Since 2003, Transport for London has required most vehicles to pay an £11.50 fee to drive in the central London Congestion Charge Zone between 7AM and 6PM. Certain vehicles (e.g. taxis and private hire vehicles) are exempt from the charge, and residents are eligible for discounts. However, evidence suggests that congestion remains a problem both inside and outside the Congestion Charge Zone, including in evenings and at weekends.
