### **Key statistics are coming 13th February**

Key Statistics from the 2001 Census are due to be published on 13th February. These will consist of 25 tables of various characteristics of the population. These are all univariate statistics and will not contain any cross-tabulations. They will be published for all local authority districts in the country so users will be able to do some initial national comparisons and in some cases, comparisons with 1991. The Office for National Statistics (ONS) have confirmed that they will be publishing the Key Statistics in the form of a book which will be available from The Stationery Office on 13th February. The ONS publication will contain percentages for all the variables plus population totals or totals within tables.

The data delivered to users (that is the 'bulk delivery'), in particular to the SASPAC team, will be the numbers and percentages. This will be processed as soon as it arrives and SASPAC system files will be created. It is expected that the processing will take a matter of hours, and if there are no problems with the files then the data will then be circulated as quickly as possible after that. This involves writing CDs and sending them out. If the file is small enough then it will also be distributed in other ways, see below for more details. There are still a few unknowns with this process - when ONS are going to supply the raw data to us for processing; whether ONS will have released test data for testing the conversion (and we have had no test data so far); whether ONS will make any more changes to the table layouts ('final' table layouts appeared on the ONS website on 23rd January which still contain some errors that have not been rectified from the last version); whether ONS will publish the promised list of changes in time for it to be of any use. No prizes for guessing the common factor in all these unknowns!

Circulation of the data within the GLA will be by whichever means proves to be the most appropriate for the user. GLA staff should simply contact one of the Census Team to discuss the quickest and easiest way of getting hold of the data.

### **Plans for dissemination of Key Statistics and other census data**

The intention is to disseminate all Census data as quickly as possible, the SASPAC team to all its members across the country and the Census Team to the GLA, all the members of the consortium purchase and to a number of other people who may need it.

There are a number of ways of disseminating the data and we will use all of them when it is appropriate:

- By e-mail from the GLA if the files are not too big
- On CDs from the Census Team or SASPAC Project Officer
- Download from the GLA extranet ... see the note below about access and recent technical problems
- Download from ONS/NeSS website in Supertable format (Supertable is the browser software that will be available free with the data from the NeSS website)
- Other means will be considered if required

There are gaps in this timetable as it is intended to indicate the timescale rather than give exact dates for anything except the Key Statistics. Further details will be included in later Census Information Notes.

## **Output area boundaries**

Output area boundaries are not yet mentioned in the ONS output timetable, and the only commitment from ONS is that they will come with the output area data. We are still trying to get the boundaries released to local authorities earlier. ONS have said that they will finish creating the output area boundaries by the end of January but they have not yet said when they will be released. We are still asking for them to be released to local government as early as possible so that they can be incorporated into our systems in time for the release of the data. The earliest possible date is the end of February.

## **Commissioned tables**

The service for commissioning tables should be available from sometime later this year. The list of tables commissioned by the London Research Centre from the 1991 Census is in Appendix 1 just as a reminder. Initial proposals for tables to be commissioned from the 2001 Census will be included in another Census Information Note within a couple of weeks of this one.

This list needs to be determined so that we can give ONS an initial list as early as possible to help them with planning the production of commissioned tables. If anyone already knows of cross-tabulations that they will need which are not in the standard datasets then please contact Eileen Howes. Details of the standard datasets are available from the ONS website (on [www.statistics.gov.uk/census2001](http://www.statistics.gov.uk/census2001)), and these tables should be looked at before asking for a table to be commissioned. The list will be discussed at the next Census Users' Group meeting

on 18 February 2003. This will not be the final list as we will continue to commission 2001 Census tables for several years to come.

There are still no details of the cost of commissioning a table, but we are planning on the basis that we need a large number of tables to meet the needs of all members of the consortium and that tables will be cheaper than they were from the 1991 Census.

### **Berkshire**

The six unitary authorities and Joint Unit in Berkshire have joined the 2001 Census consortium purchase, paying an equivalent amount to the boroughs. They will therefore have a representative at the Census User Group meetings in future. They will in general be treated as six extra boroughs.

### **London Health Observatory**

The London Health Observatory has joined the 2001 Census consortium purchase on a more limited basis, with their main interest being in commissioned tables. They will also have a representative at the Census User Group meetings in future.

### **Laptops**

The consortium purchase agreement specified the provision of a PC for each member. Laptops are being ordered to the specification below. They will be issued to the London boroughs, Functional Bodies and Berkshire Authorities, as soon as possible. We hoped to issue them on 18th February and still hope that this will be the case but there may be some delay because the order is a large one and had to be signed by the Mayor in person. We will keep the Census Contacts informed of any developments.

The spec for the laptops is:

Pentium 4, 1.9 GHz, 256Mb RAM, 40Gb hard disk, DVD/CDRW drives, PS2 external mouse, 15" screen capable of 1024 x 768 resolution, carry case for laptop and cables, 2 USB ports, 8Mb graphics memory, XP pro operating system, MS office professional, Acrobat Reader, 3 year on site warranty, next business day, parts and labour (8 hr response). All machines will have an ethernet card.

### **Response rates - initial work**

We have published a DMAG Briefing on 2001 Census response rates written by Rachel Leeser. It is DMAG Briefing 2002-12 and was e-mailed to Census Contacts. It is also available on the GLA Census website on <http://extranet.london.gov.uk/census2001>. See item below for access to the GLA extranet.

## **Paycheck**

The 2002 Paycheck data has been distributed to all boroughs involved in the purchase. Each borough involved in the consortium must sign a license with CACI agreeing to the terms of the license. The main restriction is that it is for internal use only. Each borough in the consortium has got data for 20 income bands for each enumeration district and postcode in their borough, as well as the same data for Greater London and Great Britain. If any other borough wants to buy this data the cost has gone down to £512 because of the number of boroughs who have bought the data. Eileen Howes will be sending the license to those boroughs in receipt of the Paycheck data.

## **Extranet**

Access to the GLA's extranet has been subject to some interruption, especially for GLA staff. External users have had access to it recently while the Census Team has not. This has now been rectified and the site is available to all registered users. Registration forms were issued at the last Census Users' Group Meeting and all those who filled in the forms should have received a letter confirming their user id and password. If anyone has not received this confirmation please contact Michael Minors. Anyone else who wants access to the extranet should complete the form on the last page of this Census Information Note and return it to Michael Minors, Data Management and Analysis, 5th Floor, City Hall, The Queen's Walk, London SE1 2AA.

The site will be updated more regularly in future, now that we can see it.

## **SASPAC**

SASPAC Version 6.5 will be sent with the Key Statistics. This version of SASPAC will not differ in functionality from version 6 but the menu choices will include 2001 Census datasets rather than just 1991 and 1981. The 2001 table layouts (frameworks) will also be supplied with version 6.5.

## **Training**

SASPAC and Census training sessions are run by Bill Armstrong and are available to all members of the consortium. The current series of training sessions are fully booked with a waiting list. This session ends on Friday 7 February.

The dates for future sessions during 2003 are:

Monday 28 April to Friday 16 May

Monday 8 September to Friday 3 October

Monday 17 November to Friday 12 December

As soon as one session is finished Bill Armstrong will start to take bookings for the next session. We expect that the sessions in April and May will be extremely popular and we will have to limit bookings to no more than 2 people from any organisation. We will start to take bookings for these on Monday 10 February.

All bookings should be made through Bill Armstrong. He will circulate the details for each session when he is starting to take bookings. If you do not hear from him directly at that time please contact him via e-mail. If more than 2 people from an authority want to attend we expect the main Census Contact in that authority to determine which 2 should attend.

## **Census Analysis**

Plans are being made for a wide range of analyses of the 2001 Census data and some initial suggestions are included here. The topics for inclusion will be discussed in more detail at the Census Users' Group meetings. Many of the analyses suggested here are likely to be published in the form of DMAG Briefings. There will also be a series of longer reports. All will be published electronically as well as in printed form.

We have been thinking for some time now about Census analysis and the form and content of reports to be produced for the consortium. There will be a series of briefings on a range of topics - to meet the immediate demand for Census data and analysis. So we have planned a number of quick briefings in advance so that they can be made available quickly and will complement these with a series of more detailed briefings and longer reports, which will be based on data published later in the schedule and which will take longer to produce. These will be produced alongside various analyses that the GLA may produce for its own purposes. We hope that all the varying demands will be covered, in part, by the series we are planning. We also aim to provide relevant data to anyone else who wishes to do their own analysis.

Initial discussions have been held but any suggestions are very welcome. Please tell us what topics you are interested in. Favourite topics so far:

*Technical briefings*

Licensing and copyright, dissemination, click-use license

Definitions, rounding, One Number Census, response rates for individual questions, etc

*Proposed briefings based on Key Statistics*

Initial data will consist only of the numbers of people in particular classifications and the percentage in the population at local authority district level. There is a limit, therefore, to what can be done with this data. We propose that these initial briefings will include maps showing the distribution across London, league tables of numbers and percentages within London and nationally plus, where possible, comparisons with 1991. The initial briefings will be produced as quickly as possible after the data is released, processed and checked. The plans so far are for the briefings listed below. More will be added if volunteers are found to produce them. Further topics which have been suggested include health and educational attainment.

2001 Census Key Statistics: summary of results, Eileen Howes - to include anything of interest to London

2001 Census Key Statistics: households and migration, John Hollis - implications for the London Plan and population projections

2001 Census Key Statistics: housing and household spaces, Eileen Howes - most detailed new data for a decade on tenure, household spaces, accommodation type, persons per room, occupancy rating, sharing of amenities, lowest floor level

2001 Census Key Statistics: labour market data, Eileen Howes - data on economic activity, unemployment, full-time and part-time working, self-employment, hours worked, industry, occupation, NS-SEC, means of travel to work

2001 Census Key Statistics: birthplace, ethnic group and religion (Baljit Bains and Ed Klodawski)

The next set of data to be published will be the Standard Tables at borough level. These will give an enormous volume of data at this level and will allow topics to be analysed in much more detail. We intend to produce a series of more detailed briefings at this stage on a similar range of topics and start work on a few longer term analyses that will produce more substantive reports.

*Proposed briefings based on borough level Standard Tables*

Most of the topics included under Key Statistics will be looked at in more detail. In addition consideration is being given to:

Educational attainment

Health, long-term illness and provision of care - compare llti with 1991, compare llti with general health

Household composition and workless families

Unemployment in London - by age, gender, ethnicity, religion.

#### *Longer reports*

A Ward Atlas of London - similar to the one published by the London Research Centre based on the 1991 Census. (Bill Armstrong)

Ethnic minorities in London - following on from London's ethnic minorities: one city, many communities and Without Prejudice (Marian Storkey).

London's Workers - update of the report with the same title published by the LRC (Eileen Howes)

Housing in London - details to be discussed further

Unemployment - linked to other sources and definitions

These are just our initial thoughts. Any comments and suggestions would be welcome. This timetable will be developed further when the timetable for release of data becomes clearer. Contact Eileen Howes for more details or if you have any suggested topics.
