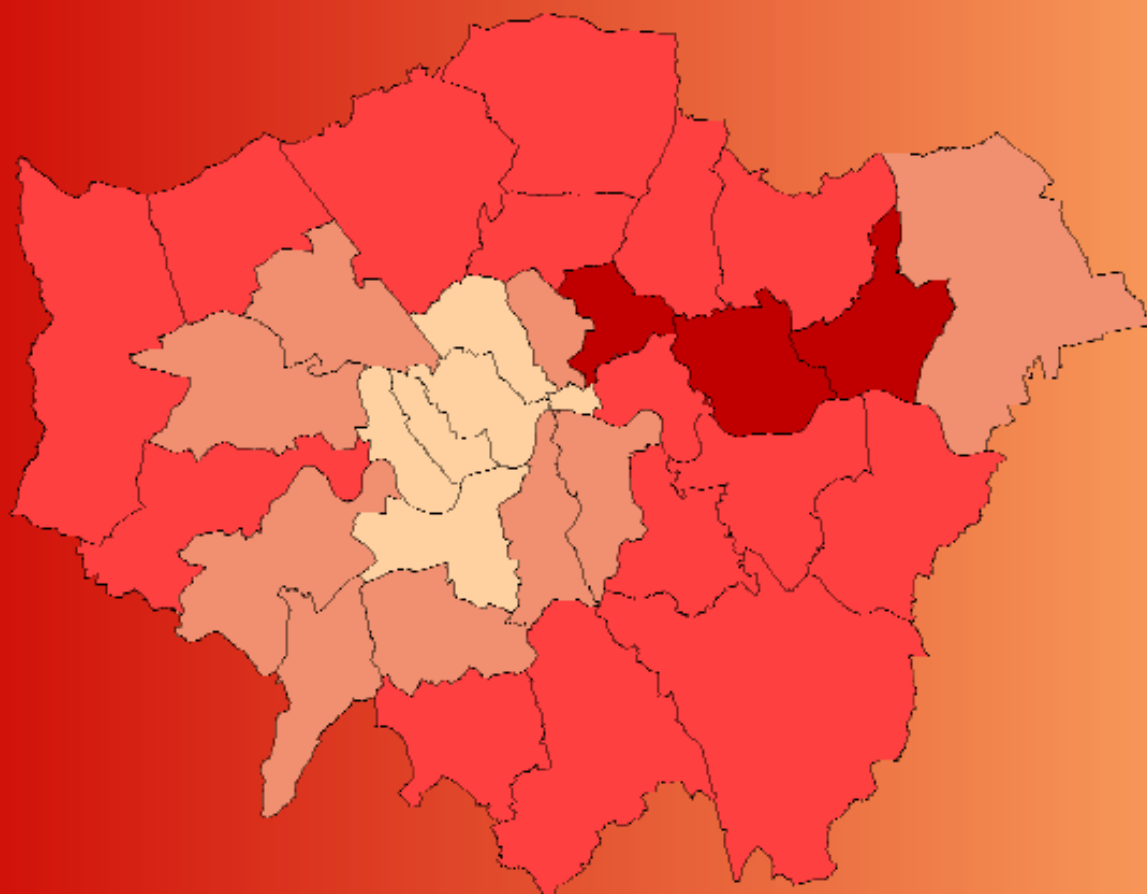

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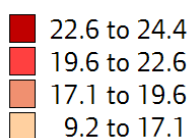

Borough and Sub-Regional Demographic Profiles 2006

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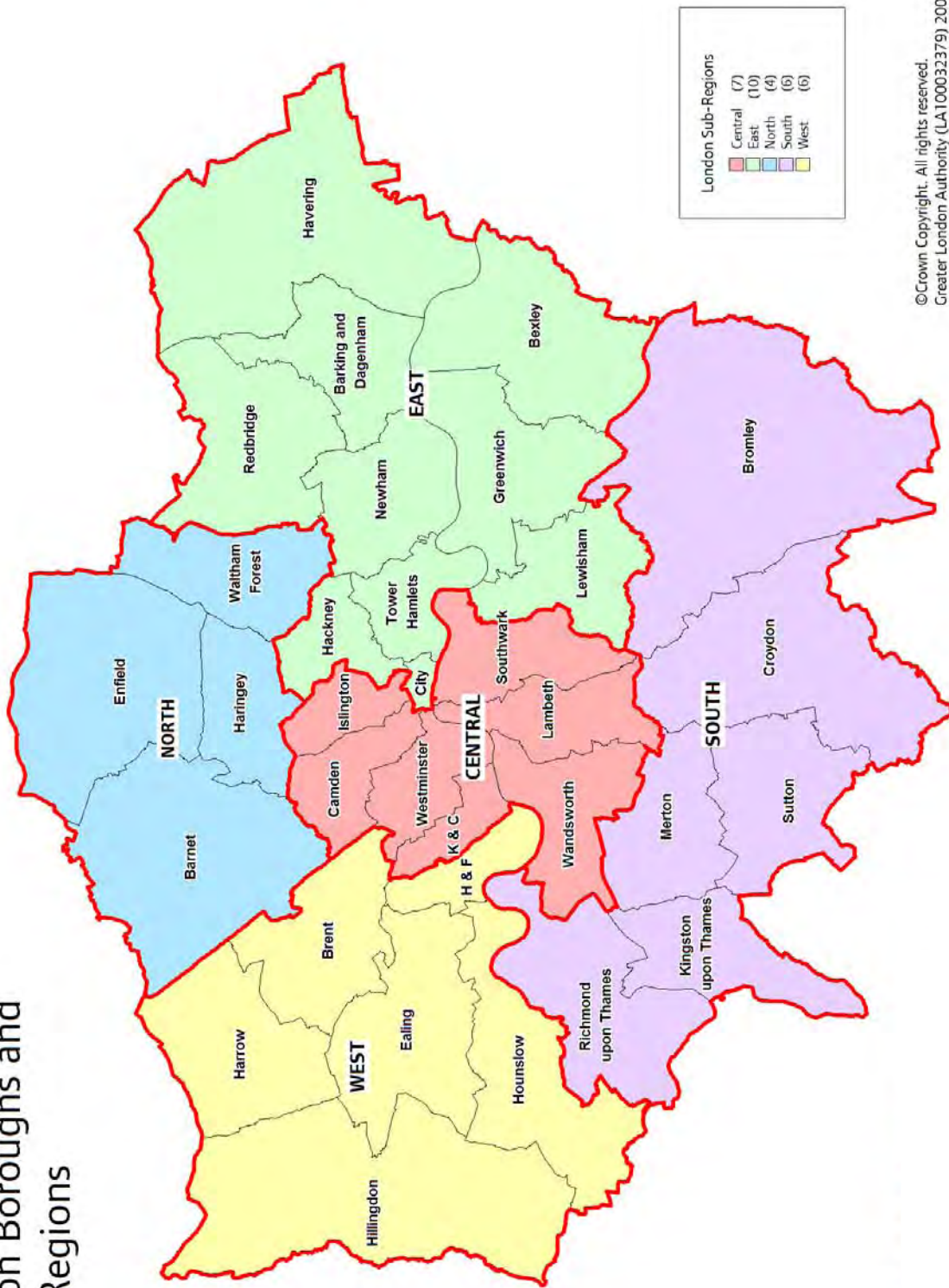
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London Boroughs and Sub-Regions

Introduction

This report provides a summary of demographic and related data for each local authority in Greater London, the four borough groups and for the five *London Plan* Sub-Regional Development Framework areas. The profiles are designed to provide an overview of the population in each area by combining a range of data on the population, the electorate, households, education and the labour force. All data, except where otherwise stated, relate to people who live in the area, ie they are residence-based.

Each borough, borough group and sub-region is compared to equivalent statistics for Greater London, and additional data for Greater London is provided on separate pages. The map on the previous page shows the London boroughs and the Sub-Regional boundaries. The borough groups and SRDFs are as follows:

Central Boroughs

- Camden, City, Kensington and Chelsea, Westminster

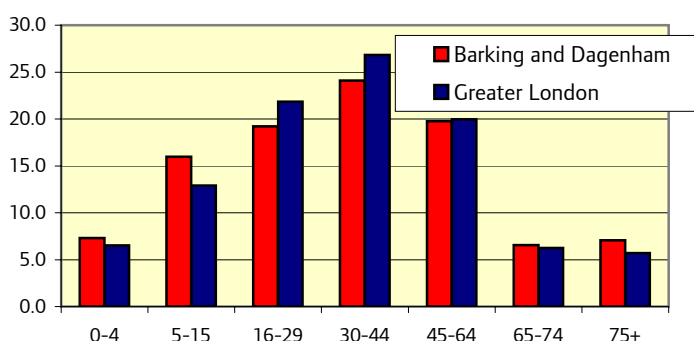

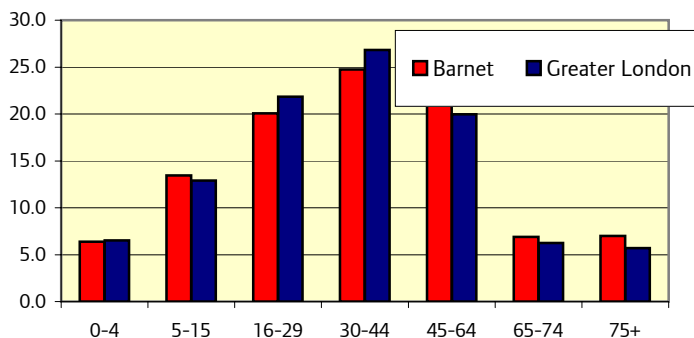

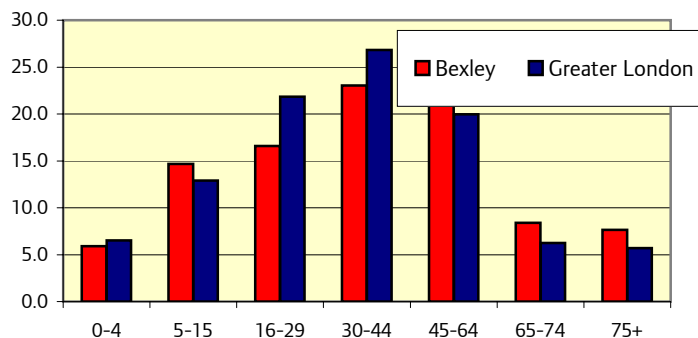

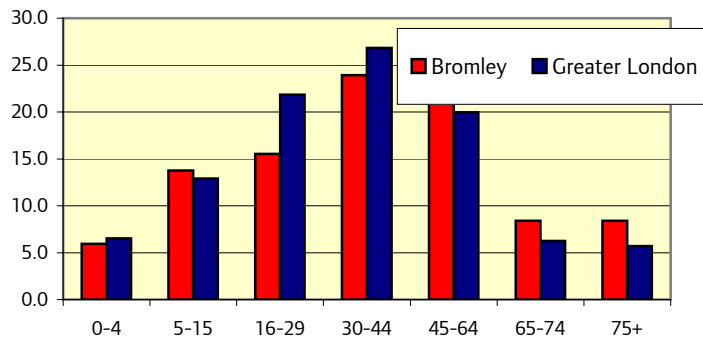

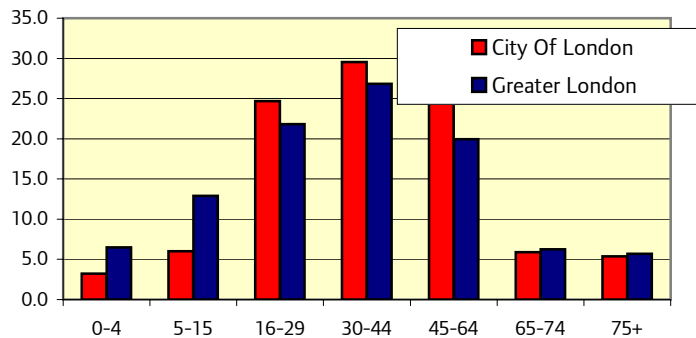

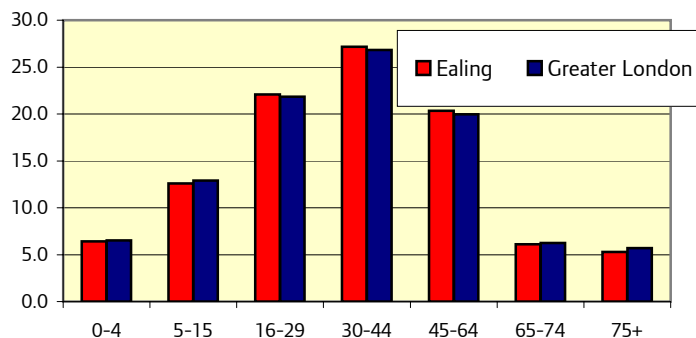

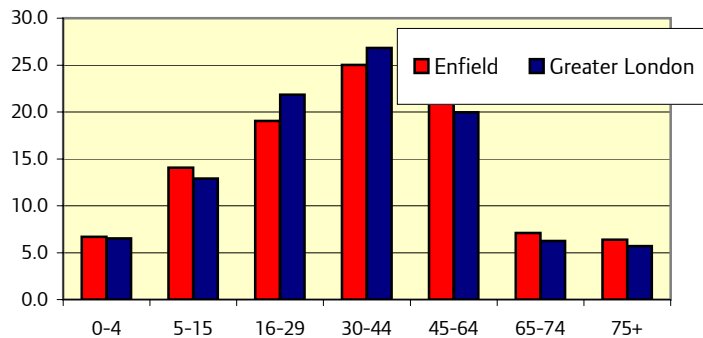

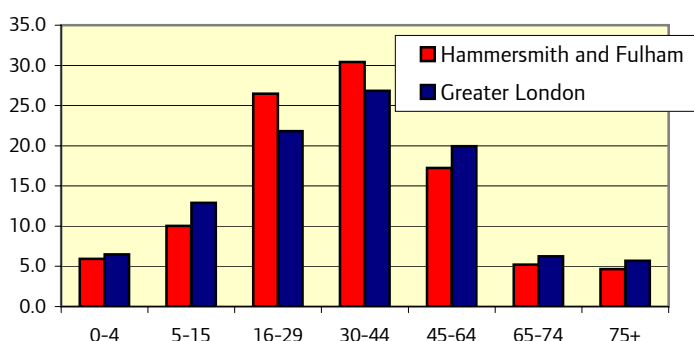

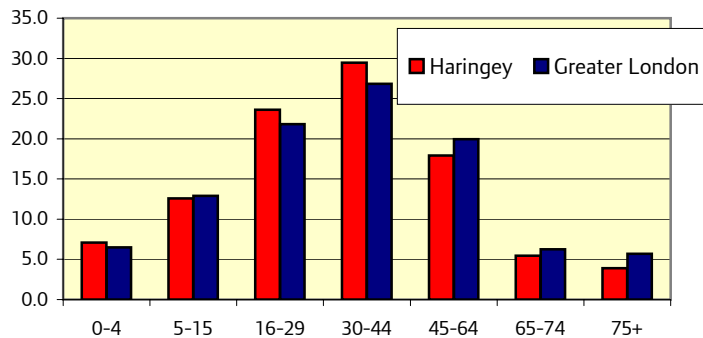

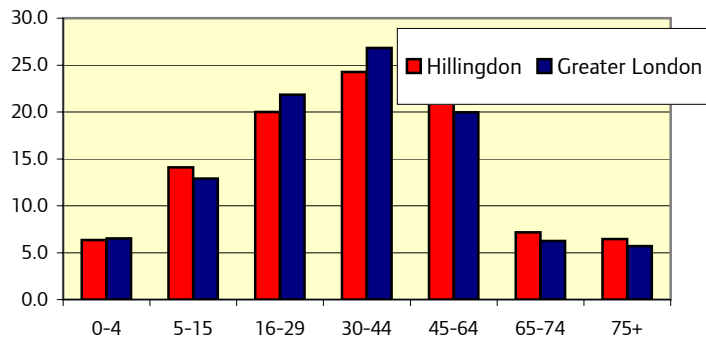

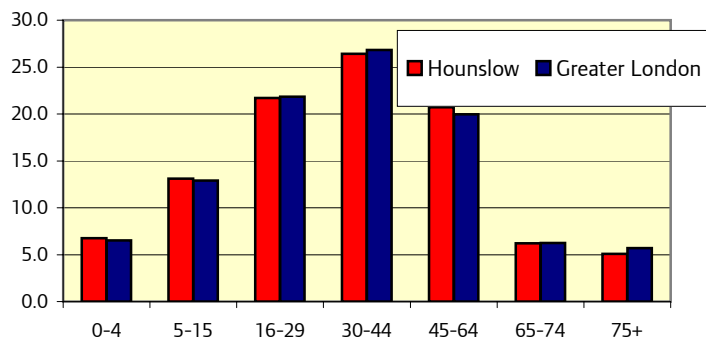

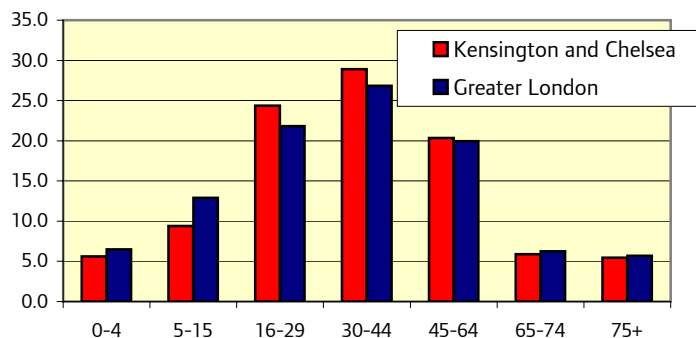

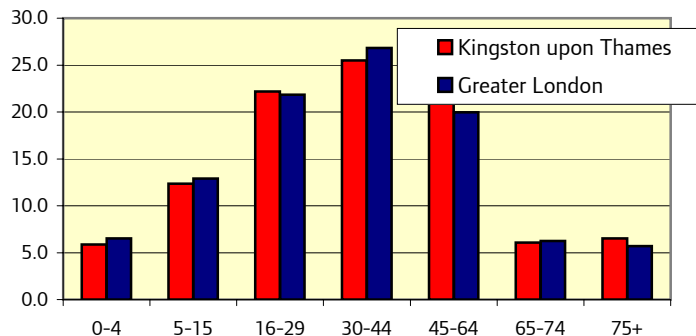

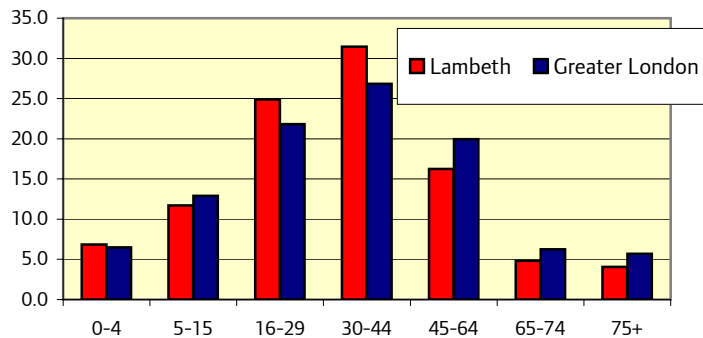

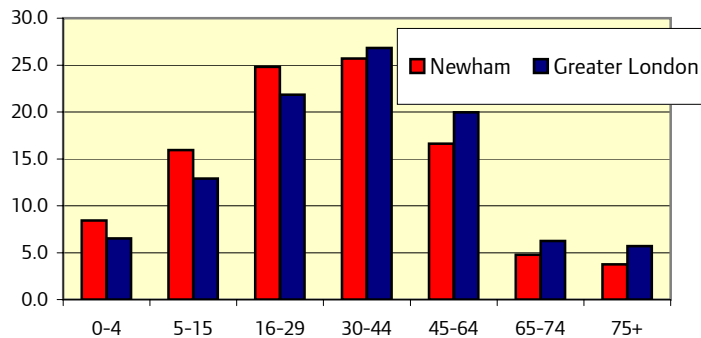

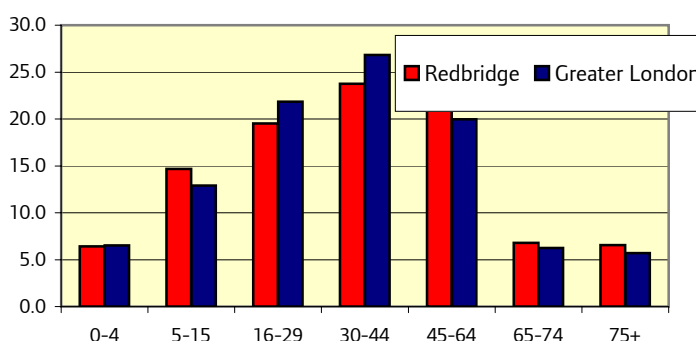

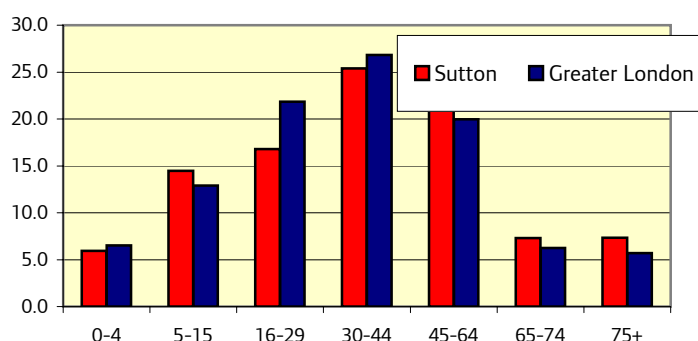

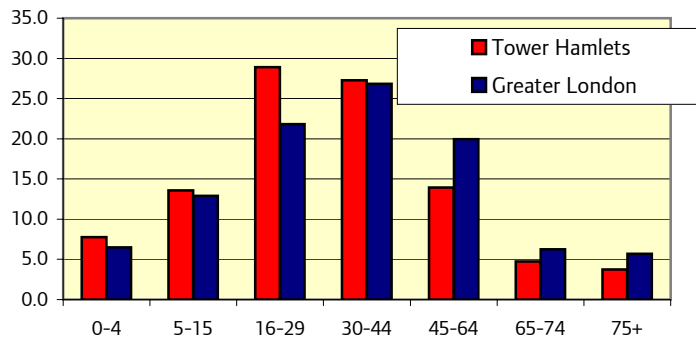

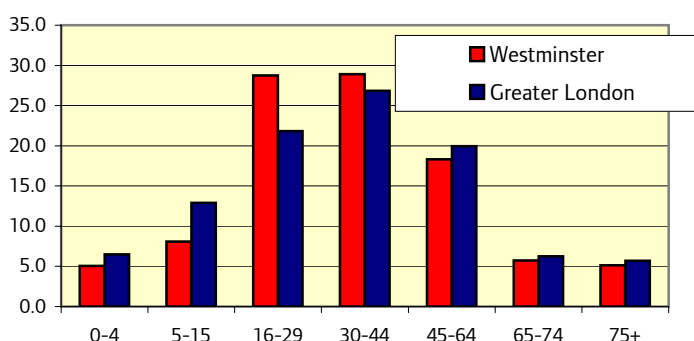

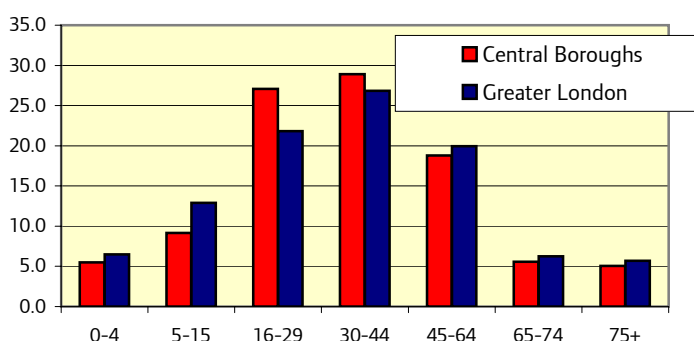

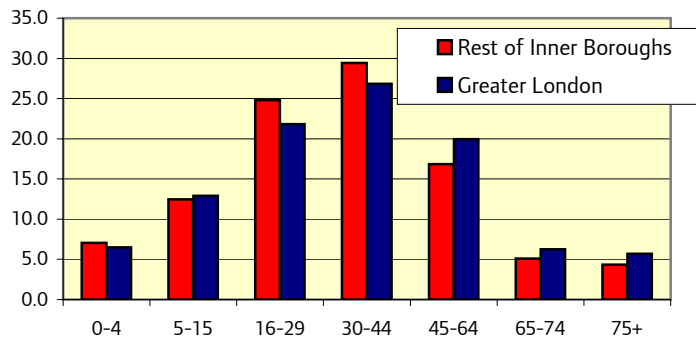

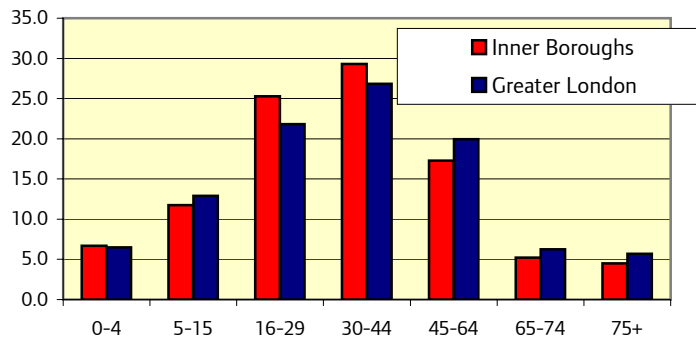

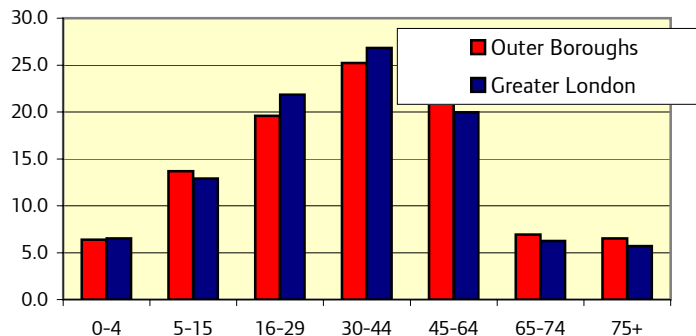

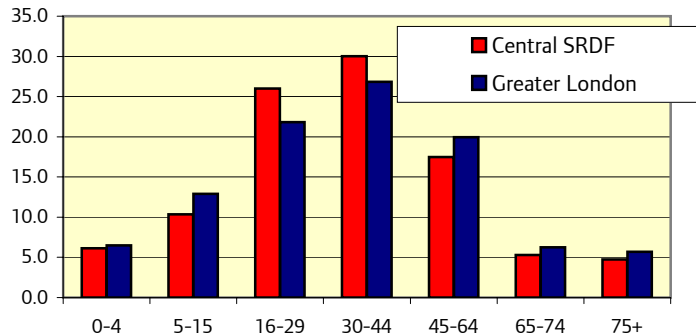

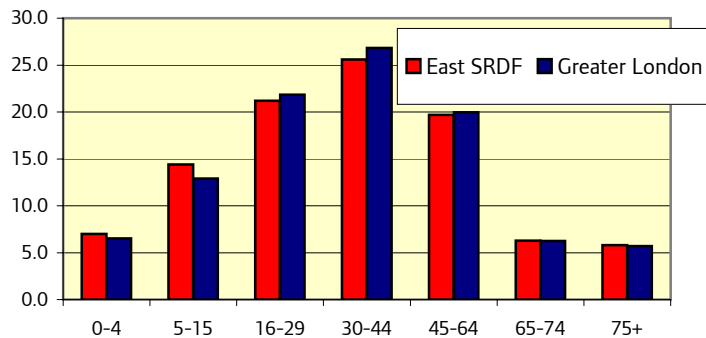

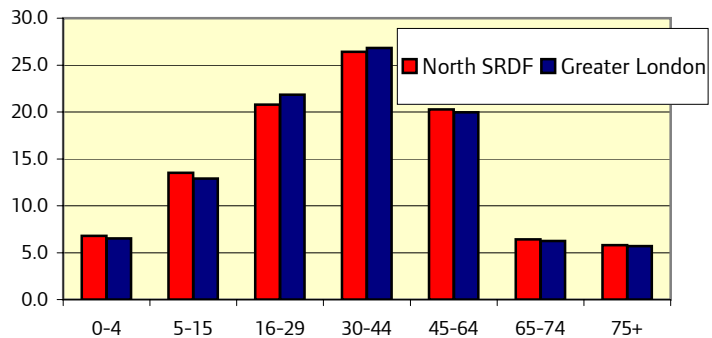

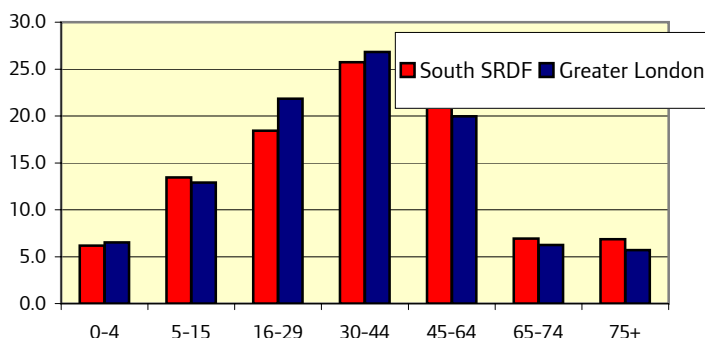

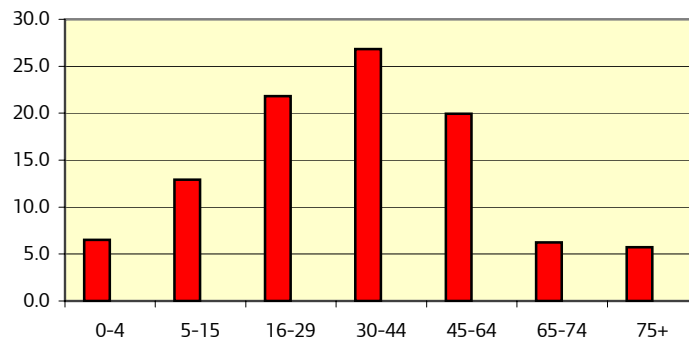

Appendix A

ONS mid-year estimates

Mid-2004 estimates of resident population were published by ONS on 25 August 2005. These form part of a fully consistent time series of mid-year estimates at local authority level back to 1981. *DMAG Briefing 2005/27 ONS Mid-2004 Population Estimates* describes the data at a borough, London and national level, and looks at recent changes over time.

Definition of resident population

The estimated population of an area includes all people who usually live there, whatever their nationality. Members of HM and US Armed forces in England and Wales are included on a residential basis wherever possible. HM forces stationed outside England and Wales are not included. Students are taken to be resident at their term-time address.

ONS mid-year estimates by ethnic group

On 26 January 2006, population estimates for all local authorities in England were released for 2001, 2002 and 2003, for all 16 (2001 Census) ethnic group categories. These data are classed as *experimental statistics*, that is, they are not yet of high enough quality to be classed as *National Statistics*. The data are available by 5-year age and gender for England, and by three broad age groups and gender at local authority level. Components of population change are also available for England. The estimates by ethnic group have been constrained to the ONS mid-year estimates for these years. *Demography Update 2006/5 – ONS Population Estimates by Ethnic Group, 2001 to 2003* – outlines the key data.

Components of population change 2003-04

As part of the standard release of data from the ONS, the components of population change between one year and the next are available on the National Statistics website - <http://www.statistics.gov.uk/STATBASE/Product.asp?vlnk=14060>. These 'components of change' show the numbers of people migrating in and out of the area either from within the UK or abroad, the natural change (births minus deaths) and 'other changes'. International migration figures are comprised of data from the International Passenger Survey (IPS), people moving to and from the Republic of Ireland, Asylum Seekers and Visitor Switchers.

Internal Migration

Internal Migration figures at the local authority level are derived from the combination of National Health Service Central Register (NHSCR) continuous monitoring and changes in the patient registers that are available annually.

NHSCR - The NHSCR is a record of all NHS patients. It ensures that medical records are effectively used by the Health Authorities and that General Practitioners are paid correctly. Information is passed to the NHSCR electronically from Health Authorities based upon patients who re-register with General Practitioners in their area. The data are specific to age and gender of the patient and the former and current health areas of registration.

Health Authority Patient Registers - Every Health Authority in England and Wales holds a register of the patients registered with General Practitioners within their area of responsibility. This contains the NHS number, gender, date of acceptance at the health authority and importantly the postcode of address of the patient. By obtaining a download from each patient register on an annual basis combining all 104 patient register extracts together, ONS can create a total register for the whole of England and Wales. Comparing records in one year with those of the previous linking on NHS numbers enables the identification of people who change their postcode and therefore may be defined as a person who, between one year and the next, changes their area of residence.

The two files are linked such that the number of migrants at local authority level based upon the patient registers is grossed up to allow for the number of all persons recording a change of address at Health Authority level throughout the year under continuous monitoring using the NHSCR data.

International Migration

International migration data are estimated from the International Passenger Survey (IPS), movement to and from the Republic of Ireland, Asylum Seekers and Visitor Switchers.

IPS - The IPS is a voluntary sample survey which is conducted continuously at the main ports of entry into the UK, ie air, sea, Channel Tunnel. Information on age, sex, marital status and citizenship are all collected by the survey, and people are surveyed both entering and leaving the UK. Figures on international migration are published annually through the ONS MN Series.

Visitor Switchers - Visitor switchers are people who on entry to the UK are remaining for under one year, but who subsequently stay for greater than a year. The data shown are not the total flows rather an estimate of flows that are not already included in the international migration flows from the IPS. Care must be taken when using these figures as they are **not** National Statistics, and as such they do not meet the stringent requirements made of National Statistics data. The data are only really fit for uses such as population modelling and understanding population change.

Other Changes

In addition to the migration and natural change components, the following form an 'other changes' group:

- Change in Armed Forces and Foreign Armed Forces (including foreign armed forces dependants)
- Change in boarding school pupils
- Change in prisoners
- Boundary change adjustment
- Reconciliation adjustment

Appendix B

GLA 2005 Round *Interim* Demographic Population Projections – Scenario 8.07

The Greater London Authority produces annual demographic projections at borough and ward level; the population data are broken down by single year of age and gender for each geographic area.

The 2005 Round projections in this *Briefing* update the 2003 Round Scenario 8.1 projections used in the *London Plan*. The key data used in the projections are as follows:

- The borough level base populations are the re-revised mid-2001 estimates, published in September 2003.
- Births, deaths and migration changes up to mid-2004 have been used. These are broadly consistent with the ONS mid-year estimates up to mid-2004.
- For the first time, 2001 Census migration age and gender structures were available and have been used in the model.
- Borough age-specific fertility rates and borough-group age/gender survival rates based upon the re-revised mid-2001 populations and the births and deaths occurring in the calendar years 2000-02 have been used as the basis for fertility and survival assumptions
- The Government Actuary's mid-2003 based assumptions for the future course of national fertility and survival rates have been followed
- The 2004 London Housing Capacity Study (LHCS) has been the main determinant of the population change in each of the London boroughs
- The 2001 Census borough level household representative rates have been used to set assumptions about the future course of average household size.

These projections are known as *Interim* as they have been produced on the same basis as the previous projections, that is borough level projections are linked to an assumed capacity based upon the 2004 LHCS and an estimate of average household size. The *Final* projections must await the availability of the ODPM 2003-based household projections in order to be able to use the projected trends in marital status and household representative rates that they incorporate in order to link population change with the planned growth in homes. The detailed ODPM household projections are due for the release in April 2006.

Appendix C

Vital Statistics 2004

Vital Statistics 2004 relate to events occurring in the resident population. Unless stated, all rates are calculated using ONS mid-2004 population estimates.

Definitions

Crude Birth/Death Rate

Crude Birth/Death Rates indicate the number of births/deaths per thousand resident population at mid-year.

General Fertility Rate

The General Fertility Rate is the number of live births per thousand resident women aged 15-44.

Total Period Fertility Rate (TPFR)

Total Period Fertility Rate indicates the average number of children that would be born to a woman if the current age-specific patterns of fertility persisted throughout her childbearing life. These data, for the boroughs and Inner, Outer and Greater London, were calculated by ONS based on the 2003 mid-year estimates. The TPFRs for the two other borough groups and the SRDFs were calculated by the GLA by weighting borough data according to the numbers of females aged 15 to 44 in the mid-2004 estimates.

Standardised Mortality Ratio (SMR)

Standardised Mortality Ratio indicates how the mortality of a given area compares with the national level, after allowing for differences in age structure.

The SMR represents total observed deaths as a percentage of expected deaths, which are calculated as the number that would occur if the population of the area experienced the age/sex mortality rates of England and Wales. Similar to the TPFRs the SMRs for the boroughs, Inner, Outer and Greater London were calculated by the ONS using the 2003 mid-year estimates. The SMRs for the remaining areas were calculated by the GLA by weighting borough data using the 2004 mid-year estimates for total population.

Expectation of life at birth

The ONS releases, on an annual basis, expectation of life at birth figures for local and health authorities, Government Office Regions and constituent countries of the UK. The most recent data refer to the period 2002-04. *DMAG Update 2005-13 Life expectancy at birth*, covering some of the key results, was produced shortly after the figures were released.

Each local authority submits annual returns to the Office of the Deputy Prime Minister (ODPM) relating to the number of properties on their valuation list as at November each year. The properties are categorised by the Tax Band (A to H) under several headings:

- Total Chargeable Dwellings
- Exempt Dwellings
- Dwellings Demolitions and Outside of Area of Authority
- Chargeable Dwellings with Disabled Relief
- Chargeable Dwellings with 25% discount
- Chargeable Dwellings with 50% discount
- Chargeable Dwellings with no discount
- 'Equivalent Dwellings'
- Band D Equivalent Dwellings

The data shown in the *Profiles* are for September 2005, with changes since October 2001, and relate to Total Chargeable Dwellings.

Housing Completions

London Development Database

The London Development Database (LDD) contains planning permission data back to 1987, most of which comes from previous systems and currently holds nearly 50,000 records. Only those permissions added since the LDD was introduced in April 2004 are guaranteed a full set of information – the data for both residential and non-residential developments includes information on number of bedrooms, tenure, floorspace – and every permission record holds an address, site area, grid reference and details of existing and proposed use. The LDD is designed to inform Mayoral policies in terms of how London is developing, and the information from it helps to measure progress on the *London Plan* against specific targets.

Appendix E

RPF29 Summary of Register of Electors, 2005 (October 2004), Population Estimate Unit, Office for National Statistics

The register of electors shows the number of local government electors for each local authority and parliamentary electors for each parliamentary constituency.

In this *Briefing*, data for the total number of local government electors is shown. This number includes residential qualifiers (see below), Peers, European Union citizens and attainers.

The 2005 figures are derived from data supplied to the Office for National Statistics by Electoral Registration Officers and show the number of people who on 1 December 2004 were registered to vote in local elections. These are based on a qualifying date of 15 October 2004.

To qualify as a resident, a person needs to be normally living at the address on the qualifying date, even if temporarily absent. People having more than one place of residence, such as students and those with second homes, may therefore be included on more than one register.

The term attainer is used to describe a person who attains the age of 18 during the currency of the register, and is entitled to vote at an election held on or after his or her eighteenth birthday.

Appendix F

Labour Force

Annual Population Survey (APS)

The APS is a new survey that replaces the annual Labour Force Survey (LFS). The APS collects a wide range of data about people and their labour market circumstances and is carried out by the ONS. While the APS is new in terms of its sample design, it has similar topic coverage and sample size (in the case of London) to the LFS.

The data presented in this *Briefing* are from the 2004 annual dataset, covering the period January to December 2004.

- Economic Activity – persons aged 16 and over who are in employment or are unemployed by the International Labour Organisation definition (see below).
- Employment – people aged 16 and over who did at least 1 hours' work in the reference week; those who had a job that they were temporarily away from; those on government supported training and employment programmes; and those doing unpaid family work.
- Unemployment – the International Labour Organisation's measure of unemployment refers to people without a job who were able to start work in two weeks following their LFS interview and who had either looked for work in the four weeks prior to interview or were waiting to start a job they had already obtained.
- Economic Inactivity – people neither in employment nor unemployed.
- Part-Time – this is generally classified on the basis of self-definition.
- Self-Employed – this is also classified on the basis of self-definition.

More detailed data, including breakdowns by disability, ethnicity and age, for London and the Government Office Regions are available in *DMAG Briefing 2005/34 Introducing the Annual Population Survey: Preliminary results from the 2004 APS for London*.

Appendix G

Benefits Claimants - Department of Work and Pensions

The data used in this *Briefing* refer to August 2005 and cover six main statistics;

- Income Support – this can be paid to a person who
 - is in Great Britain
 - is aged 16 or over
 - is not working 16 hours or more a week
 - has less money coming in than the law says they need to live on.

From October 1996, Jobseeker's Allowance replaced IS for unemployed people. In general Income Support is now only available to people who are not required to be available for work such as pensioners, lone parents and sick and disabled people. The rates are calculated using population aged 16+.

- Attendance Allowance – this is a benefit for people over the age of 65 who are so severely disabled, physically or mentally, that they need a great deal of help with personal care or supervision. They could need either frequent attention coping with their bodily functions or continual supervision to stop them hurting themselves or others. This could be either during the day or at night. The denominator for rates is the 65+ population.

- Disability Living Allowance is available for people who become disabled before the age of 65. It replaced and extended Attendance Allowance and Mobility Allowance. People who could not qualify for Mobility Allowance or Attendance Allowance can get the lower rates of Disability Living Allowance. Rates are calculated using total population as a denominator.

- Incapacity Benefit – this replaced Sickness and Invalidity Benefits from 13 April 1995. It is paid to people who are assessed as being incapable of work and who meet the appropriate contribution conditions. Rates are calculated using the working age population (16-64 for men and 16-59 for women) as a denominator.

- Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA) is a benefit for unemployed people or those working less than 16 hours a week and who are looking for full-time work. There are different types of JSA depending on whether claimants satisfy the National Insurance contributions conditions, pass the means test or are claiming as part of a couple. There are also strict criteria that must be met in respect of the claimant's labour market activity.

- Pension Credit was introduced in October 2003. It is an entitlement for people aged 60 and over living in Great Britain. Pension Credit has replaced the Minimum Income Guarantee (MIG). However, the principle of a guaranteed minimum income continues to apply. There are two parts to Pension Credit: the guarantee credit and the savings credit.

The guarantee credit provides financial help for people aged 60 or over whose income is below a certain level set by the law. The level that applies depends on individual circumstances; this is the standard, minimum guarantee. The awarded amount will depend on other sources of income, such as other pensions and savings. Extra amounts will be added to the standard minimum guarantee for those who have:

- relevant housing costs

- severe disabilities
- caring responsibilities

The savings credit is an extra amount for people aged 65 or over who have made some provision for their retirement (such as savings or a second pension) which brings their income above a level set by Parliament, called the 'savings credit threshold'. The aim is to reward pensioners who have modest income or savings. Claimants can get a savings credit on top of a guarantee credit. Claimants may still get a savings credit even if their income is above the standard minimum guarantee level.

Appendix H

Education Statistics

Statistics of Education Schools in England 2005 edition, Department of Education and Skills

The latest edition of "Statistics of Education Schools in England" includes school data for the academic year 2004/2005, which was collected in January 2005. The data relate to England and local authorities within England and **applies to the LEA of the school** rather than the residence of the pupil. The National Assembly for Wales collects their own statistics on schools and pupils in Wales; however these figures are not necessarily comparable with those from the Department for Education and Skills.

Most of the school information is from the Pupil Level Annual Schools' Census (PLASC), which was undertaken in January each year. In January 2002, for the first time, the Annual Schools' Census received individual pupil level data from maintained primary, secondary and special schools. In January 2003 pupil level data collection was expanded to include non-maintained special schools and academies. Whilst PLASC has been a very successful survey, it is possible that there is some discontinuity resulting from the change, though this is not thought to be significant.

Definitions

Nursery Schools

Nursery schools provide education primarily for children below compulsory school age (under 5).

Primary Schools

Primary schools consist mainly of infant schools for children aged 5 to 7, junior schools for those aged 7 to 11 and junior and infant schools for both age groups. Primary schools make provision for the youngest children of compulsory school age (5 and above), however, the majority of London schools also provide a reception class for pupils aged 4.

In addition, first schools cater for ages from 5 to 8, 9 or 10. They are the first stage of a three-tier (first, middle and secondary) school system. Many primary schools provide 'nursery' classes for under-fours. A 'nursery' class is one which includes amongst its staff a qualified nursery assistant.

Secondary Schools

Secondary education is provided mainly in three types of school, the comprehensive school, the secondary modern and the secondary grammar.

Schools which do not fall into any of these categories are classified as other schools. City Academies and City Technology Colleges (see following) which are publicly funded but registered as independent schools, fall into this category.

Special Schools

Special schools, both day and boarding, provide education for children with special educational needs who cannot be educated satisfactorily in an ordinary school.

Maintained special schools are run by local education authorities that pay all the expenses of maintenance.

Non-maintained special schools are run by voluntary bodies: they may receive some grant from the Department for capital work and for equipment, but their current expenditure is met primarily from the fees charged to the local education authorities for pupils placed in the schools.

Pupil Referral Unit

A Pupil Referral Unit is a centre for children of primary or secondary school age who have been temporarily withdrawn from mainstream provision.

Independent Schools

An independent school is legally defined as any institution providing full time education for five or more pupils of compulsory school age that is neither maintained by a local education authority nor a non-maintained special school. All independent schools are initially inspected by HMI from Ofsted. Just over half of all independent schools choose to belong to the professional associations constituting the Independent Schools Council (ISC).

City Technology Colleges and Academies

City Technology Colleges

These take the form of a charitable company limited by guarantee. The sponsors constitute an educational trust and will own or lease the college and appoint their representatives to the Board of Governors. The members of a CTC will consist of nominees of the sponsoring company and the Secretary of State. When the CTC is opened it will be registered as an independent school and is included in the independent schools tables.

Academies

These have been created more recently, but are essentially the same as CTCs with the same funding and status. However, while CTCs focus more on technology subjects, the Academies take a broader approach and tend to be found more in inner city areas.

Because of the similarities and relatively small numbers, City Technology Colleges and Academies have been grouped together.

Additional Data Sources

Data Management and Analysis Group (DMAG), GLA

In addition to demographic data, DMAG is also responsible for specific analysis on areas such as ethnicity, social exclusion, the 2001 Census and education. *DMAG Briefings* and analysis are available either direct from DMAG (see back cover for contact details), from individual London Boroughs, or via the GLA Extranet. The Extranet is a secure GLA website, which has limited access, and requires a password. Access to the Extranet may be granted on request. GLAEconomics, GLA

Established in May 2002, GLAEconomics are responsible for assessing and monitoring the economic situation of London and providing economic analysis for policies and projects in areas such as transport, development and the environment.

Office for National Statistics (ONS) – <http://www.statistics.gov.uk>

The ONS is responsible for producing a wide variety of statistics, much of which is used in GLA analysis. Of particular interest, are;

- data from the Annual Population Survey (APS), a household survey with a UK sample of around 500,000 residents and 235,000 households. Analysis of APS data includes employment, unemployment, ethnicity, disability and qualifications.
- the Claimant Count, a count of people claiming Jobseeker's Allowance
- vital statistics – births and deaths
- electorate data
- earnings data from the New Earnings Survey, a 1% sample of employees in employment which collects information on hours worked and earnings from the employers. Self-employed earnings are not included
- 2001 Census
- population estimates and projections
- Neighbourhood Statistics

Office of the Deputy Prime Minister (ODPM) – <http://www.odpm.gov.uk>

This department is responsible for policy on housing, planning, devolution, regional and local government and the fire service.

Department for Education and Skills (DfES) – <http://www.dfes.gov.uk>

The DfES is the department responsible for schools and education, including funding, policy and compiling statistics.

Government Actuary's Department (GAD) – <http://www.gad.gov.uk>

This is a department of actuaries, advising the Government on issues affecting public policy in order to help ensure the financial stability of the state and private pensions systems. The department, since 1954, has also been responsible for producing the official population projections for the UK and constituent countries. Since January 2006 the demographic work of GAD has been absorbed into the National Statistics Centre for Demography based at ONS. At present the national population projections are still only available via the GAD website.

Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) – <http://www.dwp.gov.uk>

The remit of DWP is primarily welfare reform, for example, helping people back into work while supporting those unable to work through Jobcentre Plus; tackling child poverty; and assisting independence for the elderly. Statistics available from DWP mainly focus around benefits, such as Child Benefit, Jobseeker's Allowance, Incapacity Benefit and the New Deal.

Nomis – <http://www.nomisweb.co.uk>

Nomis is run by the University of Durham on behalf of the Office for National Statistics. It was launched in 1981 and makes available a vast range of labour market statistics, such as employment, unemployment, earnings, and claimant data. It has recently introduced profiles for each local authority in Great Britain, covering information such as population, labour supply and demand and the number of VAT registered businesses.
