2001 Census data available

Most of the Standard Area Statistics have now been published and circulated. A small number of tables are still missing from the standard datasets and will be published in a supplementary report to the National Report. They are mainly tables which include data on migration or workplace. Other data still to come includes data on parishes, postcodes, the Special Workplace and Special Migration Statistics and commissioned tables. Datasets have been re-released at various times, so if we have sent you replacement files, for example with SASPAC 7, then those should replace the earlier versions. A list of reported errors, re-produced from the ONS website, is in Appendix 1. A fuller list of missing tables is in CIN 2003-4.

Commissioned tables

The first set of tables, commissioned by other people, have been received. At the moment most are in the form of Excel spreadsheets, 500 megabytes in total and a bit unmanageable. We are working on converting them into SASPAC system files. The first three tables, commissioned by editors of the ONS 'Focus on..' series of publications (previously known as the Multi-source topic reports) are now available for all wards in England and Wales as SASPAC system files. The first three tables are housing related, and copies of the system and framework files, plus the cell numbering layouts are on the CD distributed at the Census Users' Group Meeting held on 11th December 2003.

Details of the topics covered and the area levels for which all these tables are available are in CIN 2003-4.

Census Analysis

A number of Briefings have been published recently. All Briefings produced during 2003 are now available as pdf files on a CD, which was distributed at the Census Users' Group Meeting of 11th December. At least one printed copy has been made available to members of the consortium, further copies of some reports are available on request. Extranet

The GLA's extranet is available to all registered users. Registration forms were issued at an earlier Census Users' Group Meetings and included in earlier Census Information Notes. Anyone else who wants access to the extranet should contact Michael Minors, Data Management and Analysis, 5th Floor, City Hall, The Queen's Walk, London SE1 2AA.

SASPAC

Version 7 along with all the data currently available was distributed in November as 4 CDs. This was a full release of the data, duplicating some datasets already distributed, but for the sake of ensuring the availability of a consistent dataset it was decided to follow this route rather than distributing only those datasets that had been amended or updated.

A few errors have been found in the data for areas in the North West and West Midlands. The system files have been corrected and will shortly be made available for downloading from the SASPAC website.

We shall also be placing User Guidance Notes on the SASPAC website to guide users through various processes within SASPAC and to provide answers to frequently asked questions.

The next version of SASPAC will be version 7.5 and this will be developed to cater for the requirements of the Origin/Destination datasets. However, as we still have no indication from the Census Offices as to when these are likely to be available, the date for version 7.5 is distinctly unsettled.

Training

SASPAC and Census training sessions are run by Bill Armstrong and are available to all members of the consortium. The next sessions are to be held from 16 February to 5 March 2004, followed by 14 June to 2 July 2004.

All bookings should be made through Bill Armstrong. He will circulate the details for each session when he is starting to take bookings. If you do not hear from him directly at that time

please contact him via e-mail. If more than 2 people from an authority want to attend we expect the main Census Contact in that authority to determine which 2 should attend.

Census Users' Group Meetings

The next meeting is being held at 2pm on Thursday 4 March 2004 in Committee Room 5 at City Hall. The minutes of the last 2 meetings, held on 26 June and 9 September 2003, are in Appendix 3.

Please check that we have the right person listed and that the e-mail address is correct. We also have a wider circulation list for the Census Information Notes, so if you know of anyone else in your authority who would like to receive them please let us have their e-mail address.

Unprocessed forms

Details ONS have identified a small number of electoral wards (16) throughout the country for which a significant cluster of Census forms were not processed. There are 3,000 unprocessed forms in total covering an estimated 7,000 people across the whole of England and Wales.

The 16 local authorities affected are:

Halton; Kettering; Camden; Southwark; Croydon; Bromley; Lewisham; Barnet; Leeds; Manchester; Southampton; Gosport; Basingstoke and Deane; Swansea; Isle of Anglesey; and Ceredigion.

With one exception (Amlwch Port in Anglesey), the impact on any single local authority level count is less than 0.4 per cent and at electoral ward level it is less than 9 per cent. This is within the stated confidence limits already issued for the Census counts for these authorities.

The Census results for these areas will not be revised to take account of these unprocessed forms.

Key Statistics for health areas in England and Wales

Details Errors in the geographical constitutions used to produce the Key Statistics resulted in release of incorrect figures for all tables for the following PCTs: Eastern Hull, West Hull, North Stoke, South Stoke, North Lincolnshire, North East Lincolnshire, and West Lincolnshire. Swindon PCT was also wrongly allocated in the Report to the Thames Valley SHA instead of to the Avon, Gloucestershire and Wiltshire SHA. *This data has been re-released.*

Table UV68 Details Footnote markers missing from table.

Markers should relate footnote 2 to row 'Married couple household with dependent child(ren)', with subsequent footnotes relating to subsequent rows in turn.

Comments Footnotes are correctly marked on the CD accompanying the printed Report.

Appendix 3

Minutes of the Census Users Group meeting held on 26 June 2003

1. Minutes of meeting on 10th April 2003

The minutes were accepted as an accurate record of the meeting. There were no matters arising that were not covered by the agenda.

2. 2001 Census output timetable

Giorgio Finella (GF) ran through planned timetable for release of data, and advised that the GLA would aim to make the data available as SASPAC system files within one week of receipt. The SASPAC system files would be supplied to the members of the consortium on CD.

Standard Table 104, a cross-tabulation of ethnic group by religion, had now been released after being excluded from the original release of Standard Tables. It had been placed on the ONS Census website in the day or two prior to this meeting.

The Key Statistics for output areas, wards and higher geographical levels were due to be released on 30th June. Bill Armstrong (BA) noted that it is still unclear how much data would be released on that day, but the GLA hoped that SASPAC system files would be produced within a few days. Eileen Howes confirmed that some Key Statistics data would not be out until the autumn, in particular the tables on migration and workplace.

BA explained that some of the codes/boundaries in the output area boundary files for wards are incorrect, for example in Waltham Forest, and that other areas should be checked by BA in due course.

3. Data from previous Censuses

It was reported that, at the request of the boroughs, a great deal of work had been done in the last few years setting up a series of spreadsheets with tables giving as much comparable data with previous Censuses as was possible. For example there is a table giving housing tenure for households in London from 1961 to 2001 at borough level. A table giving persons present and, for later Censuses, usual residents gives borough level data from 1801 to 2001. These tables were all being placed on the extranet in the form of Excel files.

4. DMAG briefings and borough analysis

Gareth Piggott (GP) gave presentation based up the DMAG Briefing 2003/16 '2001 Key Statistics: Health Indicators'. He also talked about his current work on a briefing on Education and Qualifications.

There was some concern expressed about comparing levels of limiting long-term illness in the 1991 and 2001 Censuses. There had been a minor change in wording in the 2001 Census question which, along with the introduction of other health related questions, appears to have had a major impact on the figures. The result has been an apparent, and unexpected, huge increase in levels of limiting long-term illness. Boroughs were advised to treat the 1991/2001 comparison with caution.

There was a request from boroughs that GLA publications should be on Internet, as opposed to the Extranet site. In the short term this was not possible, as the site was not generally used to

disseminate data or publications in this way. The situation would be kept under review.

Boroughs were asked to suggest topics for inclusion in the series of Census briefings, if there were any topics they felt were being left out.

EH requested that boroughs continue to send copies of their own census analysis to the GLA.

5. Commissioned tables

It seems likely that ONS will make the commissioned table service available from around November this year. All commissioned tables will be subject to disclosure control scrutiny.

There had been a meeting with the Labour Market Division at ONS to discuss labour market related tables that might be commissioned. If a number of tables could be agreed with them then there would be no cost to users, as other divisions within ONS do not have to pay for commissioned tables. It had been felt by the CLIP Labour Market Sub Group that some commissioned cross-tabulations were necessary to reconcile the Census results with those from other ONS labour market related surveys and that ONS should therefore save users the costs involved.

Some commissioned tables were suggested:

'Other religion' to be broken down to the specific write in answers

Qualifications by country of birth

More detail on students to allow comparisons with 1991 age groups and for a range of other purposes

Country of birth to include Uganda

Migration by country of birth

Some age groups such as Sure start (0-3 years) and ideally individual ages would be useful, although disclosure issues could come into play

6. SASPAC update

Hywel Davies (HD) gave a presentation of SASPAC 6.22 and added that SASPAC 6.5, which will allow searching on the Standard Tables and Key Statistics table frameworks, would be available in mid-July. Version 6.5 will not allow searching of the Census Area Statistics table frameworks because the final versions of the table layouts were not yet available. This would come with version 7.0. September is the target date for SASPAC 7.0.

There was some demand for a SASPAC manual in printed form. This was being resisted on cost grounds but would prove very popular with users.

Some users reported problems with HTML functionality in SASPAC 6.21, whereas others had not experienced any problems.

7. Training

There are some places still available on the September SASPAC training courses. BA will circulate a list of dates.

Double geography courses are likely to be held in February or March 2004 depending upon when this data is published. There is a strong demand for this training.

BA said that he is running 3 types of courses. They are:

A half-day course for experienced people wanting to see latest version

A one-day course for people with experience but wanting a refresher

A one-and-a-half-day course for people with no experience in using SASPAC

HD also mentioned his SAPAC training sessions which are offered to SASPAC users in the rest of the country (and for which there is a charge). He advised that members of the consortium continue with the GLA courses.

There was a request to put training notes on the extranet, but BA said that a manual does not always show important parts of the data very well. He is willing to email notes to people he knows have sound prior knowledge, and who he can also speak to briefly on the telephone.

8. Any other business

Boroughs asked whether the laptops should have come with CDs of Microsoft Office. This would be checked.

EH added that the contact details of people who signed for the laptops will be sent out shortly by the GLA IT department to the hardware warranty provider. The GLA has purchased a three year hardware warranty for the laptops.

9. Next meeting

The next meeting will be held on Tuesday 9th September 2003

Minutes of the Census Users Group meeting held on 9 September 2003

Item 1 Minutes from last meeting

There were no matters arising from last meeting

Item 2 2001 Census output timetable

EH ran through a summary of data releases since the last meeting and possible delays to the Census Area Statistics (CAS) at output area (OA) level due for release tomorrow, Wednesday 10th September. ONS publication dates are not necessarily delivery dates for users. The Welsh and North East data released on 28th August 2003 was delivered on Monday 8th September 2003.

ONS have re-released data at all levels due to some errors being identified. ONS have an error log on their website, which is not comprehensive. The GLA will compile a list of tables with errors encountered, this may not be comprehensive either.

Westminster discussed the outcome of the matching exercise conducted by Manchester Geomatics. Westminster claim that 27,000 additional households have been identified, this figure is likely to reduce to approximately 15,000 after duplicates are removed. A Westminster report is due for publication in the next few weeks.

Item 3 DMAG Briefing and borough analysis

EH gave a presentation on ethnicity, country of birth and religion. The maps used in the presentation will be placed on the census website. The briefing will be published shortly. The unemployment briefing will be ready by the end of November. Work on most the briefings has been suspended while the team helped process all the census data into SASPAC system files.

Item 4 Commissioned tables

Six specially commissioned table frameworks have been prepared and are being sent to ONS customer services. We will request information for all London boroughs, Reading and Slough at ward level, for tables relating to ethnicity and religion. If confidentiality issues are problematic we might ask for borough level or reduced information.

The GLA will ask ONS to provide costs for:

- 2001 data based on 91 or 94 wards.
- Producing tables for ad-hoc areas - the tables required were not specified.

The GLA will also report back with ONS timescales, the special workplace and migration tables will not be available before December 2003. Other workplace and migration tables will be available in October 2003.

The Home Office has sent 4 lists of specially commissioned tables to ONS based on Police Force Areas, no frameworks have been provided.

ODPM have commissioned SSA data from ONS, this data has not been provided yet.

Item 5 SASPAC update

Hywel Davies (HD) gave a presentation of SASPAC 6.5 features and the data distributed at the meeting. Documentation will follow shortly. HD asked users to let the GLA know of any faults and recommendation to be incorporated into the next version.
