1. Methodology

- This study was conducted in London via LondonBus, an Internet omnibus survey
- **SAMPLE SIZE** – a sample of 1002 London adults aged 18+ were interviewed.
- **INTERVIEWING** - Interviewing was conducted by online self-completion from 14/07/2016 - 19/07/2016 (Week 28)
- **WEIGHTING** – The sample has been weighted to represent the adult population of London
- **LOW BASES** - Where unweighted base figures are less than 100, data should be treated cautiously, as large margins of error are possible
