**2001 Census: Ethnic groups
in London and other districts**

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Introduction

This Briefing presents statistics on ethnic and religious groups for London and other districts from the 2001 Census. It is mainly in the form of tabulations and two diagrams. It complements a number of other DMAG Briefings related to ethnicity, religion and country of birth, some of which are listed at the back of this Briefing. Several more are planned, on a range of topics that have not been analysed so far.

It would have been preferable to be able to include UK data for comparison, and data for districts in Scotland and Northern Ireland. While England and Wales had an almost identical Census (the only difference being a question on ability to read/speak/understand Welsh), unfortunately, the 2001 Census was different in Scotland and Northern Ireland. In particular the questions on ethnic group and religion were different in each country. Only a very small amount of the data on ethnicity for Scotland or Northern Ireland is comparable with most the data included in this Briefing, and this is shown in the table below. Some data for Scotland and Northern Ireland is included in Tables 1 and 2 but data in much of the rest of the Briefing is, of necessity, based on data for England and Wales. The data on religion is not comparable.

Another factor to be considered is spatial concentrations within districts, although more detailed consideration of this is beyond the scope of this Briefing. An example of this is the concentration of Muslims in Spitalfields and Banglatown ward in Tower Hamlets (62 per cent) in London, which is much higher than the borough proportion of 36.4 per cent. A more extreme example is Oldham where the proportion of Pakistanis in the district is just over 6 per cent, but in the wards Coldhurst and Werneth within Oldham the proportion of Pakistanis rises to 53 and 52 per cent respectively. Similarly, the proportion of Muslims in Oldham is just over 11 per cent, but the proportion is 40 and 30 per cent in the two wards of Werneth and St Marys. Further DMAG Briefings will look at spatial concentrations in more detail.

Districts in the following tables have been selected from the tables of rankings at the back of this Briefing. They are a range of districts that feature in one or other of the tables. They are listed in the same way that the Office for National Statistics has ordered them in the standard tables.

Table 1 looks at the population of England by White British and two other amalgamations of ethnic groups, including the details for London and of some other major cities and metropolitan districts for comparison.

The following sections and tables in this Briefing look at the White/BME (in this context BME includes Black African, Black Caribbean, Black Other, Indian, Pakistani, Bangladeshi, Other Asian, Chinese, Mixed and Other groups) split in the population in the selected areas, followed by a more detailed table of ethnic groups. This is followed by a table on religion in districts in England and Wales only, because of the different nature of the religion questions in Scotland and Northern Ireland. The next section looks specifically at ethnic group of young people in the selected districts in England and Wales and government population projections for young people.

The final set of tables, Tables 6 to 26, give national rankings for individual ethnic groups and religions. Each double page spread includes a table giving the percentage of a particular ethnic group or religion in the population plus a facing table giving the numbers of the same group for the top ten per cent of local authority districts in England. This actually means that each table gives the top ranked 35 local authority districts out of the 354 local authority districts in England. The percentages are often more informative than the actual numbers, because larger areas, such as Birmingham, have larger numbers in many groups simply because they are bigger areas. Birmingham is the largest local authority district in England, with the Census giving a population of almost a million people.

Ethnic group by district - White British/BME

Nationally nearly nine per cent of residents are from a Black or Minority Ethnic group. Of the areas selected above 18 of the 22 metropolitan areas are above the national average. Liverpool, Leeds, Bristol and Sheffield are below the national average. Both Slough and Leicester have over 36 per cent of residents who are from a Black or Minority Ethnic group. Birmingham, London and Luton also have over three times the national average of Black or Minority Ethnic residents.

Of the Shire counties Oadby and Wigston, Pendle, Preston and Oxford have more Black and Minority Ethnic residents than the national average.

Ethnic group by district - detailed ethnic group

Table 2 gives the detailed ethnic group breakdown, and shows the differences between areas.

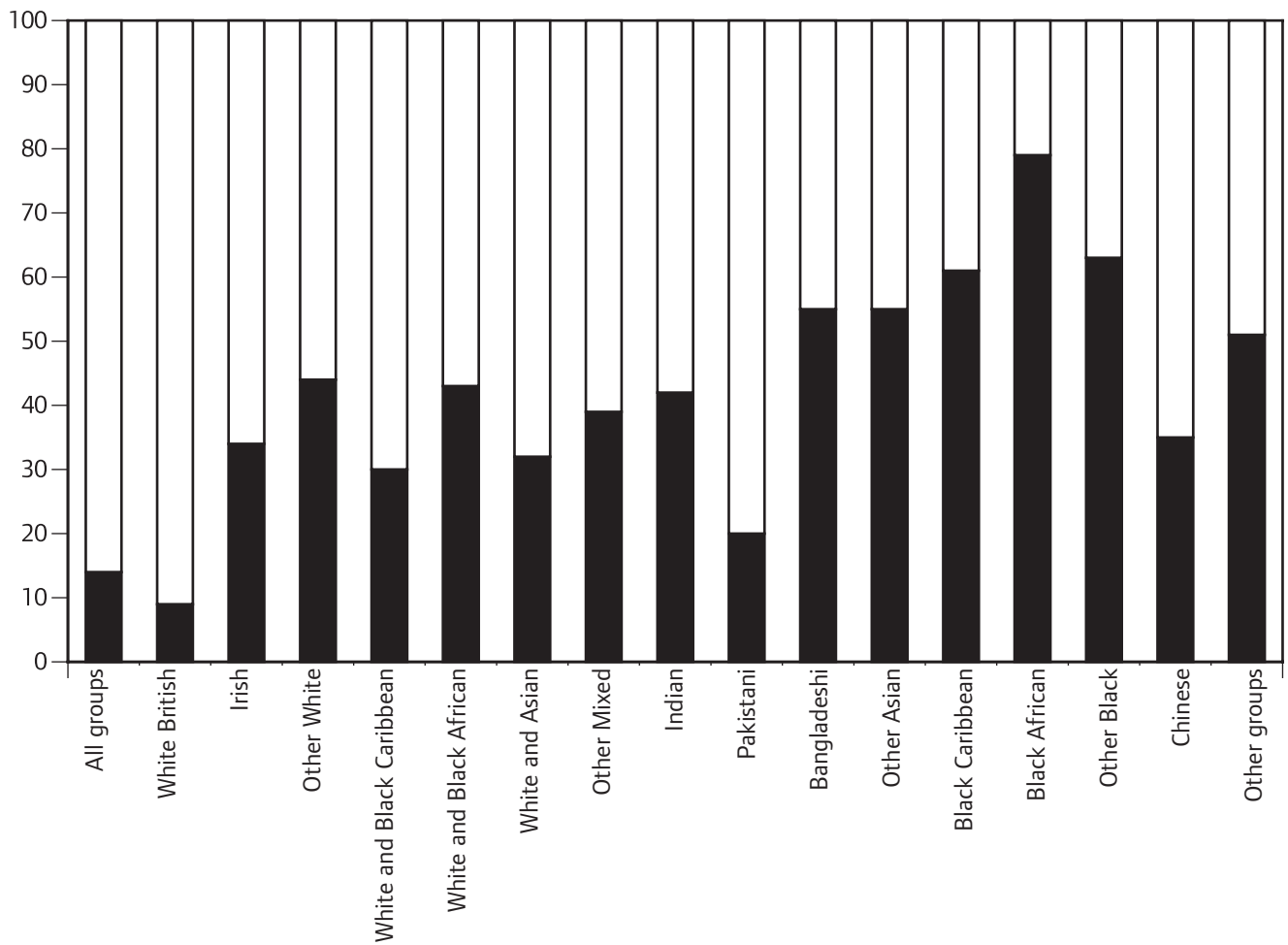
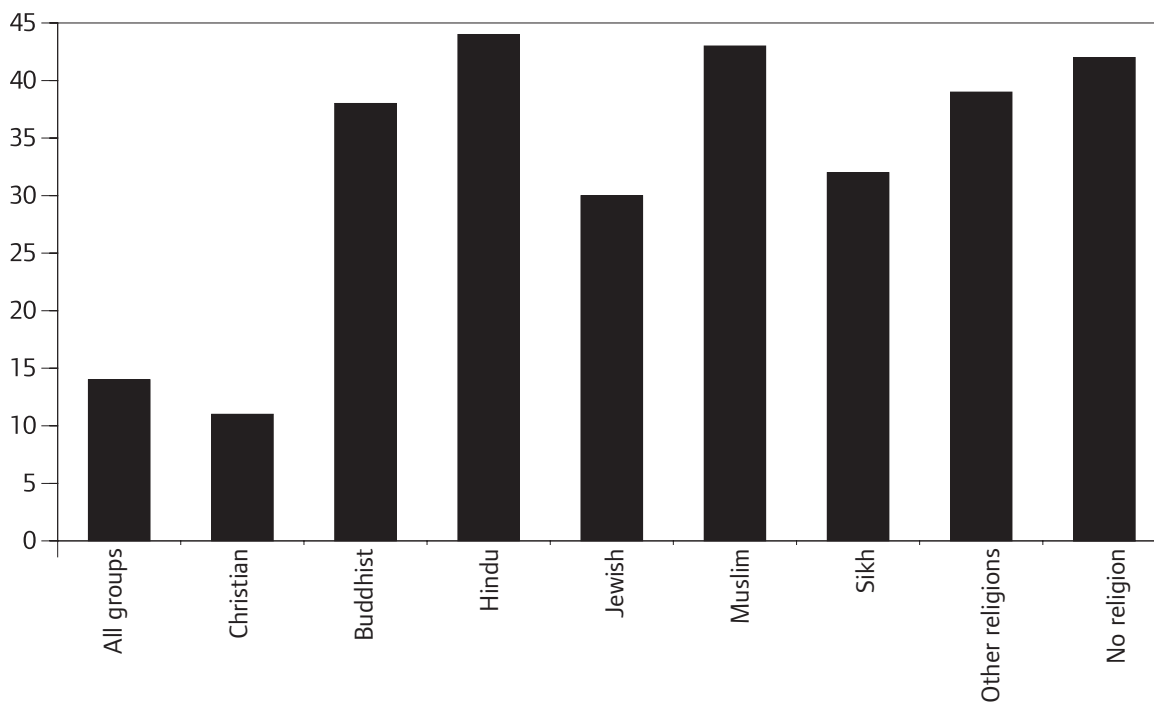


Figure 2 Percentage of religious group living in London, 2001

Figures 1 and 2 give the proportions of each group living in London for ethnic group and religion. Some groups, for example, Black African, are heavily concentrated in London while others, such as Pakistani, are particularly concentrated elsewhere.

Figure 1 Percentage of ethnic group living in London, 2001

Ethnic Group of residents aged 0-16, 2001

Table 3 gives the ethnic breakdown of people aged 0-16 in 2001.

The highest percentage of children classified as mixed White and Black Caribbean aged 0 to 16, are in Nottingham (six per cent), followed by Wolverhampton (five per cent), this compares to an England average of just over one per cent.

The highest percentage of Indian residents aged 0 to 16 can be found in Leicester at 30 per cent, followed by Slough and Blackburn and Darwen at 15 percent, the national average was just over two per cent. Wolverhampton (14 per cent) and Sandwell (11 per cent), both in the west midlands, are the only other two metropolitan areas with Indian residents accounting for more than ten per cent of the population.

In England three per cent of residents aged 0 to 16 are Pakistani, Bradford has the highest concentration at 24 per cent. Six other metropolitan areas have between 11 and 18 per cent of residents who are Pakistani.

Bangladeshi are the fastest growing ethnic group aged 0 to 16, relatively small at a national level accounting for just over one per cent of residents. The largest percentages of young Bangladeshi residents are in Oldham (nine per cent), Luton (seven per cent), London and Birmingham (four per cent).

A little over one per cent of England residents aged 0 to 16 are Black Caribbean. London and Birmingham have the highest concentration at five per cent. Almost four per cent of Wolverhampton, Luton and Nottingham residents aged 0 to 16 are Black Caribbean.

The Black African population aged 0 to 16 is largest in London at over eight per cent, this compares to a national average of less than two per cent.

The shire counties

Less than two per cent of England residents aged 0 to 16 classified their ethnicity as Other White. Over 23 per cent of those aged 0 to 16 in Forest Heath are Other White. This seems to confirm the notion that as well as there being two large American air force bases in this shire county their families also live there.

Oadby and Wigston and Preston are home to the largest percentage of Indians aged 0 to 16 in shire counties at 17 and 12 per cent respectively.

Almost one in four residents aged 0 to 16 in Pendle are Pakistani the highest concentration of Pakistani's outside Bradford.

The shire with the highest percentage of Bangladeshis aged 0 to 16 is Burnley at three per cent.

Projections of young people aged 0-19 and 0-24

The Office for National Statistics (ONS) does not currently produce black and minority ethnic population projections. Table 4 shows the current ONS projections by age alone, the figures relate to 1996-based sub national projections, these do not incorporate the latest data for both internal / international migration nor the 2001 Census. As such the actual figures should be used with caution.

In areas where the percentage of black and minority ethnic residents aged 0-19 is above the national average it is possible to assume this will continue for the next 10-15 years. A greater proportion of black and minority ethnic residents are within reproductive age groups (15-49 years of age), their age structure is considerably lower and their fertility rates are higher than the national average. This means that for the foreseeable future this younger population will continue to represent a greater percentage of all young people in the population.

Religion

Table 5 gives the population by religion. It shows the high proportions of Hindus and Sikhs in Leicester, Muslims in Blackburn, Bradford, Birmingham, Luton, Slough and Oldham.
