - City of London (2.9 per cent)
  - Camden (2.0 per cent)
  - Southwark (1.9 per cent)
- Although some boroughs were estimated population declines:
  - Brent (-0.5 per cent)
  - Haringey (-0.4 per cent)
  - Ealing (-0.4 per cent)
  - Enfield (-0.1 per cent)
- Mid-year births (2006-2007) were estimated to be over 123 thousand, an increase of 5.4 thousand compared with the previous year.
- Mid-year deaths (2006-2007) were estimated to be over 50 thousand, a decrease of 1.5 thousand compared with the previous year.
- Total net migration over the same one-year period was minus 28.4 thousand. Nearly a three fold increase on last years figure. However this disguises the considerable population churn that takes place in London.

## **Background**

On 21st August 2008 the Office for National Statistics (ONS) issued mid-2007 population estimates for all local authorities in England and Wales. This update analyses the resident population estimates for Greater London and the London boroughs, both separately as well as within the national context.

Mid-year estimates related to the usually resident population. These estimates include long-term international migrants (people expressing an intention to stay for at least a year). They do not include short-term migrants, people who come to or leave the UK for less than a year.

Estimates are based on the mid-2001 estimates and are available for constituent administrative areas (Government Office Regions, counties, local authority district and strategic health authority areas in England).

These estimates will not be used as the basis for the next ONS subnational population projections. The ONS 2008-based sub national population projections (due for release in 2010) will be based on next years Mid-2008 population estimates and will be used by CLG in the allocation process for next local authority three year financial settlement.

## London Results

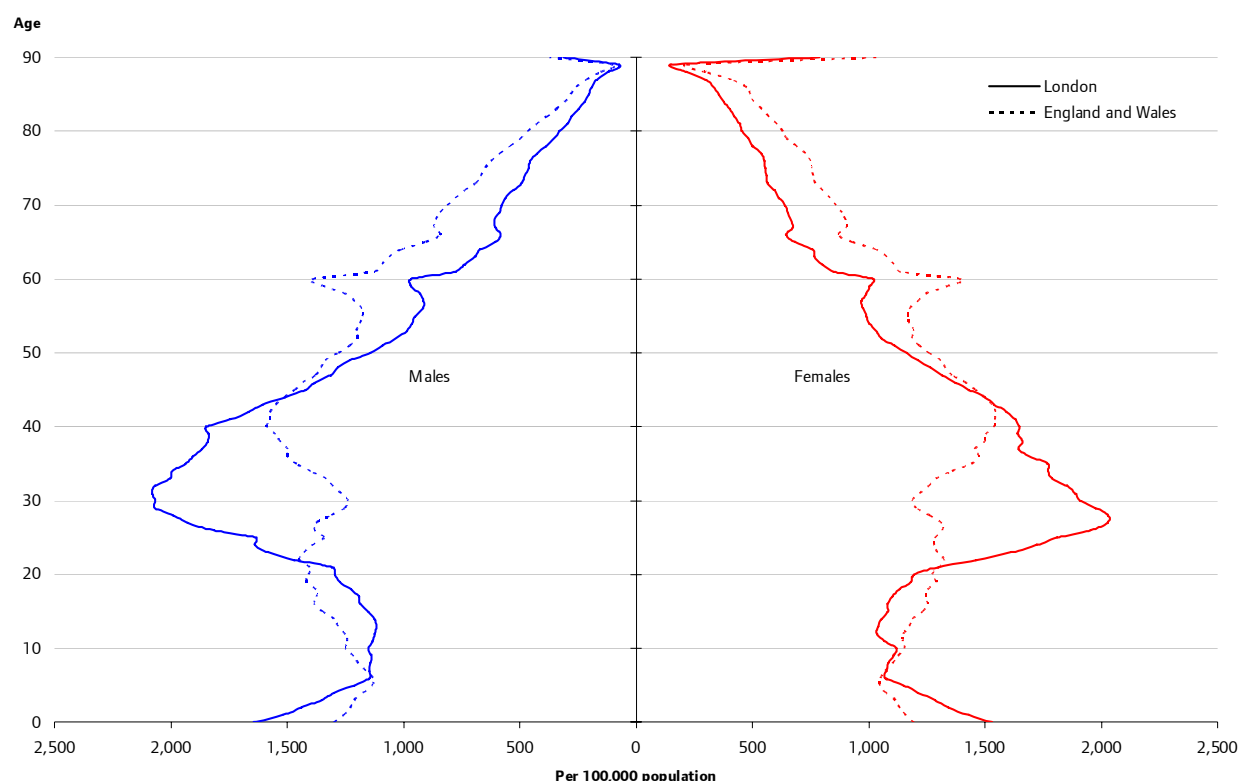
ONS mid-2007 population estimates for London give a total resident population of 7.56 million, an increase of 44.5 thousand on the previous year. This represents an annual growth rate of 0.59 per cent, around 25 per cent lower than the growth rate for the previous year.

London's population structure has not changed drastically from previous estimates. Over 19 per cent of the population is composed of young people aged 0 to 15. Over 66 per cent of the population is of working age (16 to retirement age) compared with 62 per cent for England and Wales. Those over state retirement age comprise 13.8 per cent of London's population compared with 19.2 per cent of the national population.

Chart 1: Population pyramid, Mid-2007 population estimates



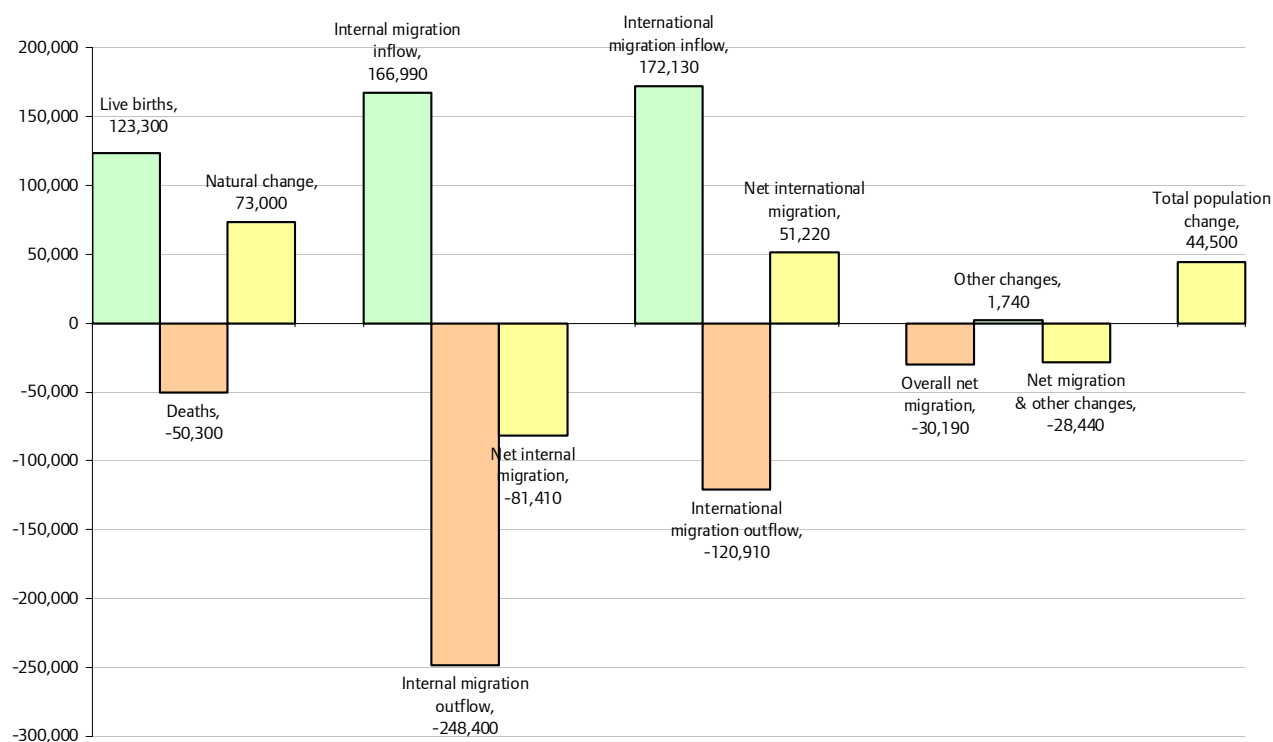
The population increase of 44.5 thousand is composed of a number of key components such as births, deaths and migrations (both internal and international, inflow and outflow).

Estimated births for 2007 were 123.3 thousand, an increase of 5 thousand (4.6 per cent) compared with the previous year. This increase has been as a result of increasing fertility rates over recent years and an increase in the number of women in the population of reproductive age.

Estimated deaths over the same period declined by nearly 3 per cent to 50.3 thousand. As a result natural change (the excess of births over deaths) for 2007 was 73 thousand, an increase of nearly 7 thousand compared with the previous year.

However total net migration for the year is estimated to be minus 28.4 thousand compared with minus 9.8 thousand for the previous year. This represents nearly a three-fold increase in population outflow from the capital between 2006 and 2007. However when looking more closely at migration components it is apparent that this considerable larger outflow disguises sizeable internal and international moves.

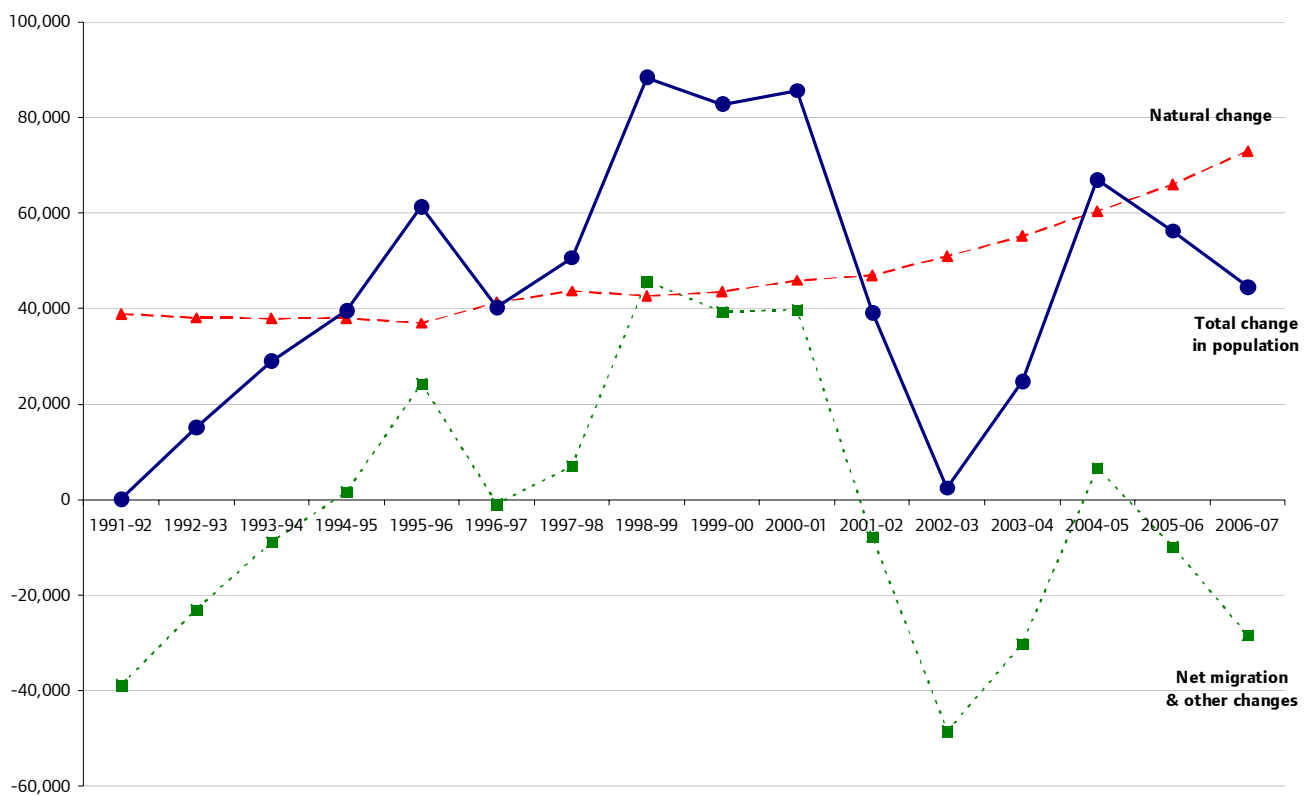
Chart 2: Components of population change, 2006 and 2007.



For instance migrant flows out of the capital to the rest of the UK (internal migration outflow) were estimated at 248.4 thousand, over 81 thousand higher than migrant inflows from the rest of the UK, thus giving a net internal migration figure of minus 81.4 thousand. These figures do not differ substantially from the previous year when net internal migration was estimated at minus 80.5 thousand.

However net international migration (from the rest of the world) for the year 2006-2007 stands at 51.2 thousand. International inflows were estimated at 172.1 thousand, over 51 thousand higher than international outflows (120.9 thousand). However in the previous year international migration outflow stood at 100.5 thousand, over 20 thousand less than this year. International migration inflow (from the rest of the world) in the previous year was 170.4 thousand and hence broadly similar to this year's estimate.

Chart 3: Population change, natural change and net migration, 1991 to 2007

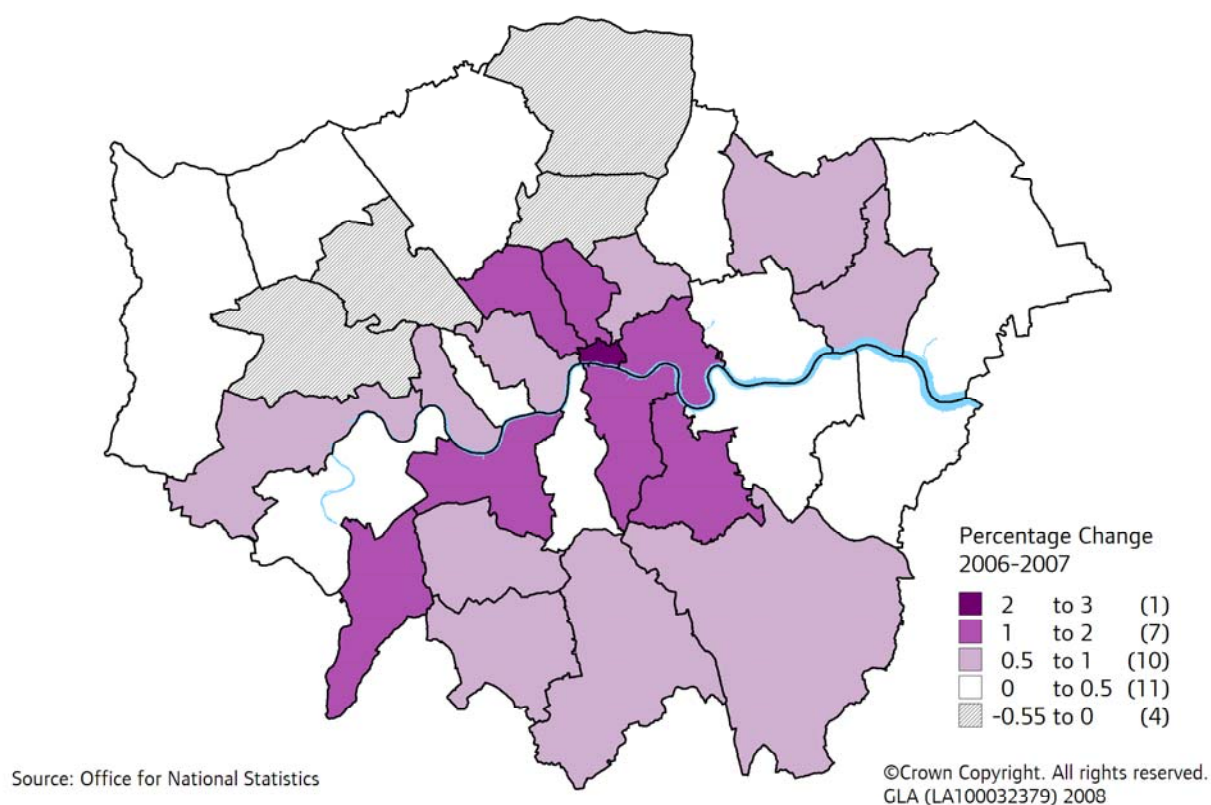


To conclude, in spite of increasing natural change, the significant increase in the international migration outflow estimate has had a negative impact on London's population increase in the last year.

## Borough results

The largest percentage increases amongst London boroughs were in the City of London, Camden and Southwark, where estimated population for 2007 were 1.9 per cent or more higher than the estimates in 2006. Four London boroughs, Brent, Haringey, Ealing and Enfield, were estimated a smaller population in 2007 than in 2006.

Two London boroughs, Camden and Southwark, accounted for nearly 22 per cent of London's total population growth between 2006 and 2007. Map 2 shows the distribution of London's population increase (44.5 thousand) across the local authorities.

Since 2001 three London boroughs, Camden, Kensington & Chelsea and Westminster have been estimated to have considerably high population change. The population of Westminster has been estimated to increase by over 15 per cent since 2001. The equivalent figure for Camden is 14.5 per cent and similarly for Southwark, 10.1 per cent. Table 4 shows these results for all London boroughs.

Map 2: Distribution of London's population increase (44.5 thousand) across the local authorities.

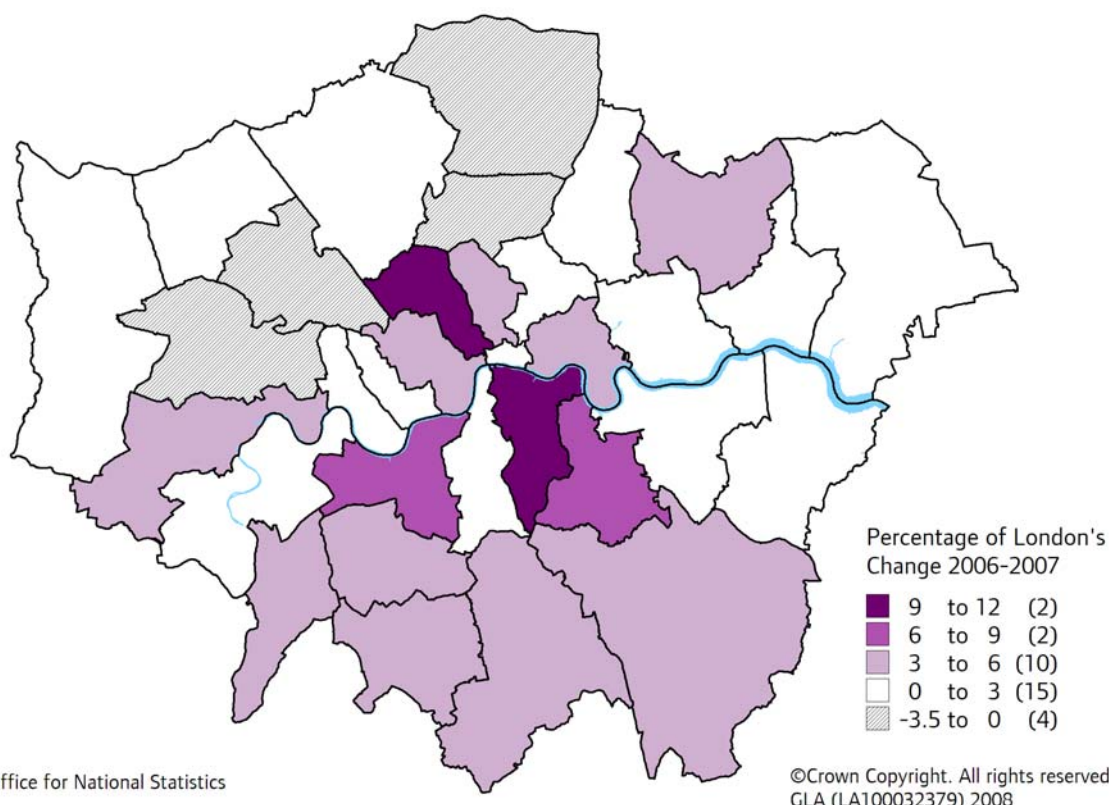
