In response to the publication of the Home Office 'Crime in England and Wales, Quarterly Update to December 2010' published on the 20th April 2011, please find below headline changes for how London fares in key national crime indicators for the period Jan10-Dec10 compared with the previous 12 months. Figures from the previous report covering the period Oct09-Sep10 are shown in [brackets].

All data is taken from the Home Office publication with Borough levels taken from the LASS Metropolitan Police data export.
