

GLA Ethnic Group Population Projections extension to 2031 (R2007 PLP Low)


Background

GLA borough-level population projections by ethnic group have to date been produced for projection years 2001 to 2026. The model has now been extended to project to 2031, in line with the GLA borough and ward demographic projections. This *Update* summarises key features of the 2007 Round PLP Low ethnic projections relating to the additional projection years, and supplements *DMAG Briefing 2008-03 GLA 2007 Round Ethnic Group Projections* that describes projection results up to 2026.

Greater London Results *White and BAME Populations*

The PLP Low projection for London is for the total population to rise at a slightly steeper rate over the last five projection years (2026 to 2031) than in prior years (Chart 1), increasing by 245,700. The White population is projected to increase by 104,700 between 2026 and 2031, following a period of an essentially flat trend between 2006 and 2026. The BAME population is projected to increase by 141,100 between 2026 and 2031, continuing the rising trend throughout the projection period. For classification of BAME - Black, Asian and Minority Ethnic - groups from GLA aggregated Ethnic Groups and ONS 2001 Census Ethnic Categories see Annex Table 1.

Looking over the period 2006 to 2031 the total London population is projected to increase by 1,049,500 (14%). Over this period the BAME population is projected to increase by 949,700 (39%),

and the White population by 99,900 (2%). Hence the BAME groups are projected to account for 90% of the increase in the London population over the 25 years from 2006. This is a slightly lower proportion than reported for the 20-year period 2006-2026 in Briefing 2008-03, where the BAME groups accounted for all the increase in the projected population, and is due to the projected increase in the White population from 2026 to 2031. Projected ethnic group populations and changes over the period 2006 to 2031 are summarised in Annex Table 2.

There is wide variation in the extent to which the BAME groups are projected to increase. The Black Caribbean ethnic group is projected to show the smallest increase, only 15% between 2006 and 2031. In comparison the residual Other ethnic group is projected to increase by 74% over the same period, the largest proportional increase of all the ethnic groups. Equivalent increases for the Chinese, Pakistani and Bangladeshi ethnic groups are 54%, 47% and 47% respectively. The largest share of the growth between 2006 and 2031 is projected to occur in the residual Other ethnic group. This group is projected to increase by over 188 thousand people and account for 18% of the total increase. The Black African group forms 17% of the total increase, the second largest share, and the Indian group 15% of the total increase.

White and BAME Population Proportions

The variation of White and BAME population proportions over the projection period is shown in Chart 2. The ongoing decrease of the White proportion and increase of the BAME proportion continue from 2026 to 2031, but the trends are flattening out by 2031. Therefore London is not projected to have a BAME majority population in the lifetime of these projections (up to 2031). Furthermore, the asymptotic nature of both White and BAME curves suggests that a BAME majority will not occur in the medium term beyond 2031.




Chart 2: Proportions of White and BAME Populations, Greater London 2001 to 2031

Projected ethnic group proportions of the population and changes over the period 2006 to 2031 are summarised in Annex Table 3. This Table shows how each ethnic group changes in terms of its population as a proportion of the total population of London. By 2031, 39.7% of Londoners are projected to be from an ethnic group other than White, an increase from 32.5% in 2006 and 28.9% in 2001. Conversely 67.5% of Londoners in 2006 were from the White ethnic group. Between 2006 and 2031 this proportion is projected to decline by over 7 percentage points to 60.3%. The White group is the only ethnic group that is projected to decline with regards to its proportion of the total population. All other ethnic groups are projected to increase in proportional size with the largest increases in the residual Other group (1.8 percentage points), the Black African group (1.3 percentage points) and the Indian group (1.0 percentage points). Chart 3 shows proportional changes for individual BAME groups, and indicates that the generally increasing trends up to 2026 are projected to continue up to 2031, tending to flatten out by 2031 in line with the overall BAME trend shown in Chart 2.




Chart 3: Proportions of Individual BAME Populations, Greater London 2001 to 2031


Borough Results

White and BAME Population Proportions: Ethnic Majority analysis

In *DMAG Briefing 2008-03* it was reported that by 2026 eight London boroughs will have BAME populations that make up over 50% of the borough total population. The extended ethnic projections indicate that there will be no additional boroughs in which the BAME population becomes a majority by 2031. This updated situation is shown in Chart 4. The horizontal axis plots the year in which the borough population is projected to reach 50 per cent. The vertical axis plots what that proportion will be in 2031. Newham and Brent already had a BAME majority in the Census year 2001. Harrow is projected to have reached a BAME majority in 2007. Redbridge, Tower Hamlets, Ealing, Hounslow and Croydon are projected to reach a BAME majority in 2012, 2020, 2021, 2021 and 2025 respectively. In Newham, Brent, Harrow and Redbridge the BAME majority is projected to continue increasing, reaching around 60% or over by 2031, and exceeding 75% in the case of Newham.

Projected borough populations in 2031 for each ethnic group and BAME proportions are tabulated in Annex Table 4. By 2031, Lewisham, Barking & Dagenham and Waltham Forest are projected to reach BAME proportions of 45–50%, Greenwich and Hackney to reach BAME proportions of 40–45%, and Southwark, Barnet and Hillingdon to reach BAME proportions approaching 40%. The trends of BAME proportions for all individual boroughs are projected to be flattening out by 2031, in a similar manner to the trend for Greater London in Chart 2. Therefore no additional boroughs to the eight indicated in Chart 4 are expected to reach a BAME majority in the immediate period following 2031, on the basis of the assumptions used in the PLP Low projections.

Economically Active Population

London's population in the economically active ages (16 to the current retirement age, 60 for women and 65 for men) is projected to increase by 583,700 people between 2006 and 2031. The BAME population accounts for 80.4% of this increase. All ethnic groups are projected to increase with regards to the size of their economically active ages. These increases range from 55.8% in the residual Other ethnic group to 3.3% for the White ethnic group.

Chart 5: Ethnic distribution of the increase in the size of the Economically Active population, Greater London 2006-2031




Chart 5 shows the percentage distribution of the London increase by ethnic group. The main difference compared to the results reported in *DMAG Briefing 2008-03* for 2006 to 2026 is that a larger relative increase is projected to occur for the White group than BAME groups over the last five years 2026 to 2031, in line with the rising trend in the White total population between 2026-2031 shown in Chart 1. Therefore over the period 2026 to 2031 the White group is projected to account

for the greatest proportion, 19.6 per cent (114,200 people), of the total increase in the economically active ages. Among individual BAME groups the largest proportions are projected to be accounted for by the Black African group (16.1%), the Other group (15.7%) and the Indian group (12.7%). The Black Caribbean group is projected to account for the smallest proportion, 2.2%, of the total increase in the economically active ages.

In 2006 68.7% of London's economically active aged population is projected to have been from the White ethnic group and conversely 31.3% from BAME groups. By 2031, the White group will comprise 63.5% of the total economically active population in London and BAME groups will comprise 36.5%. This reflects only a marginal change over the last five projection years, 2026 to 2031, and is in line with the flattening out of the all-age White and BAME populations seen in Chart 2.

GLA 2008 Round Projections

The extended model will be used in December to produce the next round of GLA ethnic group projections. These are expected to be published early in 2009.
