Introduction

This report provides a summary of demographic and related data for each local authority in Greater London. The profiles are designed to provide an overview of the population in each area by combining a range of data on the population, the electorate, ethnic group populations, education statistics and labour force statistics. All data relate to people who live in the area (residence-based).

The section on data sources provides information about the source of each section of data. The appendices expand further on definitions and terminology used in this report.

The GLA's Data Management and Analysis Group (DMAG) have produced these profiles. The profiles will be updated on receipt of the 2001 Census data. Census 2001 data will update the most of the data presented here and is expected to be released in tranches between February and late summer 2003. Please note the section on population data for 2001 already incorporates Census 2001 data.

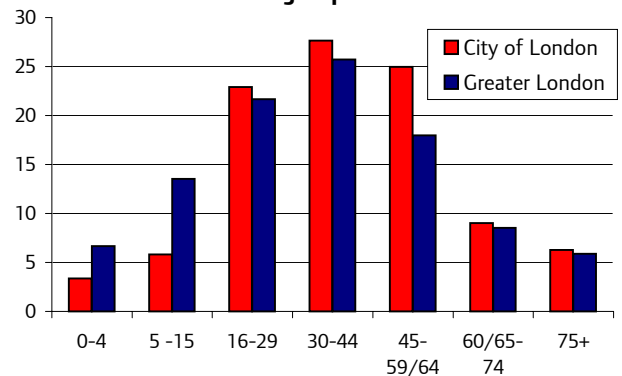

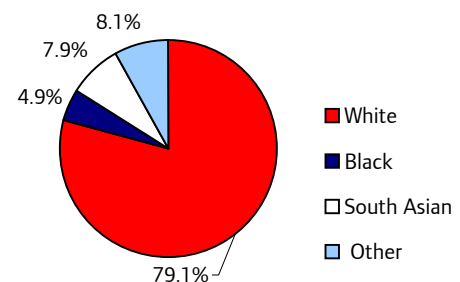

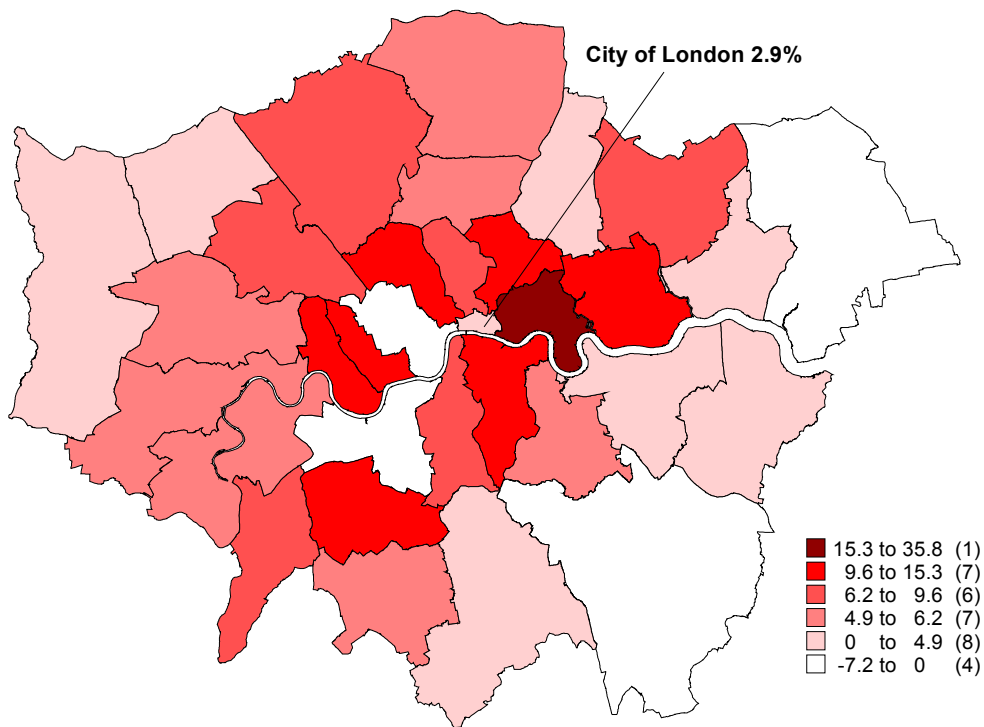

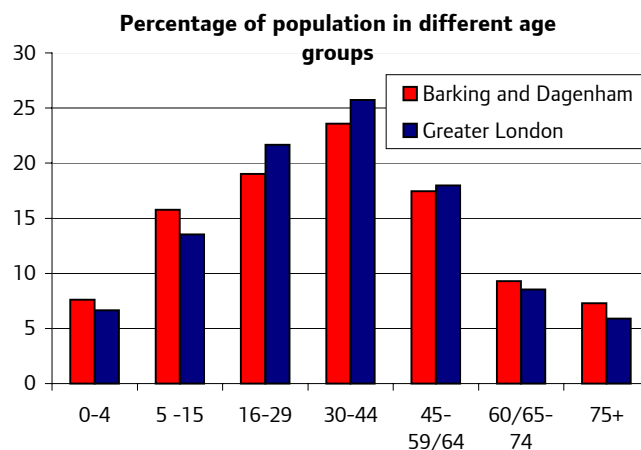

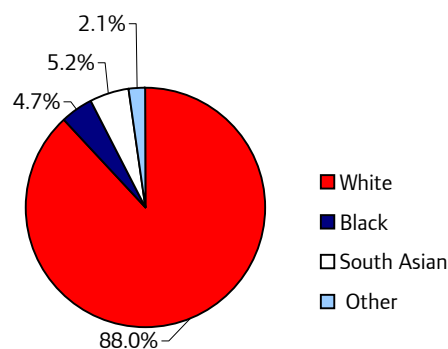

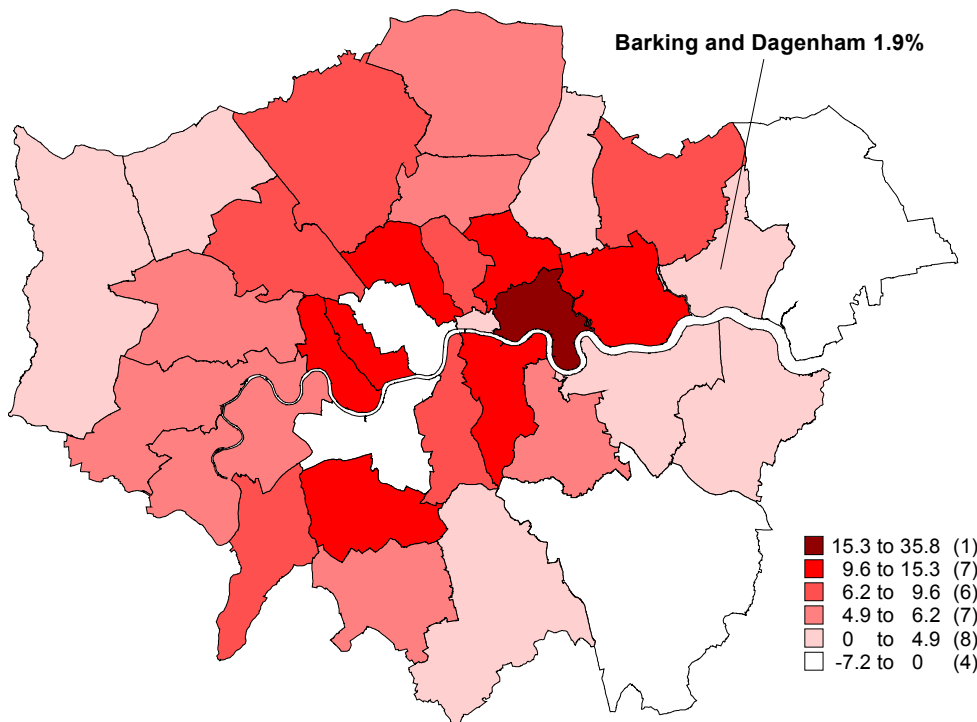

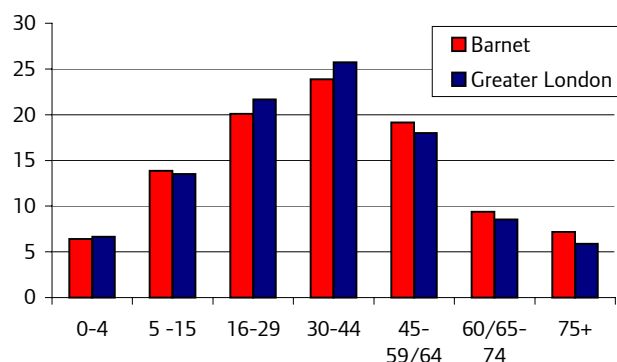

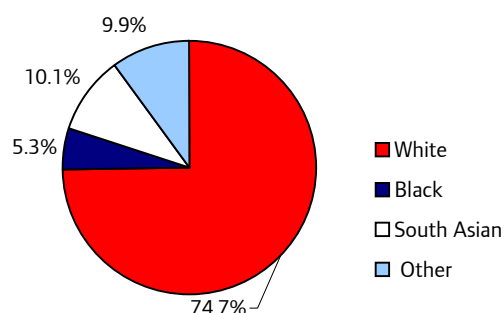

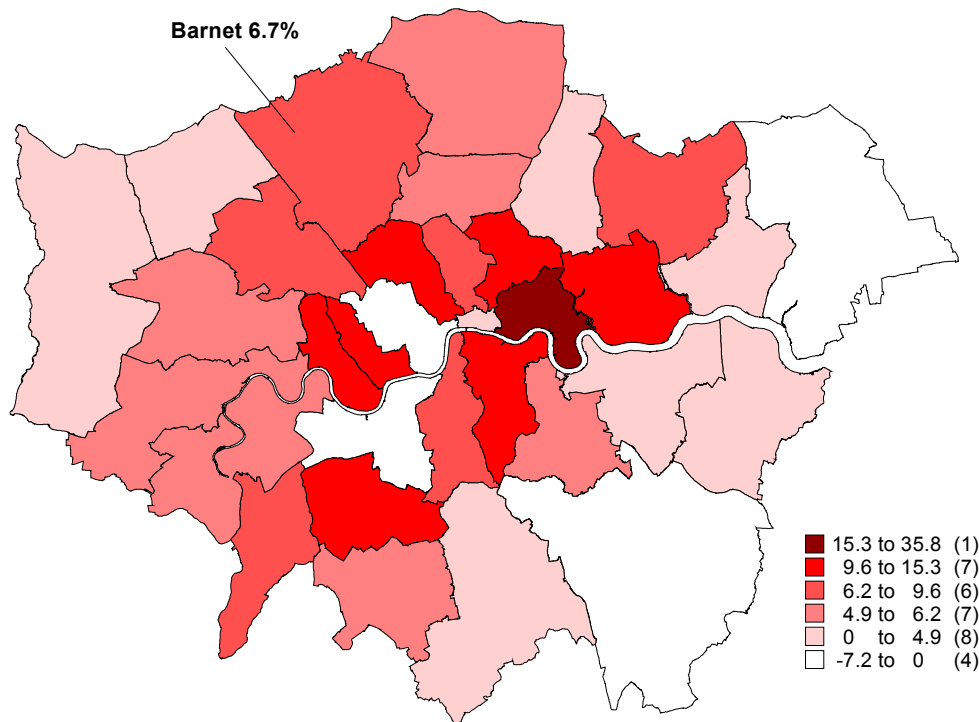

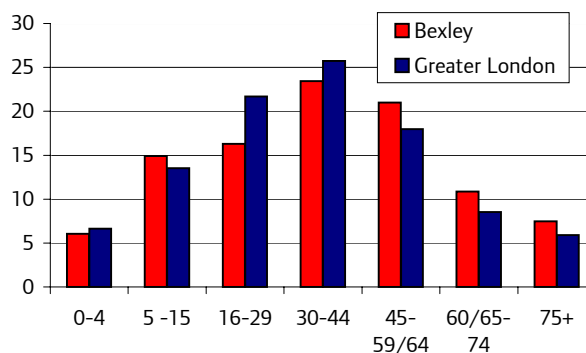

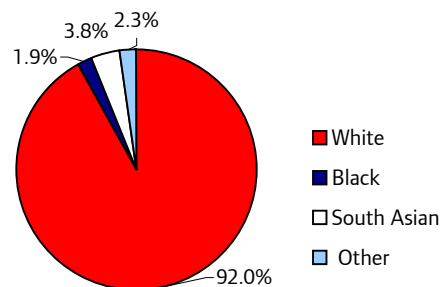

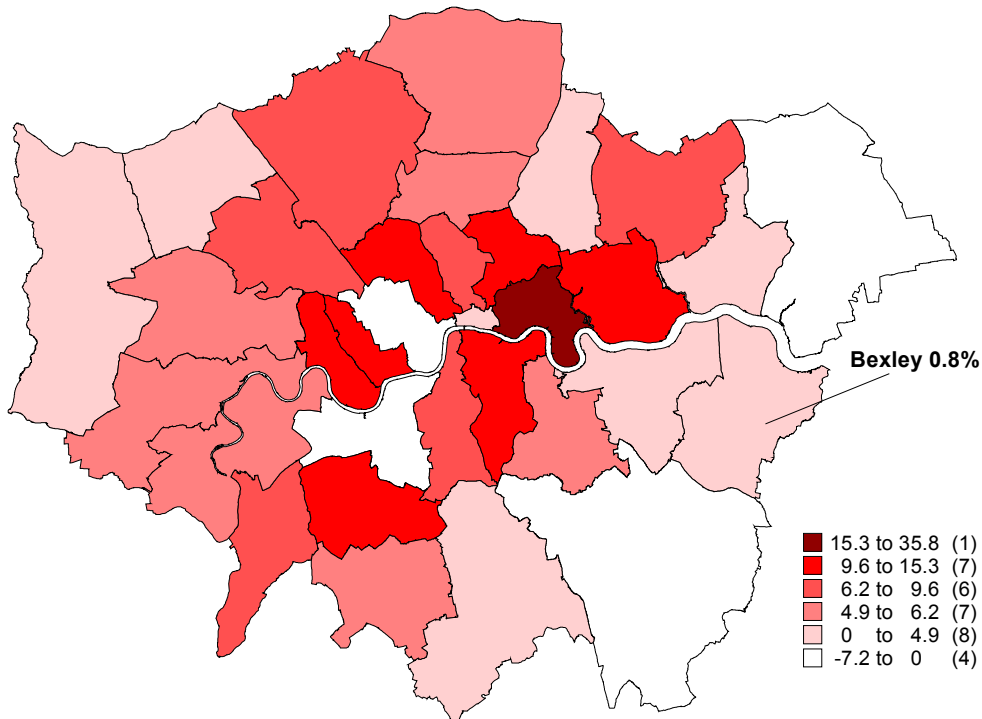

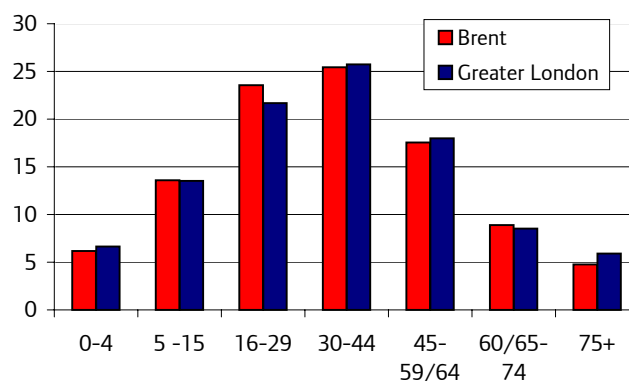

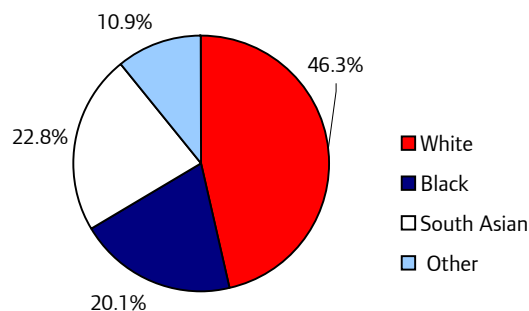

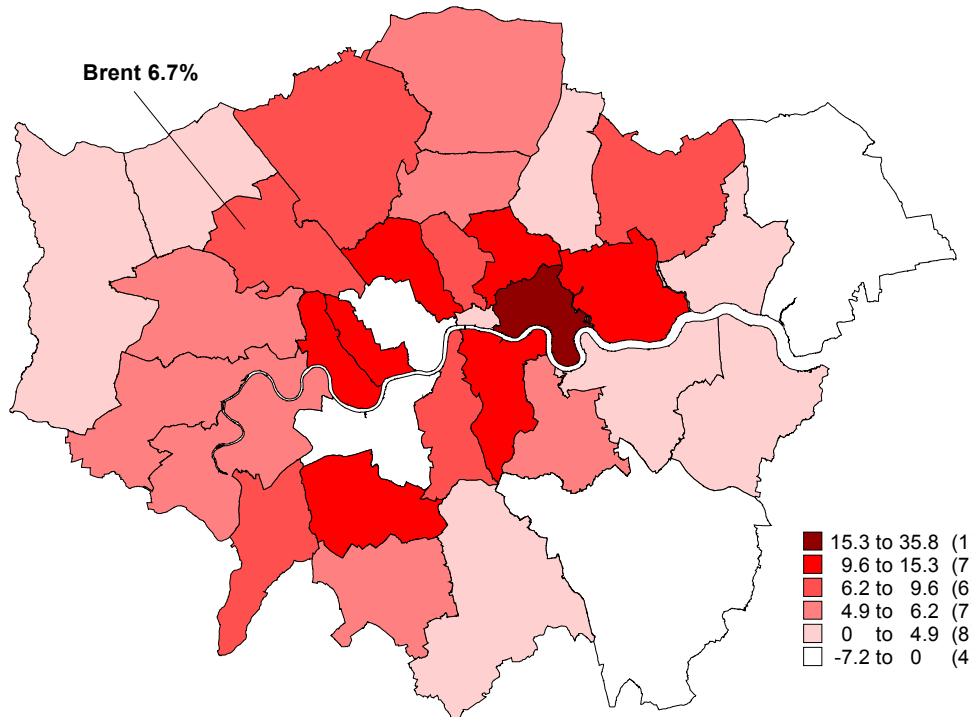

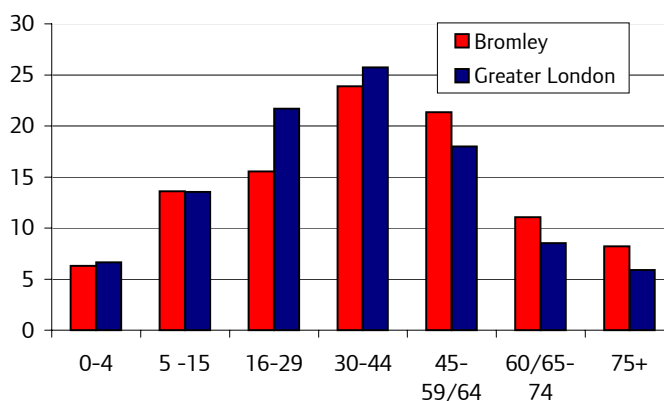

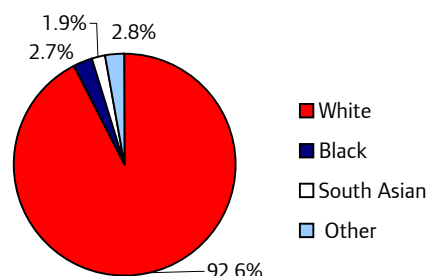

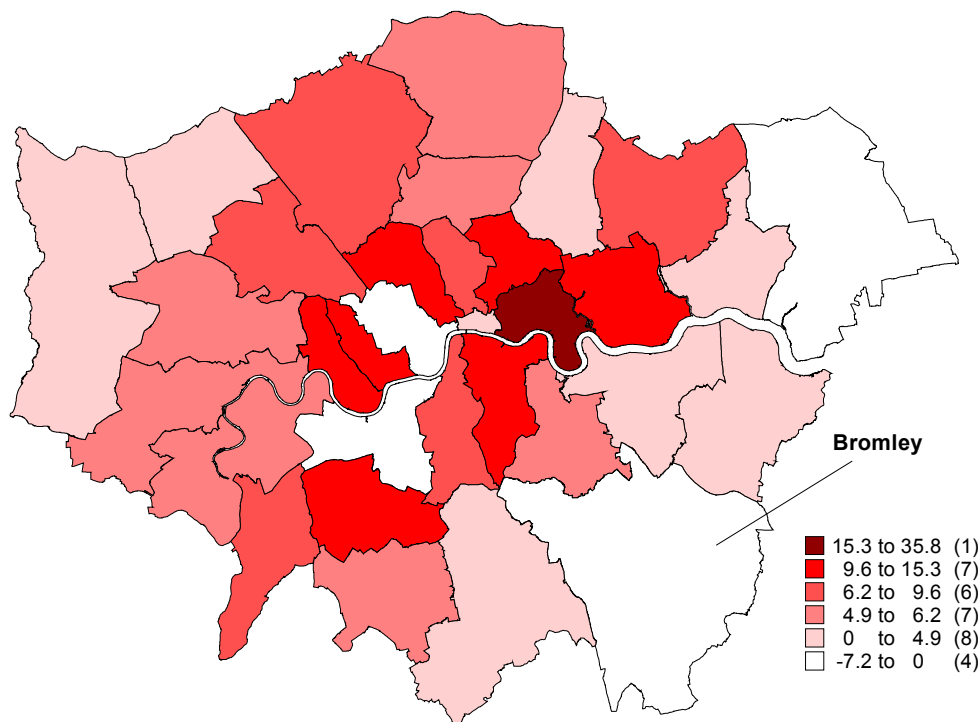

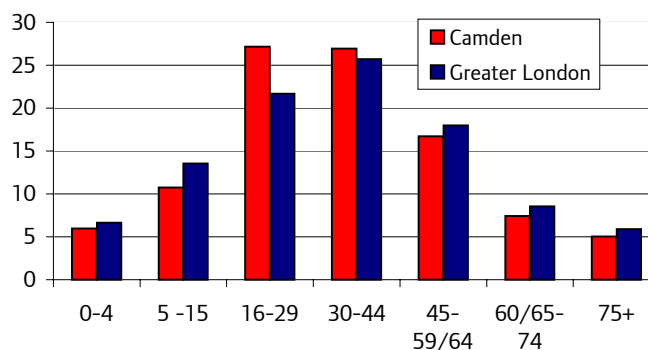

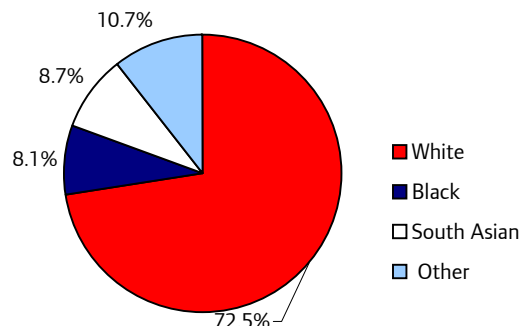

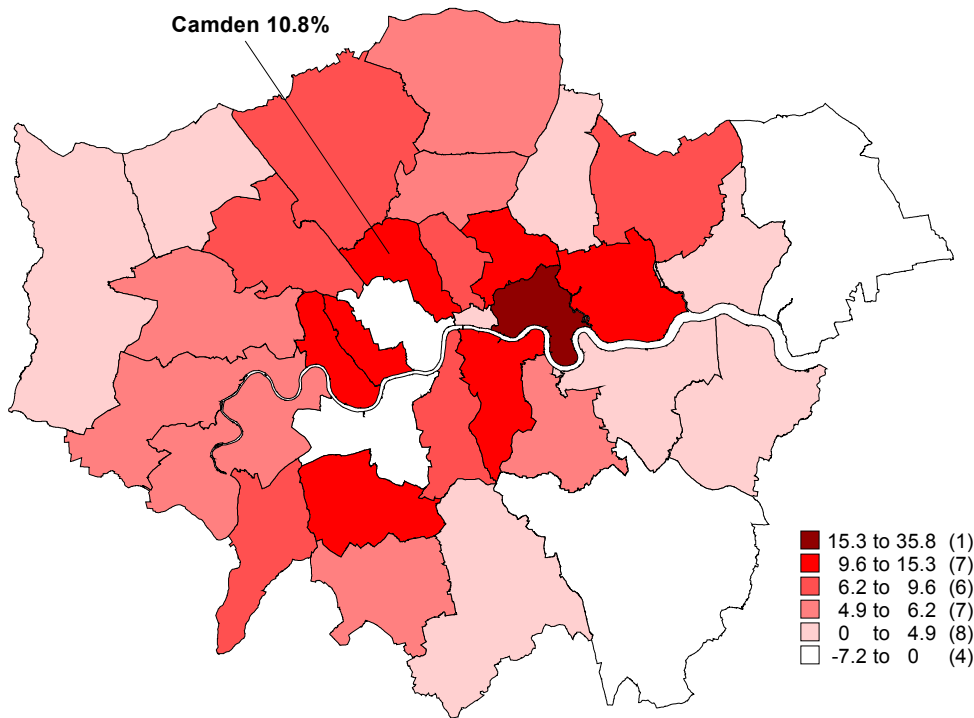

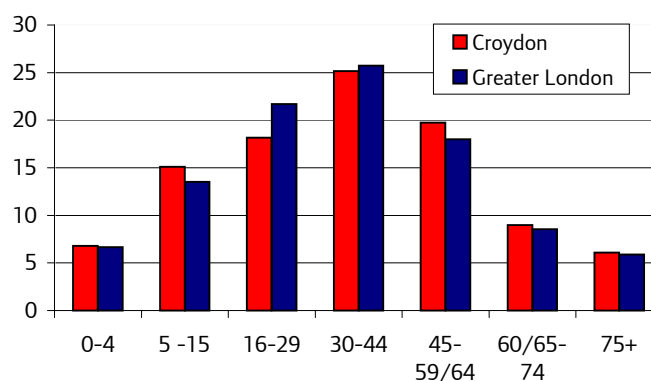

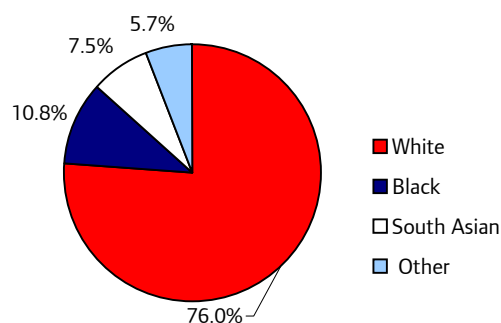

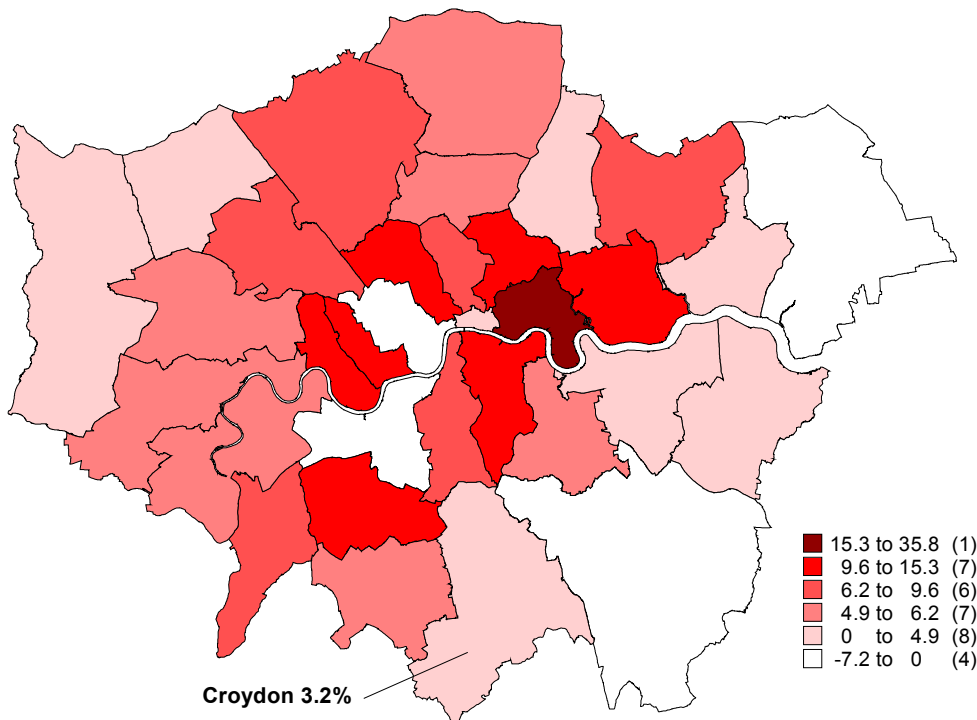

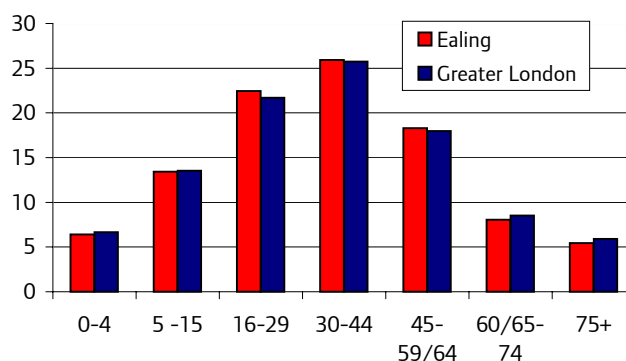

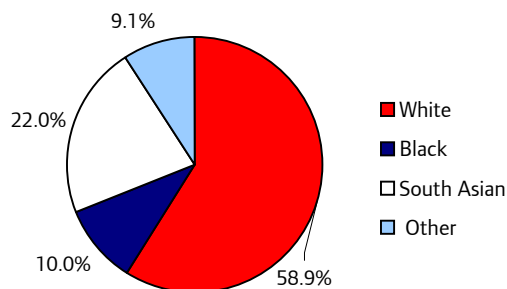

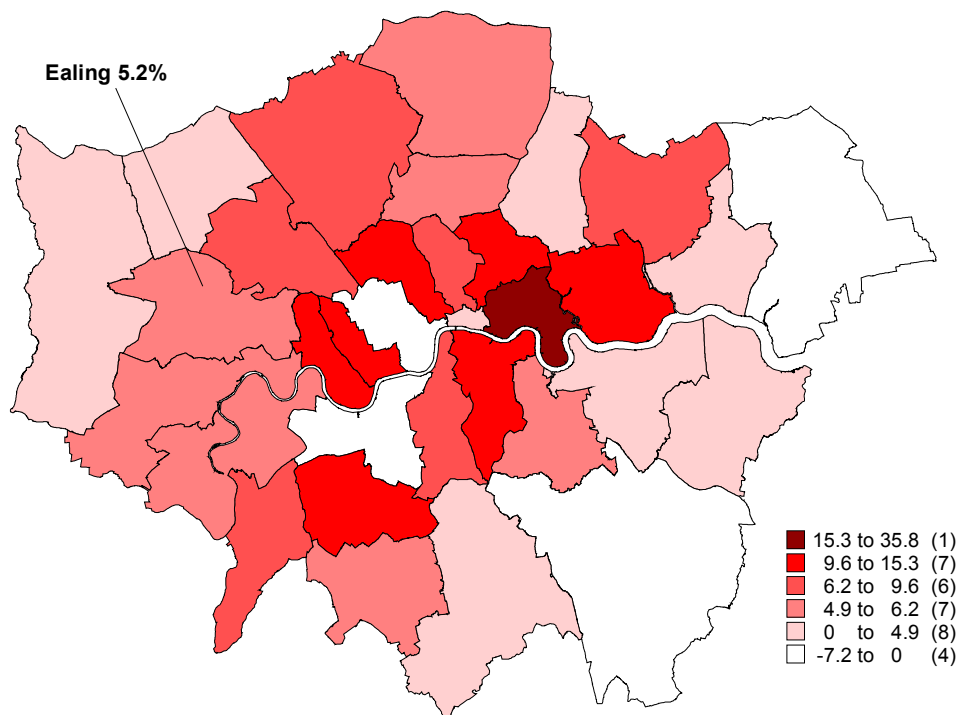

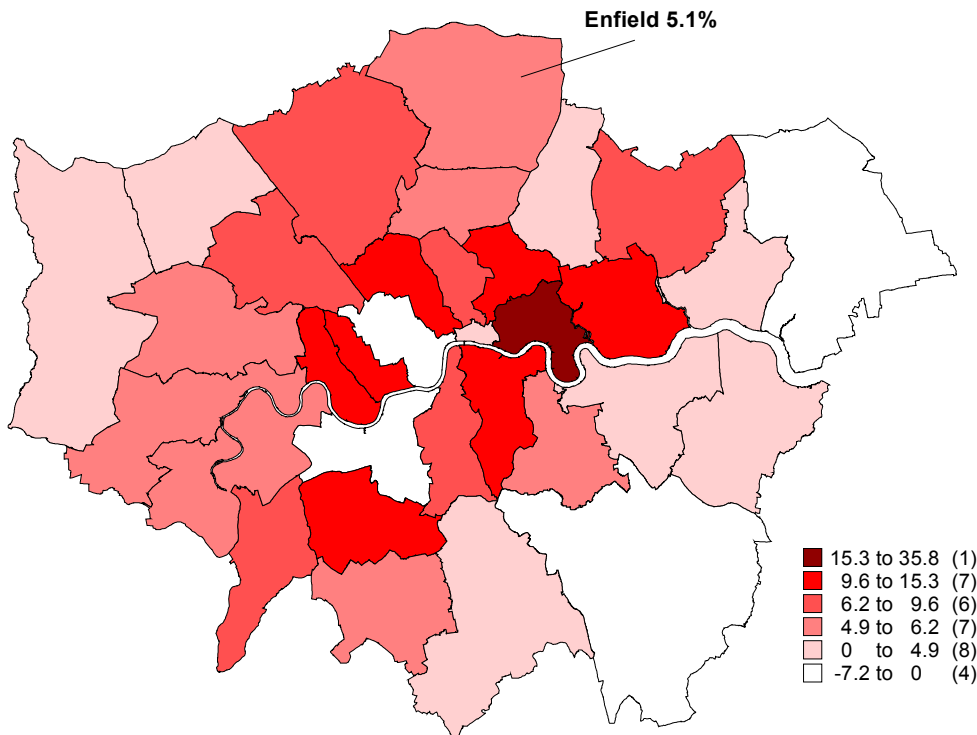

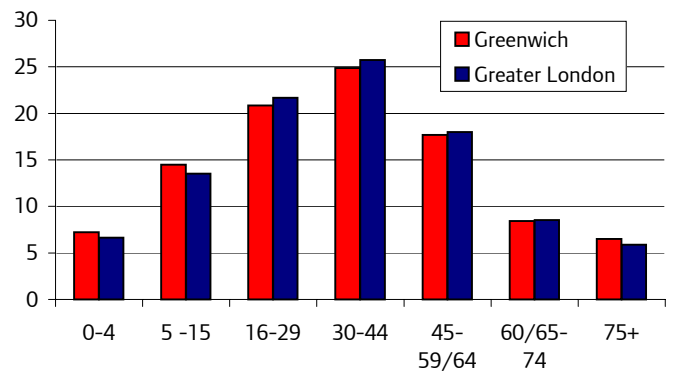

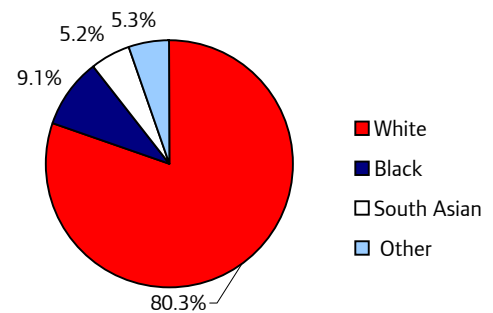

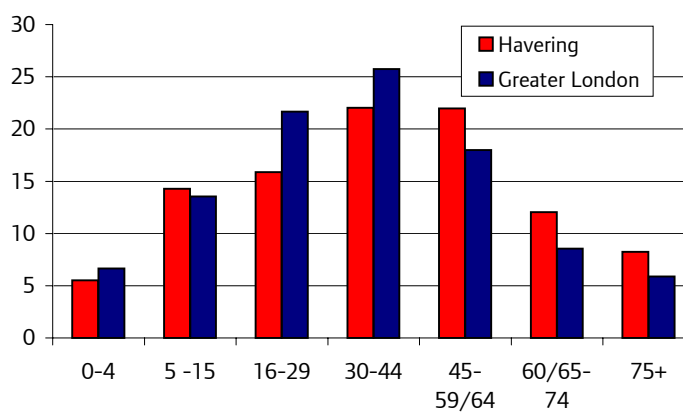

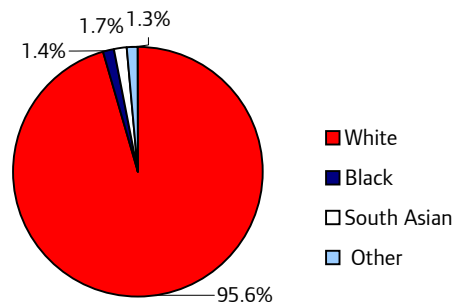

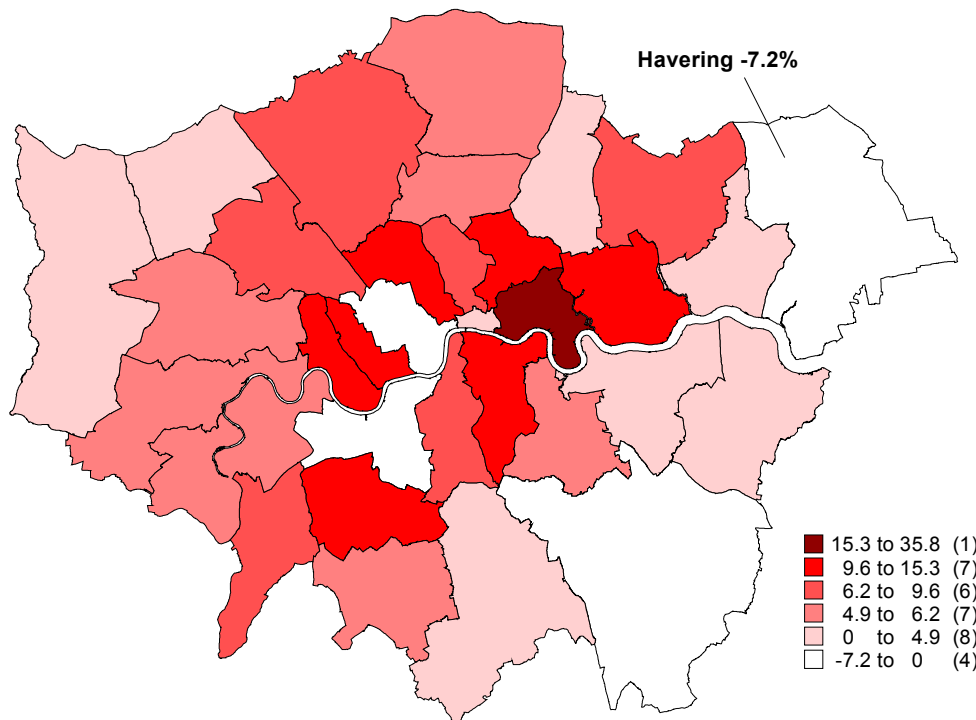

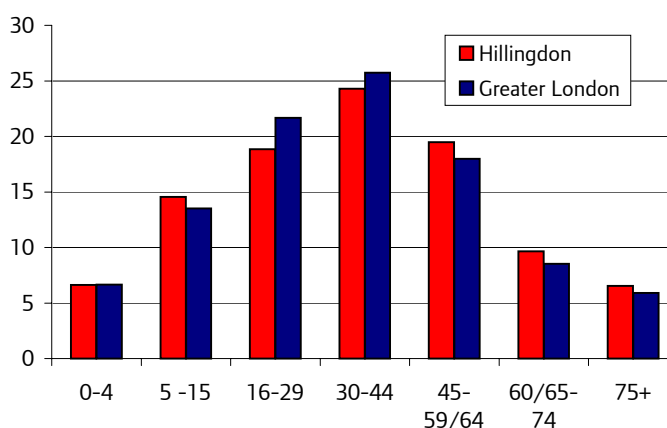

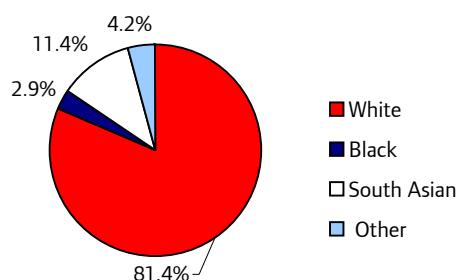

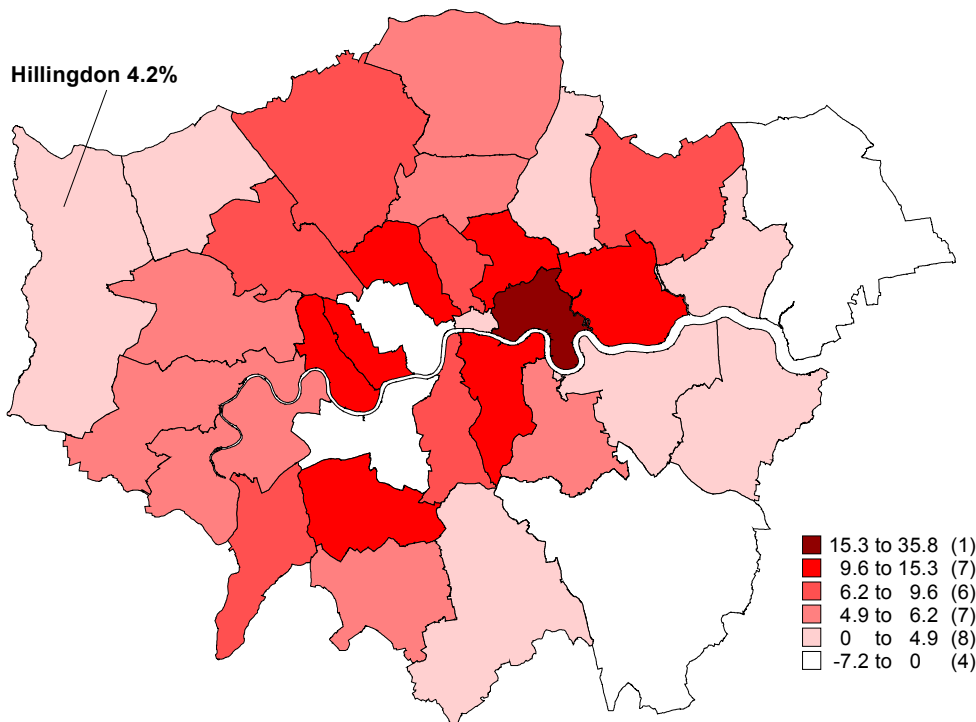

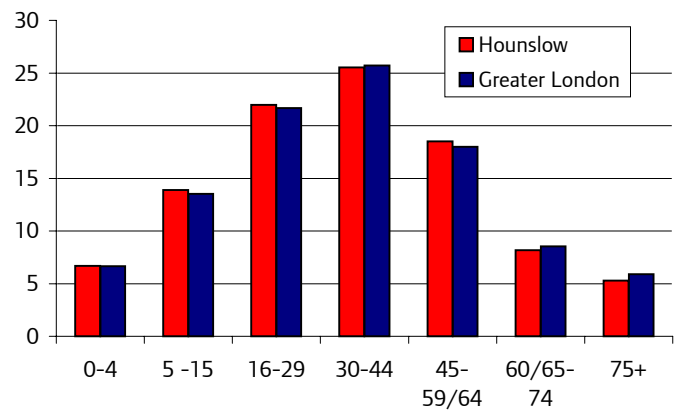

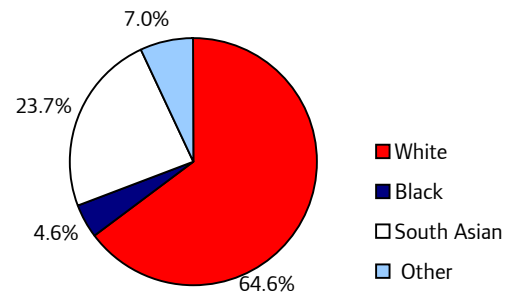

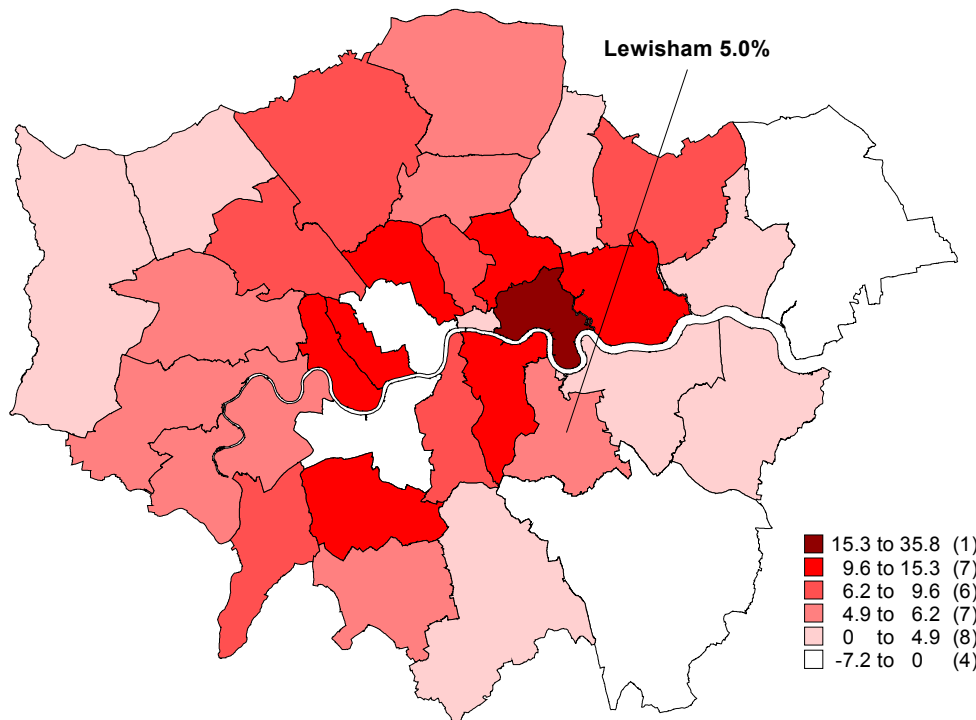

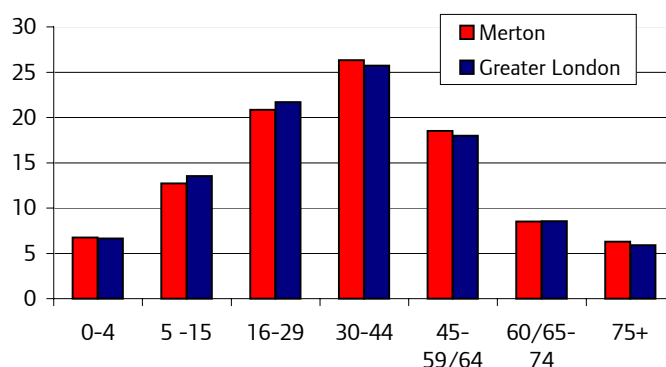

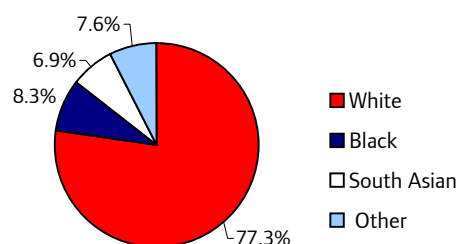

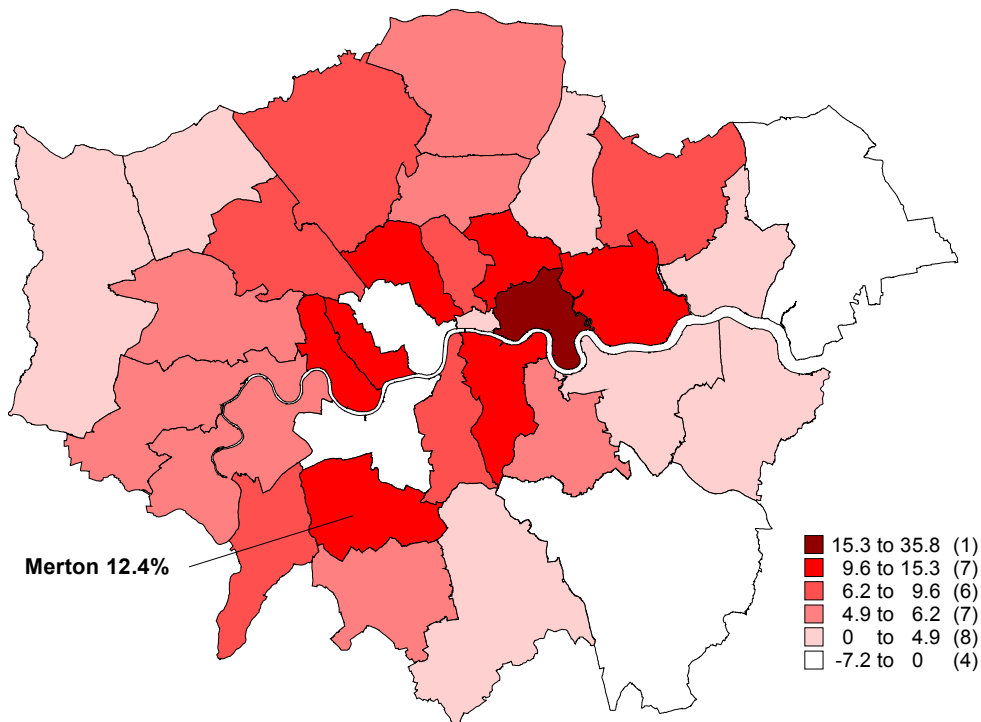

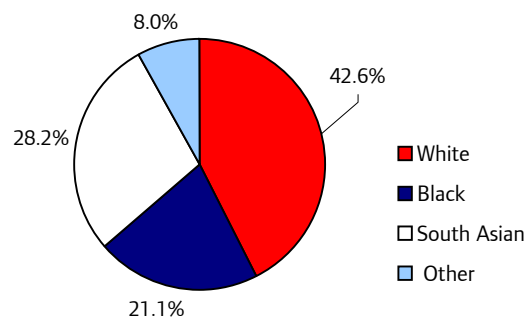

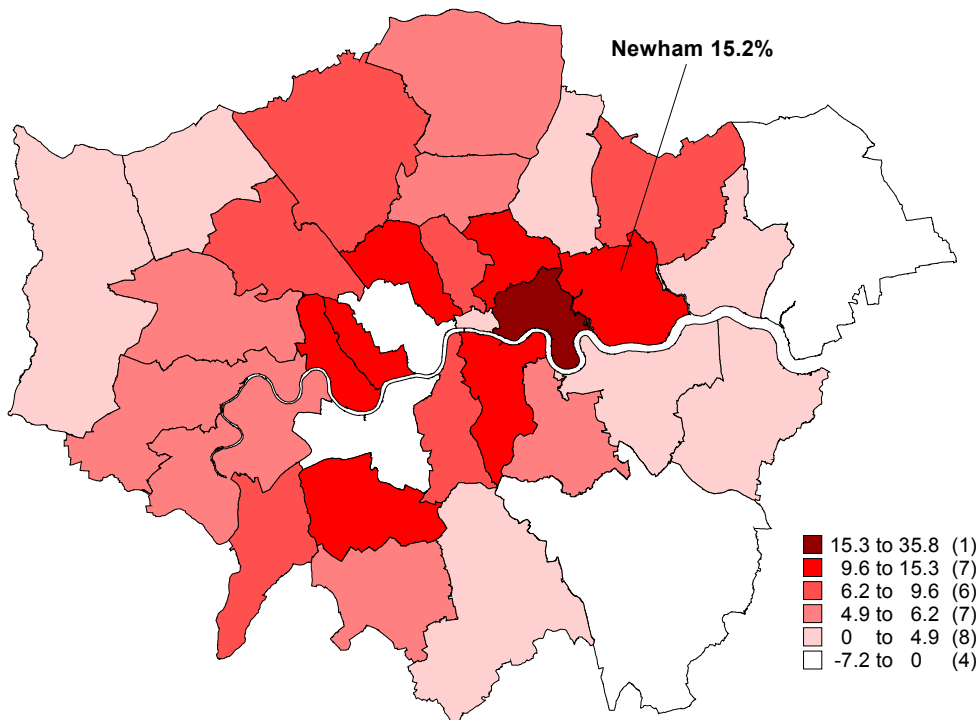

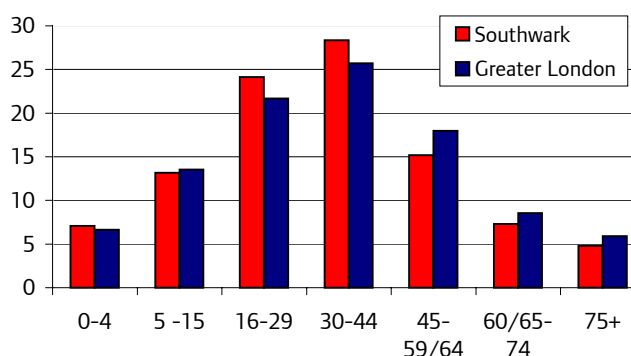

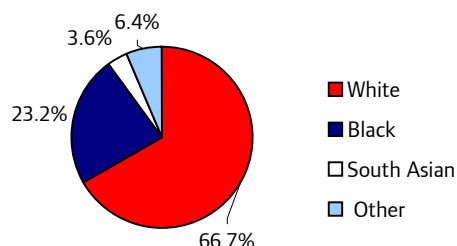

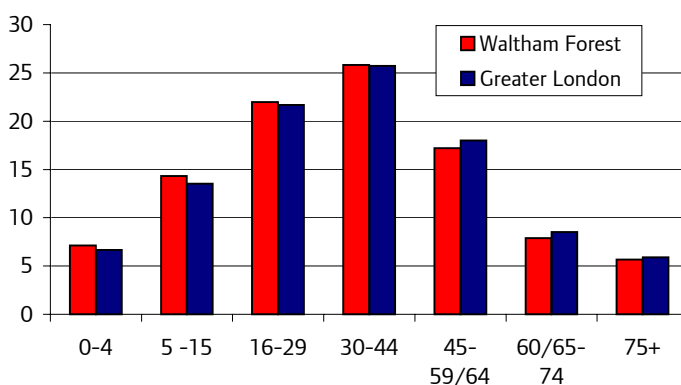

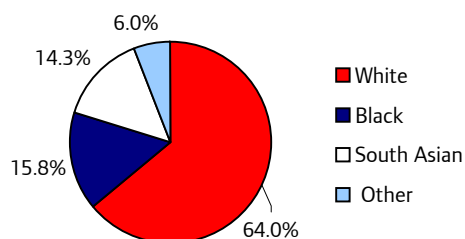

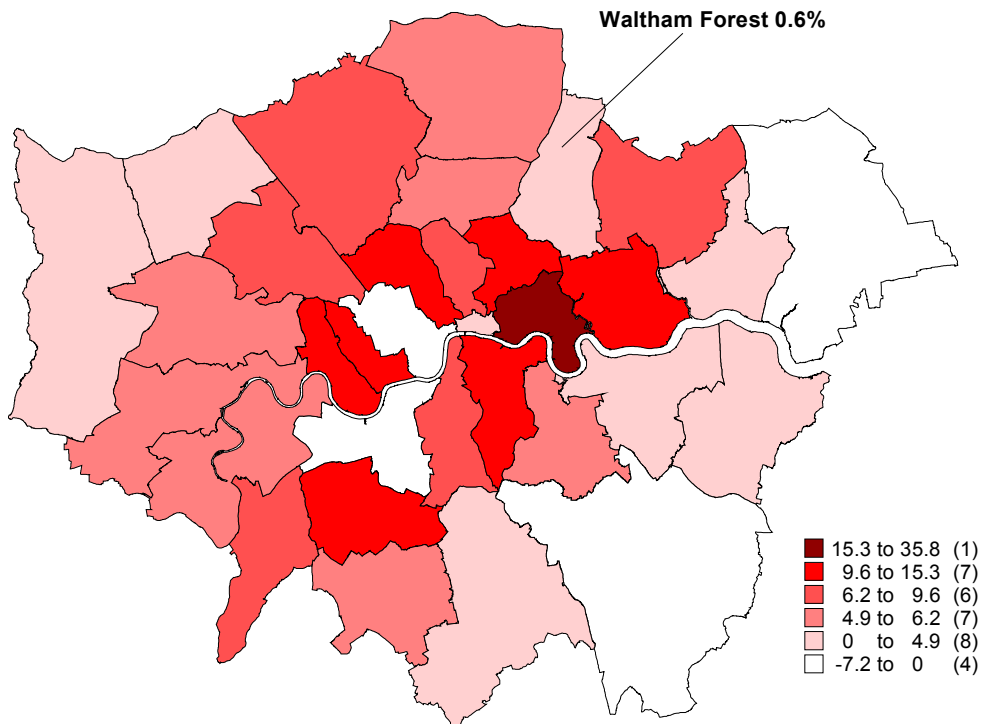

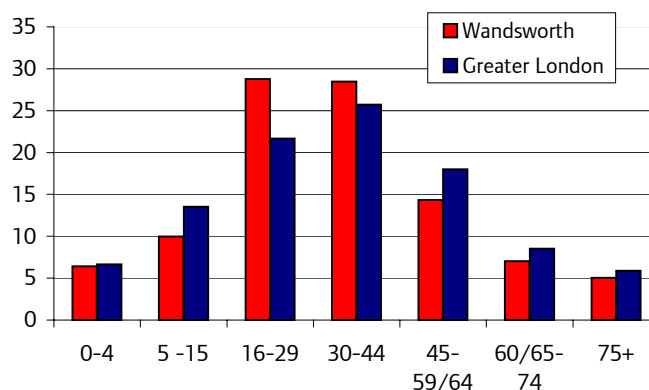

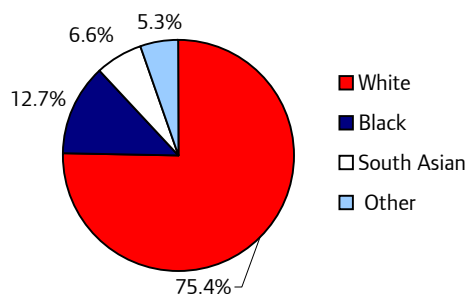

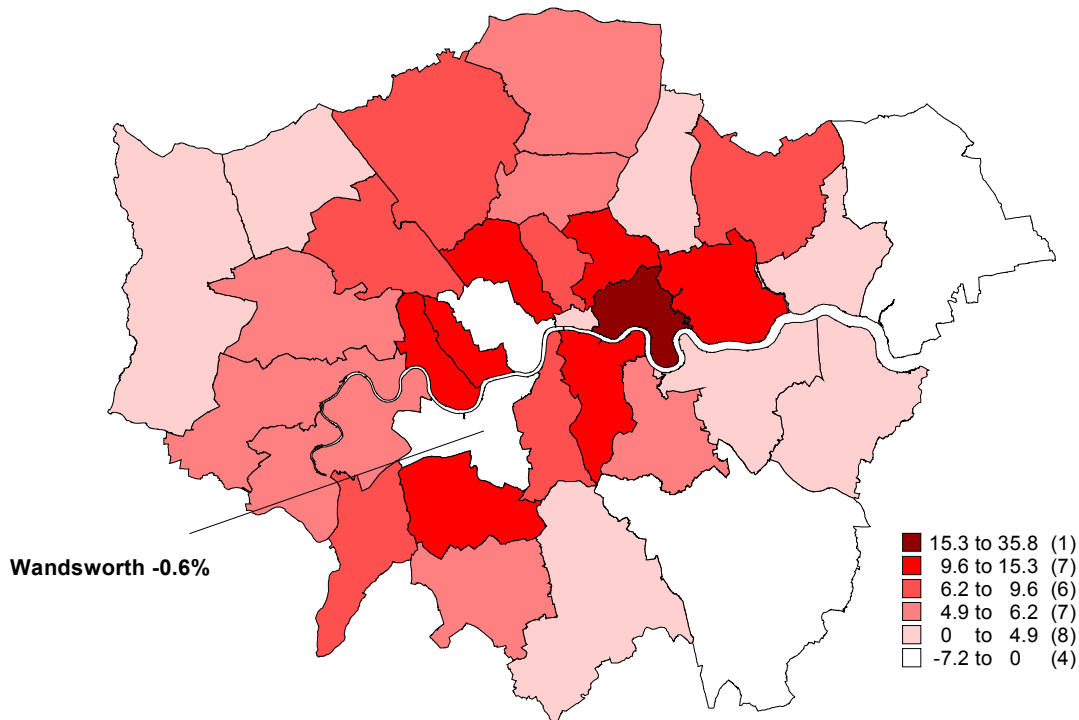

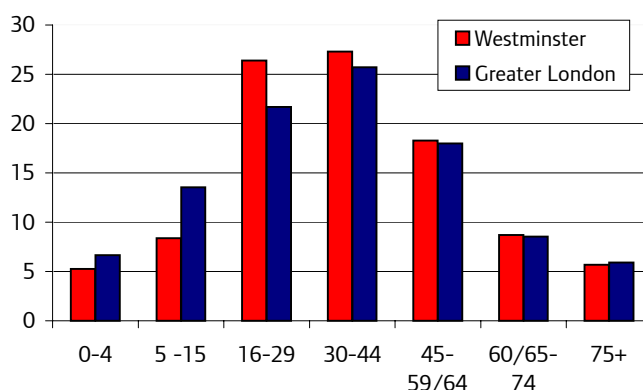

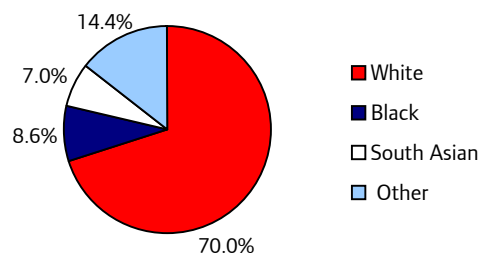

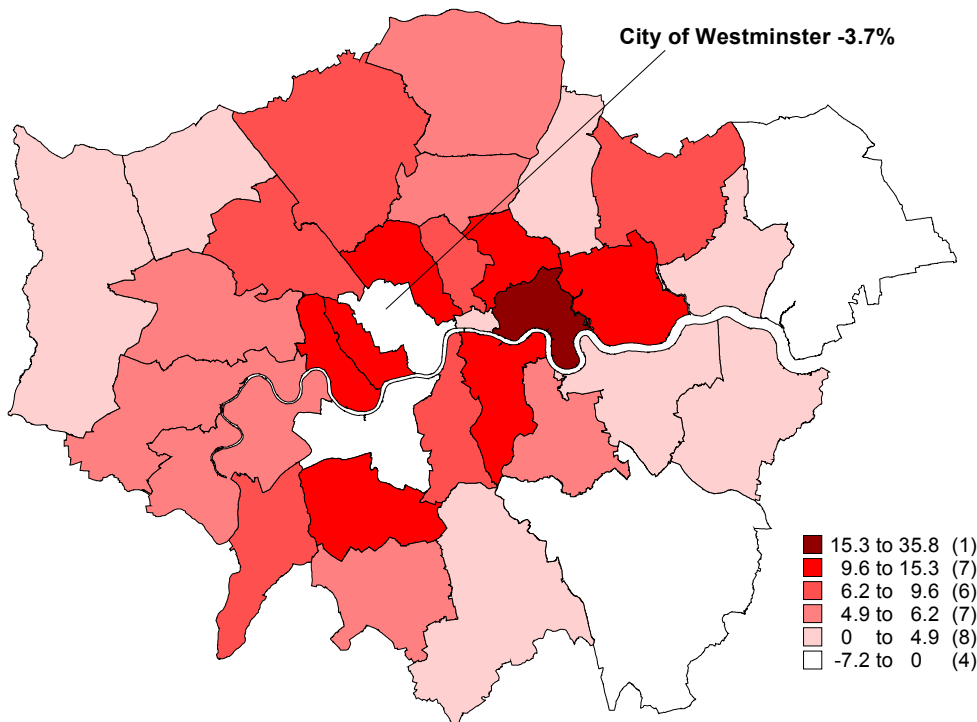

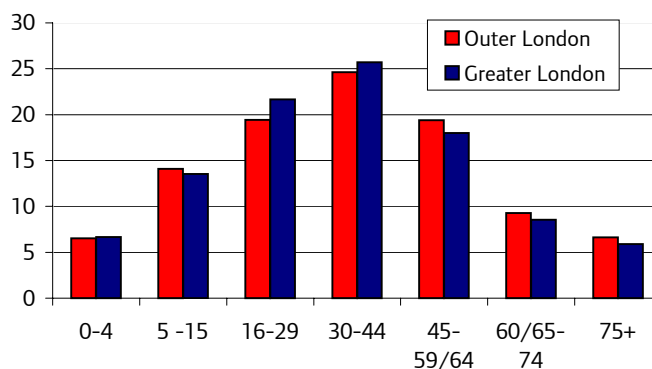

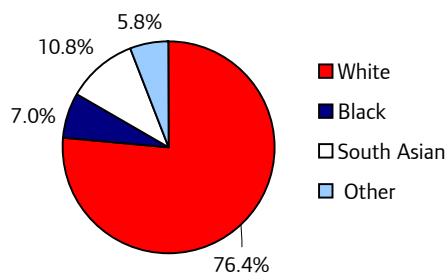

Percentage of population in different age groups



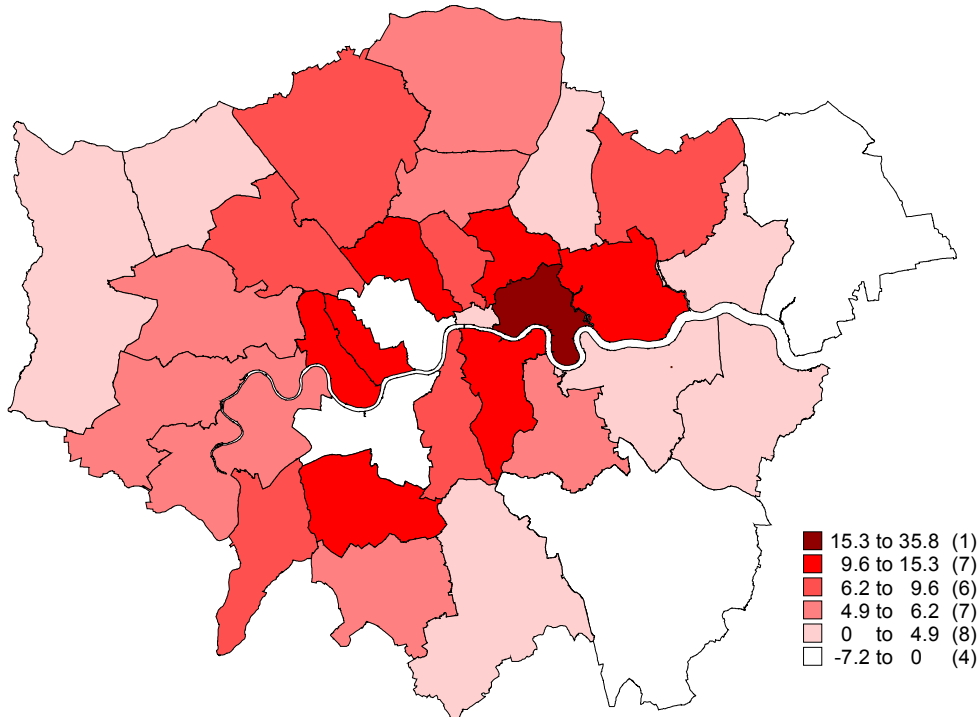
Percentage of population in broad ethnic groups

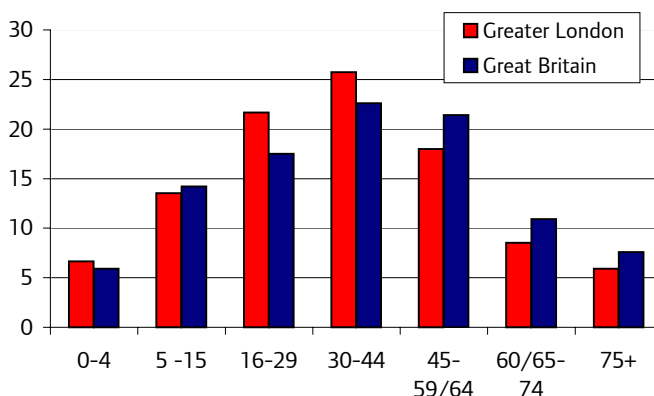

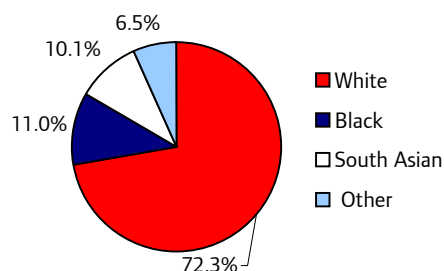

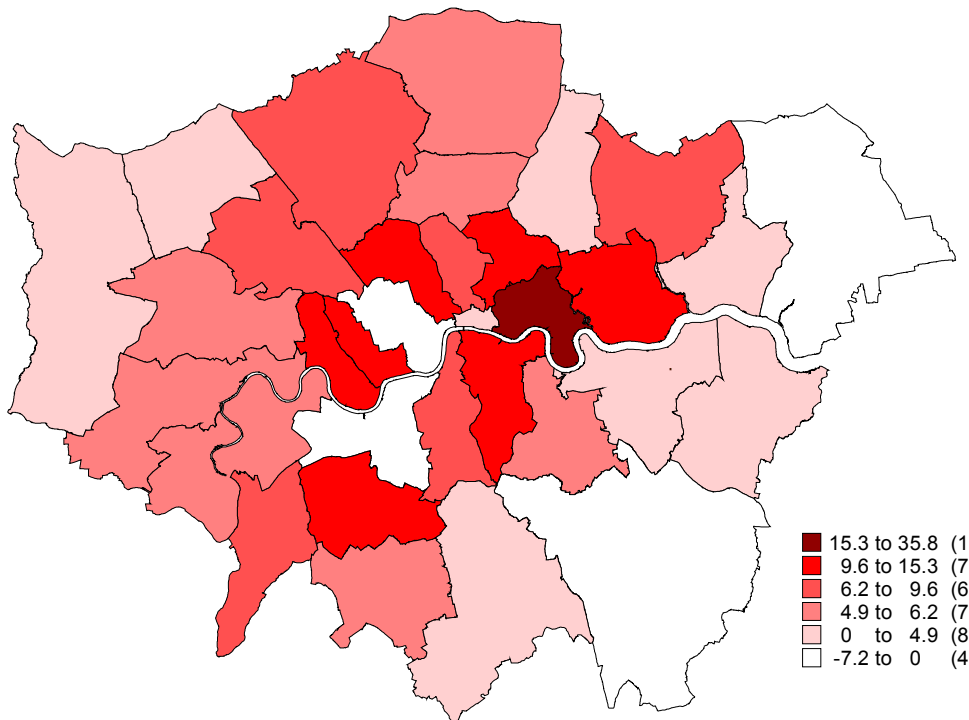

APPENDIX A

MID-2001 POPULATION ESTIMATES, OFFICE FOR NATIONAL STATISTICS

Mid-2001 estimates of the resident population of England and Wales were published by ONS on 10 October 2002 and are the first to be based on the results of the 2001 Census.

Definition of resident population

The estimated population of an area includes all people who usually live there, whatever their nationality. Members of HM and US Armed forces in England and Wales are included on a residential basis wherever possible. HM forces stationed outside England and Wales are not included. Students are taken to be resident at their term-time address.

Rebasing the mid-year population estimates

The mid-2001 population estimates are the first in a new series that are based on the 2001 Census. They have been updated to take account of population change due to births, deaths and net migration in the period between census day (29 April 2001) and the mid-year (30 June 2001). Population change in this period has been estimated using the annual ONS cohort component method and the usual main data sources. It should be stressed that the estimation of change for this short period has only a small impact on the mid-year population estimate. The major determinant of the mid-2001 estimate is the 2001 Census 'One Number Census' estimate for Census day.

The 1981 MYE figures have been adjusted by Anglia Polytechnic University to account for all of the London borough boundary changes that took place in years up to 1996 – these are the current boundaries

APPENDIX B

GLA 2002 ROUND CENTRAL POPULATION PROJECTION

The Greater London Authority produces annual demographic projections at borough level.

Summary of methodology

Projections are available for population by single year of age and gender for each London borough. The 2002 Round is based upon the 2001 mid-year estimates.

Future levels of fertility are based on borough level age-specific fertility rates for 1995-97, adjusted to actual births recorded in each year up to 2000-01, together with the Government Actuary's 2001-based assumptions about the future changes in the Total Period Fertility Rate.

Future mortality rates are based on life tables calculated for each borough group using data for 1995-97. These are adjusted in each borough to match actual deaths in each year up to 2000-01. After 2001 the rates are improved using the Government Actuary's 2001-based forty-year improvement factors specific to age and gender.

The GLA 2002 Round Central population projection assumes that migration flows in 2001-02 are the average of 1996-2001. After 2002 the inflows from outside London are held constant as are all probabilities of London residents moving within and from London.

APPENDIX C

VITAL STATISTICS 2001

Vital Statistics 2001 for resident population are based on 2001 Boundaries and are calculated using ONS Mid-2001 Population estimates.

Definitions

Crude Birth/Death Rate

Crude birth/death rate indicates the number of births/deaths per thousand resident population

General Fertility Rate

General fertility rate is the number of live births per thousand resident women aged 15-44.

Total Period Fertility Rate

Total Period Fertility Rate indicates the average number of children that would be born to a woman if the current age-specific patterns of fertility persisted throughout her childbearing life.

Infant death.

Infant death is defined as death of children under one year of age.

Standardised Mortality Ratio

Standardised Mortality Ratio indicates how the mortality of a given area compares with the national level, after allowing for differences in age structure. SMR represents total observed deaths as a percentage of expected deaths (expected are calculated as the number that would occur if the population of the area experienced the age/sex mortality rates of England and Wales).

Natural Change

Natural change is live births less deaths.

APPENDIX D

RPF29 SUMMARY OF REGISTER OF ELECTORS, DECEMBER 2001, POPULATION ESTIMATE UNIT, OFFICE FOR NATIONAL STATISTICS

The register of electors shows the number of local government electors for each local authority and parliamentary electors for each parliamentary constituency.

The total number of local government electors includes those who meet the residence qualification, attainers (see below), Peers and European Union citizens.

The total number of parliamentary electors comprises residential qualifiers, which includes overseas electors and attainers. Overseas electors are not resident in the United Kingdom, but must previously have been resident here and included in the electoral register (unless they were too young to register). They are registered in the same parliamentary constituency as before they went abroad.

Attainer is the term used to describe a person who attains the age of 18 during the currency of the register (between two annual qualifying dates), and is entitled to vote at an election held on or after his or her eighteenth birthday.

The elector figures shown are derived from data supplied to ONS by Electoral Registration Officers at local authorities and show the number of people who on 1st December 2001 were registered to vote in local elections in the UK. The latest Electoral Register came into effect on 1 December 2001 and is based on a qualifying date of 10 October 2001.

APPENDIX E

GLA 2001 ROUND ETHNIC GROUP POPULATION PROJECTIONS

The Greater London Authority produces annual demographic projections at borough level. With the advent of the ethnic group question in the 1991 Census it became possible to develop a new model that calculates population projections for ethnic groups in London.

These projections are probably the last to use the 1991 Census as a base. When results from the 2001 Census are available they will be used by GLA to construct ethnic group projections using the extended list of categories available.

Summary of methodology

Projections are available for ten ethnic groups by single year of age and gender for each London borough. The model is based on populations from the 1991 Census, adjusted for underenumeration, and extends to 2011.

Overall levels of fertility rates are based on the numbers of 0 years olds (used as a surrogate measure for the actual number of births) compared with the number of women in the main fertile ages (15-49) in each ethnic group. The ages at which different ethnic groups have children are calculated from numbers of births by country of birth and age of mother.

Mortality rates are taken from life tables calculated for each borough: these are specific to age and gender, but not ethnicity.

Migration rates are based on 1991 Census tables showing migrants by ethnic group, age and gender. Estimated (1991-2000) and projected (2000-2011) migration levels are controlled to borough level data for the whole population. Over time ethnic specific migration patterns are given less weight, whilst gender and age differences gain more weight in the model.

The model also takes into account the number of asylum seekers and visitor switchers estimated to have settled in each borough.

Finally the figures are controlled to the GLA 2001 Round Central population projection at borough level. This projection includes the latest national, regional and borough level information on fertility, mortality and migration.

GLA 2001 Census Implied Figures

The release of 2001 Census five-year age group population figures gave an opportunity for using the results of the 2001 Round GLA Ethnic Group Population Projections to produce an implied ethnic group structure consistent with the 2001 Census age/gender structure.

Further release of ethnic data from the 2001 Census is due to be released in February 2003.

The 2001 Census population figures were distributed to ethnic groups by assuming that the projected ethnic distribution within each age/gender group in each London borough remained unchanged. The only variant was the size of the Census population in each age/gender group.

Definitions

Broad Ethnic Groups

1. White
2. Black includes Black Caribbean, Black African and Black Other.
3. South Asian includes Indian, Pakistani and Bangladeshi.
4. Other includes Chinese, Other Asian and Other.

APPENDIX F

MID-2000 TO MID-2001 INTERNAL MIGRATION, OFFICE FOR NATIONAL STATISTICS

Internal Migration figures at the local authority level are derived from the combination of National Health Service Central Register (NHSCR) continuous monitoring and changes in the patient registers that are available annually.

National Health Service Central Register

The NHSCR is a record of all NHS patients. It ensures that medical records are effectively used by the Health Authorities and that General Practitioners are paid correctly.

Information is passed to the NHSCR electronically from Health Authorities based upon patients who re-register with General Practitioners in their area. The data are specific to age and gender of the patient and the former and current health areas of registration.

Health Authority Patient Registers

Every Health Authority in England and Wales holds a register of the patients registered with General Practitioners within their area of responsibility. This contains the NHS number, gender, date of acceptance at the health authority and importantly the postcode of address of the patient. By obtaining a download from each patient register on an annual basis combining all 104 patient register extracts together, ONS can create a total register for the whole of England and Wales. Comparing records in one year with those of the previous linking on NHS numbers enables the identification of people who change their postcode and therefore may be defined as a person who, between one year and the next, changes their area of residence.

The two files are linked such that the number of migrants at local authority level based upon the patient registers is grossed up to allow for the number of all persons recording a change of address at Health Authority level throughout the year under continuous monitoring using the NHSCR data.

APPENDIX G

STATISTICS OF EDUCATION SCHOOLS IN ENGLAND 2002 EDITION, DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION AND SKILLS

The new edition of "Statistics of Education Schools in England" includes school data for the academic year 2001/2002, which was collected in January 2002.

Most of the school information is from the Annual Schools' Census (ASC), which is undertaken in January each year. In January 2002 the ASC introduced a major change in that maintained primary, secondary and special schools reported data at an individual pupil level for the first time. Whilst the collection of the Pupil Level Annual Schools' Census (PLASC) for these schools was very successful, it is possible that some discontinuity in the time series data has resulted from the change, though this is not thought to be significant. The availability of pupil level data means that there are now more ways in which the information can be analysed and manipulated.

Definitions

Nursery Schools

Nursery schools provide education primarily for children below compulsory school age (under 5).

Primary Schools

Primary schools consist mainly of infant schools for children aged 5 to 7, junior schools for those aged 7 to 11 and junior and infant schools for both age groups.

In addition, first schools cater for ages from 5 to 8,9 or 10. They are the first stage of a three-tier (first, middle and secondary) school system.

Many primary schools provide 'nursery' classes for under-fives. A 'nursery' class is one which includes amongst its staff a qualified nursery assistant.

Secondary Schools

Secondary education is provided mainly in three types of school, the secondary modern, the secondary grammar and the comprehensive school. There are also small and decreasing numbers of technical schools.

Schools which do not fall into any of the categories already mentioned are classified as other secondary schools.

Special Schools

Special schools, both day and boarding, provide education for children with special educational needs who cannot be educated satisfactorily in an ordinary school.

Maintained special schools are run by local education authorities which pay all the expenses of maintenance.

Non-maintained special schools are run by voluntary bodies: they may receive some grant from the Department for capital work and for equipment, but their current expenditure is met primarily from the fees charged to the local education authorities for pupils placed in the schools.

Pupil Referral Unit

Pupil Referral Unit is a centre for children of primary or secondary school age who have been temporarily withdrawn from mainstream provision.

Independent Schools

An independent school is legally defined as any institution providing full time education for five or more pupils of compulsory school age that is neither maintained by a local education authority nor a non-maintained special school. All independent schools are initially inspected by HMI from Ofsted. Just over half of all independent schools choose to belong to the professional associations constituting the Independent Schools Council (ISC).

City Technology Colleges

These take the form of a charitable company limited by guarantee. The sponsors constitute an educational trust and will own or lease the college and appoint their representatives to the Board of Governors. The members of a CTC will consist of nominees of the sponsoring company and the Secretary of State. When the CTC is opened it will be registered as independent school and is included in the independent schools tables.

APPENDIX H

COUNCIL TAX IMPLIED TOTAL DWELLINGS ON VALUATION LIST, MID-2001

Each local authority submits annual returns to ODPM relating to the number of properties on their valuation list as at October/November each year. The properties are categorised by the Tax Band (A to H) under several headings:

- Total Dwellings on Valuation List at 16 October
- Exempt Dwellings at 1 November
- Dwellings Demolitions and Outside of Area of Authority at 1 November
- Total Chargeable Dwellings
- Chargeable Dwellings with Disabled Relief
- Chargeable Dwellings with 25% discount
- Chargeable Dwellings with 50% discount
- Chargeable Dwellings with no discount
- 'Equivalent Dwellings'
- Band D Equivalent Dwellings

The data shown in the Profiles are the weighted average of the total dwellings as at 16 October in 2000 and 16 October in 2001 to get an estimate for mid-year.

APPENDIX F

LABOUR FORCE SURVEY

The Labour Force Survey (LFS) is carried out by the Office for National Statistics and is one of the largest regular household surveys in the UK. The LFS is carried out on a quarterly basis and collects a range of data about the economic circumstances of individuals. The LFS is residence-based and provides data about those who live in an area.

Quarterly and Annual LFS datasets

The quarterly LFS provides reasonably robust estimates at a national and regional level but is less reliable for analysis for sub-regional areas (for example, boroughs). To provide more reliable local area estimates, the annual LFS database was developed.

The quarterly LFS collects information from around 60,000 households in the UK each quarter. Each quarter's sample is made up of five "waves" of around 12,000 households. The annual database was originally derived from four successive quarters of the regular quarterly survey and is created by taking waves 1 and 5 from each of the consecutive quarters to give an annually representative sample of around 96,000. However, since 2000/01 this has been increased further by another 39,000 households as a result of the inclusion of the "English Local Labour Force Survey" (ELLFS) boost sample. As well as providing an increased sample size and therefore more reliable estimates, annualising the data helps smooth out seasonal variations evident in the quarterly data.

The UK 2001/2002 database includes records for around 282,000 persons aged 16 and over, of whom 34,000 (12%) are resident in Greater London. Most data are available for the 32 London boroughs but unavailable for the City of London because the resident population and subsequent sample size is too small. The 2001/2002 dataset covers the period March 2001–February 2002.

These profiles are wholly based on analysis of the 2001/02 annual local area database (incorporating the Local LFS for England).

Reliability of data

As the LFS is a sample survey, all estimates are subject to sampling variability. In general, the smaller the estimate the greater the margin of error as a proportion of the estimate. As a result, current ONS advice is generally not to publish estimates below suppression thresholds (2,000–10,000 depending on the dataset in question). However, users should be aware that, even for estimates above suppression thresholds, there can still be a high margin of error associated with estimates (for example, individual country estimates). In this analysis, the GLA has suppressed all data estimates below 10,000 due to poor reliability.

The degree of variability attached to an estimate is often expressed through “95% confidence intervals”. These allow us to take a view, based on statistical probability theory, about how close an estimate is likely to be to the true population value. For example, if the actual number of people who were economically active in Camden was 111,000 – and we were estimating this figure from the annual LFS dataset – then 95 times out of 100, the LFS estimate of the size of that group would fall from the annual LFS dataset – to 101,400 (either +/- 9,600 or +/- 9%). Sampling variability can be quite high on local LFS estimates and should be considered when drawing conclusions from data.

Definitions

Working Age

Working age is 16 to 64 for males and 16 to 59 years for females.

Economic activity.

Economically active people are those aged 16 and over who are either in employment or ILO unemployed. Economic activity rates (%) relate to the percentage of the population in a particular age group who are economically active. Economic activity rates are typically presented for (i) those aged 16+ and (ii) those of working age only (women aged 16-59 and men aged 16-64).

Employment

Those in employment include those people aged 16 and over who did some paid work in the reference week (whether as an employee or self-employed); those who had a job that they were temporarily away from (on holiday, for example); those on government-supported training and employment programmes; and those doing unpaid family work. Employment rate is the number of people in employment expressed as a percentage of the total population in that age group.

ILO Unemployment

The International Labour Organisation’s (ILO) measure of unemployment refers to people without a job who were available to start work in the two weeks following their LFS interview and who had either looked for work in the four weeks prior to interview or were waiting to start a job they had already obtained. This measure is different to the claimant count measure of unemployment which is based solely on eligibility for benefits (for example, Job Seekers’ Allowance). The ILO measure is generally accepted to be a more comprehensive measure and is usually higher than the claimant count for any given period.

ILO Unemployment Rate

ILO Unemployment rate is the percentage of economically active people who are unemployed on the ILO measure. It usually refers to those aged 16 and over or those of working age.

Economically Inactive

Economically inactive are people who are neither in employment nor unemployed on the ILO measure. This group includes, for example, all those who were looking after a home or retired as well as those aged under 16.

A rate of economic inactivity is a percentage of total economically inactive population expressed as a percentage of all people in relevant age group.

Employees/Self-employed

The division between employees and self-employed is based on survey respondents' own assessment of their employment status.

Full-time/Part-time workers

The classification of employees, self-employed, those on government work-related training programmes and unpaid family workers in their main job as full-time or part-time is on the basis of self-assessment. People on Government-supported training and employment programmes who are at college in the survey reference week are classified, by convention, as part-time.
